Mr. Redden:

Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington (“CREW”) makes this request for records from the Alabama House pursuant to §§ 36.12.40-41, 41.13.1-44, and 36.25A.1-11 of the Alabama Code (“Public Records Law” and “Open Meetings Law”, respectively).

Specifically, CREW requests the following records relating to House Bill 285 (“HB 285”) created on or before May 17, 2021:

1. All records discussing the potential effect of any provision of HB 285 on Black voters, Latino voters, other racial or ethnic minority voters, elderly voters, or voters with disabilities, including without limitation the following provisions of HB 285:
  - i. Curbside Voting Ban (HB 285 Section 1)
2. All records reflecting any analysis, consideration, or determination regarding how HB 285 would serve to prevent purported voter fraud or irregularities, including any evidence or data supporting such analyses.
3. All records relating to the legislative procedures by which HB 285 was passed, including, without limitation, records relating to:
  - i. Requirements or limitations regarding testimony from members of the public on the bill
  - ii. Requirements or limitations regarding legislative debate on the bill
  - iii. Efforts to expedite the legislative process for the bill
4. All records relating to the decision to make the bill effective “immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.” (HB 285 Section 2)
5. All records reflecting any communications, meeting, phone calls, or conversations regarding HB 285 or any predecessor version of that bill with representatives of any non-governmental or private organization, including without limitation the following organizations and individuals:

We seek records of any kind, including paper records, electronic records, audiotapes, videotapes, photographs, data, and graphical material. Our request includes without limitation all correspondence, letters, emails, text messages, facsimiles, telephone messages, voice mail messages, and transcripts, notes, or minutes of any meetings, telephone conversations, or discussions. Our request also includes any attachments to emails and other records, as well as emails to which the subjects of this request were cc'ed or bcc'ed.

If it is your position that any portion of the requested records is exempt from disclosure, please state the basis of the exemption you contend is applicable. Ala. Code § 36.12.40-41. If some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please redact those portions and produce the remainder of the requested records.

CREW is a non-profit corporation, organized under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. CREW is committed to protecting the public's right to be aware of the activities of government officials, to ensuring the integrity of those officials, and to highlighting and reducing the influence of money on politics. CREW intends to analyze the information responsive to this request and to share its analysis with the public. The release of information obtained through this request is not in CREW's financial interest.

If there are any fees for searching or copying these records, CREW agrees to pay up to \$100. However, CREW also requests a waiver of all fees associated with the instant request because the disclosure of the requested information is in the public interest. The public is entitled to information concerning the decision-making processes of the Alabama House

that factored into the passage of HB 285, which will likely have a widespread effect on a significant portion of the state's voting populace. Further, this information is not being sought for commercial purposes.
