Tenth Interim Response for FOIA request CBP-2020-067908

Dear Nik Sus:

This is a tenth interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) submitted June 23, 2020.

For this production, CBP processed seventy-seven hundred and seventeen (7717) pages of documents in response to your request and the similar request from the plaintiffs in *Black Alliance for Just Immigration v*. *CBP*, Civ No. 20-5198-CBA-RLM (E.D.N.Y) (the *BAJI* case), that were determined to be responsive to the request in the *BAJI* case. CBP has determined forty-nine hundred and twenty-eight (4928) pages may be released in full or in part with redactions pursuant to Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(5), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(F). CBP has determined that twenty-seven hundred and eighty-nine (2789) pages are being withheld in full pursuant to Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(5), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(F).

In addition, CBP has processed an estimated nineteen thousand one hundred and ninety-three (19193) pages of duplicates and non-responsive pages to your request and the similar request in the *BAJI* case. This includes an estimated seven thousand one hundred and twenty-seven (7127) non-responsive pages and an estimated twelve thousand sixty-six (12066) duplicate pages.

Please be advised some of the released pages in this interim response will contain a redaction mark "OGA Information" or "OGA Information, Sent for Consult". Pages with those marks are in the process of being sent for consultation. Once a determination has been made by any Other Governmental Agency (OGA), an updated interim response will be sent.
