




It is advised that more barriers be place and the gate be secured in a better fashion.

BLUF: After speaking with the DD I am working across the operational divisions to deploy a fully functional IMT to coordinate all USMS resources to assist the District of Oregon in Portland.

- I spoke with AD Smith (copied on this email) who will be coordinating the deployment of an IMT. The IMT will be responsible for all logistics (tracking of USMS personnel), reporting, and coordination of resources as requested through USM Burger or his Incident Commander.
- I also spoke with AD Kelly (copied on this email) to identify what support (b) (7)(E) is providing and to ensure going forward they coordinate with the IMT.
- I have a call into JSD to ensure any response they are providing is also coordinated through the IMT.

Next steps:

- AD Smith will coordinate the IMT to Portland
- Marshal Burger, if possible, it would facilitate the overall USMS response for you to designate someone as the Incident Commander on scene to coordinate with the IMT and make decisions on responding to threats at the Courthouse.

D/OR Portland Courthouse Activity Summary 07/18/20

The crowd this evening definitely had even more energy, was even better organized and was a lot more aggressive. Crowd size was estimated to be well over a thousand (1000), throughout the night and into the morning the Hatfield CH received multiple commercial grade fireworks and road flares. At approximately 9:30PM protesters started to dismantle the new fence surrounding the Hatfield CH, the new fence installed proved to be ineffective. It is recommended to have concrete barriers installed on the inside perimeter of the fence. Again protesters barricaded all access as well as ports to the front of the Hatfield CH. Protesters also barricaded all of the external doors throughout the Hatfield CH. There were two (2) attempts to breach the Hatfield CH in which (b) (7)(E) and USMS personnel deployed utilizing a side entrance to gain access to the front of the building. (b) (7)(E) deputy was injured during the second exit. An unknown protester had driven a nail through a piece of the exterior door plywood. In addition protesters had placed hundreds of marbles outside of these exits. When the deputy tried to push the door open the deputies hand was pierced by the nail. As the deputy pushed out of the exit the deputy stepped on marbles, lost his balance and fell to the ground injuring his hand/wrist. (b) (7)(E) medics treated and flushed the open wound and bandaged the hand. When it was safe to do so this deputy was evacuated to the ER. At approximately 01:30 an unknown individual placed a metal object in the fence fashioning some sort of trip wire to the pin. PPB & FBI bomb squad was notified and is in route at the time of this writing.

20:35 hrs - Assistant United States Attorney Kelly Zusman arrived at Hatfield CH.

21:00 hrs – Crowd size is approximately 350 around the Hatfield CH and Justice center. Another approximately 300 protesters are mobile and

making their way to the Hatfield CH.

21:22 hrs – 15 individuals standing in front of the entry/egress points of the Edith Green building.

21:30 hrs - Crowd size is well over a thousand (1000), members of the crowd removed a section of the front fence located at the front of the Hatfield CH.

21:45 hrs – Members of the crowd are easily removing more sections of the fence.

22:00 hrs - Members of the crowd are currently moving the fencing away from the area, Hatfield CH is experiencing multiple breaches from the fenced area.

22:00 hrs - Anti-protesters caring an American flag are keeping protesters from entering federal property. A fight ensued and Anti-Protesters are driven from the area

22:15 hrs – Members of the crowd removed multiple sections of the fence are using to barricade the Hatfield building. Protesters are zip tying the fence together in an attempt to block “ALL” egress of the building.

22:25 hrs - Crowd size approximately 1000, removed fencing from most of the front of the building and lashing together to barricade the entire front of the Hatfield CH.

22:38 hrs – Members of the crowd trying to breach the front door of the Hatfield CH.

22:41 hrs - USMS (b) (7)(E) deploys from the Hatfield CH. USMS (b) (7)(E) deploys (b) (7)(E) and moves to contact VOs in order to prevent the breaching attempt. VO in a blue tank top picked up the (b) (7)(E) and threw it back at USMS personnel. (b) (7)(E) is tripped by objects placed in front of the doorway by VOs. (b) (7)(E) impaled his right hand on board filled with nails that had been placed at the corner of the Hatfield CH. The (b) (7)(E) pulled away from the board and lost his footing and fell. The fall resulted in an injury to a knuckle on the (b) (7)(E) right hand.

22:43 hrs - USMS (b) (7)(E) reported that lasers were being pointed at them from the corner of 3rd and Main. (b) (7)(E) was hit in the eyes with a laser.

22:45 hrs – Violent Opportunists (Vos) attempted to flank USMS (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E)

22:46 hrs – USMS (b) (7)(E) broke contact with VOs and moved back to the Hatfield CH.

22:50 hrs – Unlawful assembly was declared by PPD.

22:52 hrs – USMS (b) (7)(E) pushed to arrest VOs that were collapsing around them.

22:55 hrs – USMS (b) (7)(E) moving back indoors; (b) (7)(E) deployed. As (b) (7)(E) is moving into the Hatfield CH, Lasers can be seen being directed at (b) (7)(E) from the VOs. Unidentified white male in a blue tie-dye shirt approached the front door of the Hatfield CH and began kicking it.

23:00 hrs - VOs began to re-barricade the entry/egress points of the

Hatfield CH.

23:08 hrs – VOs threw orange and white smoke grenades at the front of the Hatfield CH.

23:09 hrs – VOs set fire to the Police Association building.

23:14 hrs – VOs deployed commercial grade fireworks and deployed more smoke grenades at the front of the Hatfield CH.

23:17 hrs – VOs placed a barricade at 2nd St and Main.

23:22 hrs – VOs attempting to breach the front door with a tire iron.

23:27 hrs – VOs began to barricade the southside entrance of the Hatfield CH.

23:31 hrs – VOs can be seen pointing lasers at the front doors of the Hatfield CH.

23:33 hrs – VOs began carrying fencing to the rear of the Hatfield CH.

23:40 hrs – VOs began barricading the loading dock doors. VO known as “Princess” assaulted an unidentified black male wearing shorts colored like and American Flag.

23:53 hrs – VOs continue to barricade the doors of the Hatfield CH.

00:10 hrs – (b) (7)(E)

01:37 hrs – VOs placed an unknown device within the barricades on the front doors of the Hatfield CH.

01:40 hrs – USMS Hatfield notified Edith Green USMS personnel of the potential “IED” whom in turn contacted PPB. All LE was notified of the potential threat to the Hatfield CH as well as surrounding building. Due to the volatility of the crowd PPB Bomb squad was unable to respond.

01:50hrs - Once crowd was dispersed north of Hatfield, USMS, (b) (7)(E) and DUSMs exit courthouse to clear debris from front of door

02:00 hrs – PPB units continued to push the crowd out of the downtown area

03:00 hrs – Approximately 20 protesters return to the park across from the Hatfield CH. Crowd is quiet

03:22 hrs – USMS (b) (7)(E) deployed to clear barricades so a team member be transported to the hospital for possible broken hand.

03:36 hrs – USMS (b) (7)(E) moved back inside the building.

03:37 hrs – Personnel inside the Hatfield CH discovered detonated device had been blown in the barricades at the front of the door of the Hatfield CH. It should be noted that numerous personnel inside the building acknowledge feeling the floor trembling earlier in the night immediately following a loud explosion. Note: This is a brief overall summary with only the info provided to me at the time of this release.

Arrests: 7

At 8:00 p.m., approx. 200-300 protesters were gathered throughout Chapman park across from the Justice Center (JC) and Hatfield federal courthouse. Perimeter caution tape was placed across the front of the courthouse to deter anyone from trespassing and prevent the destruction of property. The front port and entry point was opened for situational awareness and the security teams remained inside the lobby area. A public address system was also set up inside at the front of the courthouse for the ability to make announcements and commands to the public.

At 9:15 p.m. an agitator continued to defy orders to leave federal property and PC was established for trespass. A coordinated arrest plan (USMS (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) FPS) was put into place to apprehend subject #1. The tactical teams deployed and pursued the suspect who fled into the park. During the foot pursuit several individual protesters began to throw projectiles at federal officers which resulted in a full team push for security while the pursuing officers continued after the suspect who was apprehended at SW 4th and SW Taylor St. Before being handcuffed the suspect consumed unknown drugs and began to overdose, EMS medics were dispatched and suspect taken by ambulance to the hospital. An FPS Special Agent responded to the hospital due to the pending charges. Another Subject #2 was arrested near SW 3rd and SW Salmon by FPS. While USMS (b) (7)(E) were attempting to return back to the courthouse (b) (7)(E) was deployed for the safety of the officers.

At 12:20 a.m. Protest overall size is still 300 and the group is pushing up towards the front of the courthouse. Tactical Teams have made multiple announcements to leave federal property and return to the park without success. USMS (b) (7)(E) has deployed (b) (7)(E) to push an aggressive group advancing towards the entrance. The group has dispersed and moved away from the courthouse. The tactical teams are holding outside at the front of the courthouse and not moving into the park.

At 12:46 a.m. Violent opportunists began throwing fireworks at USMS (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E)

At 1:10 a.m. USMS (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) has staged back inside at the front of the courthouse. Crowd size is now approx. 100-150.

- Protestors remained peaceful for most of the evening. At one point, (b) (7)(E) exited the Edith Green Federal Building to arrest a protester that was shining a laser at law enforcement officers. During the arrest attempt, approximately 100 protesters ran from Chapman Park towards the remaining officers near the front of the federal building. Protesters attempted to gain entry and were very agitated forcing (b) (7)(E) to deploy a distraction device to keep the group from entering the federal building.
- Nightly exterior operations include limited firefighting with handheld extinguishers, defending against breaches of federal buildings, and responding to assist downed officers. In addition, the teams have been working in collaboration with their federal partners and the USAO to arrest protesters engaging in criminal activity around the Hatfield Courthouse.
- No arrests were made during the operational period.



- During daylight hours contractors began performing repair work to the temporary security enhancements at the Hatfield Courthouse. While conducting the repair work, protestors began to gather in the vicinity forcing (b) (7)(E) and (b) (7)(E) to push the protestors out of the immediate area to ensure the safety of the contractors securing the Courthouse. Two protestors were arrested for pointing lasers at (b) (7)(E) and (b) (7)(E) while they maintained perimeter security.
- (b) (7)(E) deployed (b) (7)(E) on a woman holding a knife to her neck while crawling through a fire started by protestors. PPB took the woman into custody and transported her to the hospital for treatment.
- A protestor pointed a green laser at law enforcement personnel forcing a (b) (7)(E) to be deployed and the protestor to be arrested. After this deployment, the crowd dissipated and became less interested in attacking the building.
- (b) (7)(E) protestors dispersed early due to the large federal police presence.
- PPB cut their force in half and took a minor role in last night's protests.
- USMS, (b) (7)(E) FPS and HSI arrested seven protestors last night.

- [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS arrested three protestors who were destroying a camera on the side of the Hatfield Courthouse. Protestors launched fireworks at the Justice Center, started fires in the park and banged on the boards at the Courthouse trying to illicit a response. Protestors (200+) began directing green lasers at the openings, throwing rocks, bottles, chunks of concrete, batteries, launching large fireworks and various other objects at the upper windows of the Courthouse. Protestors broke two windows, forcing [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS to deploy [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] to disperse the crowd across the street. The protestors regrouped and repeated the same conduct, forcing [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS to deploy various [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] to repel the crowd. (Hatfield) (Hatfield 2)
- FPS coordinated with PPD to push the protestors across the park. [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] deployed [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and deployed outside the courthouse, linking up with PPB to push the protestors across the park and to the west. Once the push was finished, [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS returned inside the Courthouse. Protestors returned in smaller groups probing the Courthouse to illicit a response by throwing rocks at the windows, and a large firework was thrown through one of the broken windows, exploding in the lobby near [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)].
- 300+ protestors regrouped in the park and once again attacked the Courthouse with rocks, pieces of concrete and fireworks, and pointed green lasers at the windows and doors, forcing [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS to deploy [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] to disperse the crowd. FPS and PPB conducted another push to the west through the park and [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS deployed from the Courthouse and pushed them across the park. [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] arrested one individual suspected of throwing firework mortars at approaching police officers clearing the park. [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS moved back to Courthouse and held perimeter security at the sidewalk to keep the remaining protestors across the street.
- [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] identified an individual directing a green laser at the eyes of officers and ducking back behind a building. [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] coordinated with FPS and conducted a targeted arrest of that specific individual as well as a female who attempted to interfere with the arrest.

PORTLAND, OR (D/OR)

- [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS maintained perimeter security in front of the Courthouse, coordinating with the command center to identify individuals in the crowd known to have caused damage to the Courthouse. [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS returned to the Courthouse and maintained a reactionary posture for any protestor identified to have caused destruction to the Courthouse.
- [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] staged with FPS. Any protestor who came onto federal property throwing any projectiles was given a verbal warning by FPS. If they did not depart, [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS rapidly deployed and conducted arrests. A female protestor came to the front of the Courthouse and began defecating on the Courthouse. [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and FPS deployed to arrest the individual. During the arrest a protestor directed a Green Laser at officer's eyes. [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and [§ 87(2)(b)] [§ 87(2)(e)] and conducted a directed arrest of the individual. The protestor arrested with the green laser had the following items on his person: machete, a K-Bar knife, the green laser and a pipe bomb.
- A total of eight protestors were detained.

PORTLAND, OR (D/OR)

- Members of the Border Patrol Tactical Unit (b) (7)(E) integrated with (b) (7)(E) and together will be the primary security element for the Courthouse.
- While deploying their Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS), (b) (7)(E) lost connectivity which resulted in the UAS crashing to the ground. Protestors destroyed what remained of the UAS, however, (b) (7)(E) was able to recover the camera.
- Protestors started fires across the street from the Courthouse and launched fireworks. As protestors gathered in the front of the Courthouse, an individual dressed in multi-cam and body armor was seen walking around the block to protect the people being "ganged up on". Protestors believed the individual was part of the USMS which drew the attention of more protestors. The protestors surveyed the Hatfield Courthouse security measures, broke a window, attempted to remove the plywood, placed bike racks and debris in front of the doors, and poured vegetable oil on the cement in front of the exit doors (Hatfield Courthouse).
- Approximately 150+ protestors broke windows and both front doors of the Hatfield Courthouse using bats, pipes, and crowbars. Protestors then fired fireworks at the open breach point causing (b) (7)(E) and (b) (7)(E) to deploy (b) (7)(E) to disperse the crowd. Protestors returned and threw glass bottles, rocks and fireworks at the breach point causing (b) (7)(E) and (b) (7)(E) to once again deploy (b) (7)(E).
- PPD deployed from the Justice Center to assist with clearing the protestors. (b) (7)(E) and (b) (7)(E) joined PPD to hold the line while waiting for the PPD Rapid Response Team to arrive and help disperse the protestors.

PORTLAND, OR (D/OR)

- (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) and PPD held perimeter security while contractors boarded up the doors of the Hatfield Courthouse and city trucks cleared the blockade. Protestors remained present taunting the officers. When the protestors dissipated, (b) (7)(E) and (b) (7)(E) returned to the courthouse. The contractors fortified the exit doors by covering them completely and adding openings in the plywood at the top and bottom to allow for deployment of (b) (7)(E) if needed. The contractor will also reinforce the four-sided exit door to allow for rapid deployment of law enforcement personnel (b) (7)(E).
- PPD maintained perimeter security until the contractor finished fortifying the federal building, (b) (7)(E) and (b) (7)(E) remained inside the Courthouse ready to respond as needed.
- FPS departed from the Courthouse at midnight which left no FPS presence.
- IMT is working with (b) (7)(E) on flight options to supplement the current (b) (7)(E).

- Gettysburg, PA (M/PA) - On July 4th a flag burning event is planned at Gettysburg National Park which may attract counter protest activity. FBI and PSP will have a command post staffed with members from the National Park Service, USMS, and Gettysburg Police. M/PA has assigned (b) (7)(E) to this detail to support investigations, arrest, and court production of individuals committing violent federal violations.
- National Capital Region - There are numerous planned demonstrations for July 4th at or near federal properties and monuments. These protests are scheduled to draw large crowds and could impact the level of violent/criminal activity over the next 48hrs.
- St. Louis, MO (E/MO) - No significant activity to report for (b) (7)(E) from protests that occurred on July 3rd. Intelligence for July 4th that BLM and Crips Gang Members have purchased over 300 pounds of fireworks to simulate gun fire. This same group assaulted a group of Christians last weekend who prayed at the statue of St Louis in Forest Park.


PORTLAND, OR (D/OR)

- Protestors threw rocks, bottles, paint filled balloons and spray paint cans at Hatfield Courthouse windows and directed green lasers at the eyes of law enforcement. As protestors advanced to the glass doors FPS deployed (b) (7)(E). When protestors breached the glass doors with a 2x4, (b) (7)(E) deployed (b) (7)(E) to remove the protestors from the breach point as FPS continued to deploy (b) (7)(E). Protestors regrouped and threw bottles, rocks, large fireworks and smoke bombs. A large firework mortar made its way into the lobby, through the breached door, exploding amongst personnel (Firework)(Firework2).
- Protestors returned and threw the same items along with chunks of wood and 2x4's at the breach point and remaining glass windows and doors. As FPS deployed (b) (7)(E) trying to displace them, protestors launched large fireworks at the breach point igniting a spray paint can outside the main door. (b) (7)(E) deployed and extinguished the fire. The person who breached the glass door returned and threw bottles at the breach point. As (b) (7)(E) arrested him another individual was observed with firework smoke bombs and taken into custody (Hatfield). When protestors shined green lasers in law enforcement officers' eyes, (b) (7)(E) deployed (b) (7)(E) to reduce the use of the green lasers. (b) (7)(E) Border Patrol Tactical Team members arrived to assist (b) (7)(E) As protestors advanced upon the breach point with 2x4's and plywood (b) (7)(E) deployed (b) (7)(E) to disperse the crowd (Hatfield 2).
- Protestors regrouped across from the Federal Courthouse. Protestor support vehicles arrived and distributed bottles and other objects to throw. A group of protestors hid behind one of the support vehicles and threw bottles the Courthouse. Simultaneously, other protestors gathered plywood and 2x4's forcing (b) (7)(E) to deploy (b) (7)(E) to disperse the protestors. USMS coordinated with PPD, FPS, (b) (7)(E) to conduct a large push of the remaining protestors, allowing a contractor to board up the broken door. (b) (7)(E) deployed in support of PPD to push the protestors across the park and held until the breach point was secured.

St. Louis, MO (E/MO)

- St. Louis PD requested DOJ assistance for a planned protest on July 3rd in the Central West End. (b) (7)(E) teams are going to assist local law enforcement. This area received national media attention when a husband and wife defended their home with guns from protestors. The federal courthouse is 4 miles away.
- The ExpectUs "We aint Done Yet" event is scheduled for July 3rd at 18:00 and is .3 miles away from the husband and wife's home.
- Intelligence for July 4th that BLM and Crips Gang Members have purchased over 300 pounds of fireworks to simulate gun fire. This same group assaulted a group of Christians last weekend who prayed at the statue of St. Louis in Forest Park.
- DOD C-17 is transporting (b) (7)(E) with equipment to St. Louis.

- Gettysburg, PA (M/PA) - On July 4th a flag burning event is planned at Gettysburg National Park which may attract counter protest activity. FBI and PSP will have a command post staffed with members from the National Park Service, USMS, and Gettysburg Police. M/PA has assigned (b) (7)(E) to this detail to support investigations, arrest, and court production of individuals committing violent federal violations.
- Des Moines, IA (S/IA) - On July 4th there is a planned protest at the Iowa State Capitol Building. The gathering could be exacerbated by an incident that took place on July 1st, in which a planned peaceful protest resulted in 17 arrests due to alleged damage to police vehicles and conduct toward law enforcement officers. The federal courthouse is located approximately 0.6 miles away. Coordination with local law enforcement is ongoing.
- Keystone, SD (D/SD) - On July 4th, POTUS will be at the Mount Rushmore National Memorial for the firework celebration. Several groups plan to be in attendance to protest.

Subject: Activity Summary 07/02/20

Due to last night's events, the format of this report will differ slightly from previous reports.

21:30 – Approximately 150 in front of the Justice Center (JC)

22:12 – Group is at the JC steps listening to speakers

22:40 – Group begins barricading 2nd and Main.

Around 23:00, Protesters broke into an office on the North side of the JC. They also began to remove plywood from the North side of the JC as well. PPB responded with 5 officers to see the extent of the breach. Approximately 150 protesters respond to the North side of the JC to confront the PPB officers. I activated our team to prepare for possible officer down/officer rescue.

During this, protesters grabbed 2x4's and came over to the front of Hatfield, in an attempt, to barricade the front door by sliding the 2x4 through the handles of the door. FPS responded using (b) (7)(E) to push the individuals back.

This brought the rest of the group to the front of Hatfield. Multiple projects were being thrown at the windows to include rocks, bottles, spray paint cans, a can of pan, and commercial grade fireworks. FPS and USMS continued to push protesters away from the doors and gave commands to leave the property. Protesters once again attacked the front doors in an attempt to barricade them. At this time, additional protesters attempted to pull the doors open. The piece of wood jammed through the handles, and pulling by the protesters, shattered the glass door. USMS and FPS immediately used shields and personnel to block an attempts at entry. (b) (7)(E) was deployed to push the protesters away from the building.

Multiple projectiles were being taken. Protesters threw multiple fireworks, including fireworks being thrown inside the lobby. USMS was coordinating with PPB mobile field units in dispersing the crowd. Protesters continued to challenge the front of the building. FPS identified an individual responsible for breaking the front door, who was continually at the front of the line challenging the front of the building. USMS and FPS deployed to the front and took the individual into custody, along with a female suspected of throwing fireworks at federal personnel. It was later determined the female was trying to destroy the fireworks and was subsequently released. The male individual suspected of breaking the front door was taken to the cellblock for holding until FPS Special Agents arrived to interview and conduct their investigation.

USMS, FPS, and PPB continued to battle with protesters throughout the night. PPB was able to push protesters 4-5 blocks west at one point, but protesters returned. The continually ignored orders to vacate federal property and continued to test and push their way to the front of the building. USMS and FPS continued to push them back. USMS, FPS, and PPB formulated another plan to push protesters west, beyond the park, to allow for maintenance to secure the front entrance at Hatfield and the door on the North side of the JC. All forces were successful in holding the line back and maintenance was able to secure the broken door. A plan was created to replace the boards across the front of the Hatfield entrance, securing them to the frame and ground.

By 04:30, all protesters had been cleared from the area and USMS and FPS forces began to shut down the night operations.

FPS will have additional resources available through the weekend. A (b) (7)(E), along with FPS, will be stationed at Hatfield this weekend to assist in protest operations.



SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Portland, OR - Significant protest activity continues at and around the Mark O. Hatfield United States Courthouse. Last night protesters began breaking the plywood covering the windows at the Courthouse. Portland Police didn't have the resources to assist in dispersing the crowd so (b) (7)(E) deployed to the front of the Courthouse with (b) (7)(E) providing tactical response and officer rescue capability. Protestors threw bottles, balloons filled with paint and fireworks at officers, as well as pointing green lasers at officers, forcing FPS officers to deploy (b) (7)(E) at the protestors. As protestors disengaged, FPS and (b) (7)(E) moved back into the Courthouse. Upon returning to the Courthouse, protestors threw a firework (M-80) into the street behind officers. Protestors again gathered in front of the Courthouse, building a protective line and utilizing wood and debris as cover. Protestors then threw a metal pole and 2x4's at the front windows, again forcing FPS officers to deploy pepper balls to repel the protestors.
- FPS is working on a request to DHS for additional support at the Hatfield Courthouse.
- On July 1st, (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) had an initial appearance at the Federal Courthouse in Madison, Wisconsin. (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) is charged with extortion for threatening to shut down and have rioters burn down a business unless he received food, beverages, and money. The USAO, Western District of Wisconsin, has received calls warning of direct action if (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) isn't released and charges dismissed.

The State House is located within 0.5 miles of a GSA building and 0.9 miles from the Strom Thurmond Federal Building/U.S. Courthouse. In the District of Oregon (D/OR), protestors removed plywood from the front windows of the Justice Center and used them as battering rams attempting to force entry into the Justice Center. Protestors then piled the debris against the Hatfield Courthouse entrance causing Portland Police to respond with a line of officers and vehicles to clear the area. The defendant requested an in-person sentencing to possibly incite a response from the local community. His attorney wrote an inflammatory sentencing memo alleging systemic racism and prosecutorial misconduct and his brother is an activist for social justice. USMS personnel (b) (7)(E) are reporting daily to the FBI Strategic Information and Operations Center (SIOC) until July 8, 2020. Portland is planning contingency missions in support of <i>Operation Icon</i>, as well as tactical response to the Hatfield Courthouse and officer rescues. (b) (7)(E) has integrated with District of Oregon (D/OR) management to advise the district on specific mission requests. The D/OR continues to experience disruptions at the Hatfield Courthouse. Protestors threw rocks at the courthouse front windows, spray-painted graffiti on the building and two security cameras. Protestors pulled the U.S. flag down at the Justice Center, lit it on fire, and replaced it with a Black Lives Matter sign. Protestors also attempted to breach the Portland Police Bureau (PPB) front door and ignited two trash cans on fire. PPB attempted to conduct a mass arrest and brought in trucks to remove the barriers placed by protestors. During the arrest attempt, protestors continued to throw glass bottles and rocks at the officers.
