The American people and their Representatives who survived this coup attempt deserve immediate and thorough answers to the following questions to help the public gain a complete picture of the events that occurred on January 6, 2021 and an understanding of the current capabilities of the President to continue to lead this country:

- 1. Who gave the order to deploy the Washington, D.C. National Guard to the Capitol Complex once the request had been made by the bipartisan leadership of both the House of Representatives and the Senate?
- 2. If, as reports indicate, it is true that the Vice President gave the order, what were the circumstances that required him to do so and what was the exact time the order was given?
- 3. Was the President unable or unwilling to deploy the Washington, D.C. National Guard to the Capitol? If so, please describe for the American people the circumstances and/or reasoning that lead to his inability and/or unwillingness to do so.
- 4. Is the President mentally and physically capable of discharging the powers and duties of his office as prescribed by the Constitution?
- 5. If the President is unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office, why haven't the Vice President the principal officers of the executive departments fulfilled their Constitutional duty to exercise their power under Section 4 of the 25th Amendment to the Constitution to remove the President from office?
- 6. Please describe to the best of your knowledge why the National Guard was not deployed to the Capitol Complex in advance of the January 6th protests, as it has been for past large-scale protest events?
- 7. What explains the contrasting tactics the Washington, D.C. National Guard deployed against Black Lives Matter and other unarmed, nonviolent protestors in 2020 and those deployed or not deployed against armed insurrectionists assaulting law enforcement officers and laying siege to the Capitol complex?

While we are so often divided into parties and factions, we firmly believe that we share a common love for the American people and a firm desire to see our imperfect, yet beautiful
