Dear Nik Sus:

This is a second interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request(s) to U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) submitted June 23, 2020.

For this production, CBP processed two thousand thirty-five (2034) pages of documents in response to your request. CBP has determined nine (9) pages may be released in part with redactions pursuant to Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(7)(E). In addition, we determined that seven hundred eighty-one (781) pages are duplicates, and one thousand two hundred forty-four (1244) pages were not responsive to your request.

CBP is also releasing ten (10) pages that were previously sent for consultation. These ten (10) pages were referenced in the first interim release letter and are now being released in part with redactions pursuant to Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(7)(E).

CBP notes that one hundred seventy-seven (177) additional pages responsive to your request are publicly available at the following location:
