only Plaintiff's characterization of the relief sought in this action. To the extent that an answer is

deemed required, Defendant denies the allegations.

17. Defendant admits that CREW sought a waiver of its fee request. The remainder of Paragraph 17 characterizes Plaintiff's FOIA request. Defendant respectfully refers the Court to

Defendant respectfully refers the Court to Defendant's October 26, 2020 email for a full and accurate statement of its contents. To the extent Plaintiff's characterization is inconsistent with the FOIA request, Defendant denies the allegations in this paragraph.

21. Defendant admits that CREW responded to Defendant's October 26, 2020 email. The remainder of Paragraph 21 constitutes Plaintiff's characterization of that communication. Defendant respectfully refers the Court to CREW's response for a full and accurate statement of its contents. To the extent Plaintiff's characterization is inconsistent with the FOIA request, Defendant denies the allegations in this paragraph.

22. Admit.

23. Paragraph 23 contains conclusions of law to which no response is required.

PLAINTIFF'S CLAIM FOR RELIEF

24. Defendant incorporates its responses to Paragraphs 3 through 23.

25. Paragraph 25 contains conclusions of law to which no response is required. To the extent a response is deemed necessary, Defendant denies the allegations in Paragraph 25.

27. Paragraph 27 contains conclusions of law and Plaintiff's characterization of relief to which no response is required. To the extent a response is deemed necessary, Defendant denies the allegations in Paragraph 27.

REQUESTED RELIEF

The remainder of the Complaint sets forth Plaintiff's prayer for relief, to which no response by Defendant is required; however, to the extent a response is deemed required, Defendant denies that Plaintiff is entitled to the relief that it seeks or to any relief whatsoever.

Each and every allegation of the Complaint not expressly admitted or denied is hereby denied.

DEFENSES

FIRST DEFENSE

Plaintiff is not entitled to compel the release of information protected from disclosure by one or more of the exemptions or exclusions to the FOIA.

SECOND DEFENSE

This Court lacks subject matter jurisdiction over any of Plaintiff's requests for relief that exceed the relief authorized by FOIA.

THIRD DEFENSE

Plaintiff's FOIA request is unreasonably broad and does not reasonably describe the

records sought.
