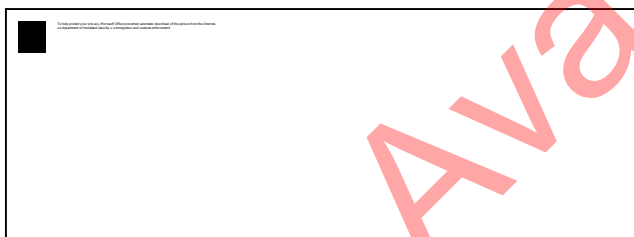

Chaunta A. Bashir, a.k.a. "taytheonly," 27, of Chino, was sentenced by U.S. District Judge Jesus G. Bernal. Bashir pleaded guilty on July 15 to one count of production of child pornography following an investigation by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Los Angeles.

The Justice Department announced today that three Sri Lankan citizens have been charged with terrorism offenses, including conspiring to provide material support to a designated foreign terrorist organization (ISIS). The men were part of a group of ISIS supporters which called itself "ISIS in Sri Lanka." That group is responsible for the 2019 Easter attacks in the South Asian nation of Sri Lanka, which killed 268 people, including five U.S. citizens, and injured over 500 others, according to a federal criminal complaint unsealed today.

January 10, 2021

(U//LES) On 10 January 2021, FBI agents conducted a search warrant of a residence associated with an individual identified as illegally entering the US Capitol on 6 January 2021. The individual was pictured wearing body armor and a combat helmet on the floor of the US Capitol. The search located the below pictured weapons.

(U) The FBI suggests arresting agencies exercise caution and consider use of SWAT when affecting the arrest of individuals who displayed body armor or other armament during criminal activity conducted at the US Capitol.

Man Arrested for Illegally Entering Office of Speaker of the House

Richard Barnett, 60, of Gravette, Arkansas was arrested today in Bentonville, Arkansas on multiple criminal charges related to his alleged unlawful activities earlier this week at the U.S. Capitol Building where he was photographed with his feet up on a desk in the Speaker of the House of Representatives' office.

Barnett is scheduled to make his initial appearance in federal court on Tuesday. He will ultimately be extradited to Washington, D.C.

"The shocking images of Mr. Barnett with his boots up on a desk in the Speaker of the House's office on Wednesday was repulsive," said Jeffrey A. Rosen, Acting Attorney General of the United States. "Those who are proven to have committed criminal acts during the storming of the Capitol will face justice."

According to court documents, U.S. Capitol Police learned that an individual had entered the restricted office area of the Speaker of the House of Representatives Nancy Pelosi and was photographed with his feet propped up on furniture. Those photos were circulated on numerous news media platforms which identified the individual as Barnett. A search of law enforcement databases confirmed that the individual in the news photographs did in fact appear to be Barnett.

"This case is just one in a number that demonstrate the brazen acts that were committed at the Capitol on Wednesday," said Michael Sherwin, Acting U.S. Attorney for the District of Columbia. "My Office is committed to prosecuting all individuals who participated in these abhorrent acts to the fullest extent of the law."

"The U.S. Capitol is one of the most iconic buildings in our country and a symbol of the Constitution and people we have sworn to protect, and its destruction will not be tolerated," said Steven M. D'Antuono, Assistant Director in Charge of the FBI Washington Field Office. "This arrest demonstrates to all individuals involved in January 6 incursion into the U.S. Capitol that the FBI will find you and hold you accountable for your crimes, no matter your location. We thank the FBI Little Rock Field Office for their quick assistance in bringing this perpetrator to justice."

Barnett is charged with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority; violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds; and theft of public money, property, or records. If convicted, he faces a maximum penalty of one year in prison. Actual sentences for federal crimes are typically less than the maximum penalties. A federal district court judge will determine any sentence after taking into account the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines and other statutory factors.

This case is being investigated by the U.S. Capitol Police and the FBI's Washington Field Office, with the assistance of the Justice Department's National Security Division and the FBI's Little Rock Field Office.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Nicole McClain of the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia is prosecuting the case.

A criminal complaint is merely an accusation. The defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty.

Three Foreign Nationals Charged with Conspiring to Provide Material Support to ISIS

The men were allegedly members of a group of ISIS supporters that carried out terrorist attacks in Sri Lanka on Easter Day in 2019, killing 268 people

The Justice Department announced today that three Sri Lankan citizens have been charged with terrorism offenses, including conspiring to provide material support to a designated foreign terrorist organization (ISIS). The men were part of a group of ISIS supporters which called itself "ISIS in Sri Lanka." That group is responsible for the 2019 Easter attacks in the South Asian nation of Sri Lanka, which killed 268 people, including five U.S. citizens, and injured over 500 others, according to a federal criminal complaint unsealed today.

The complaint outlines the defendants' roles in the conspiracy and the events that led to near-simultaneous suicide bombings in the Sri Lankan cities of Colombo, Negombo and Batticaloa on April 21, 2019. One of the U.S. citizens killed was a Department of Commerce employee who had traveled to Sri Lanka on official business.

Two days after the attacks, ISIS claimed credit for the terrorist acts, attributing the murders to "Islamic State fighters." In late April 2019, the then-leader of ISIS praised the attackers for what he called a retaliation against "the West" for defeating ISIS the prior month in Baghuz, Syria.

"ISIS's Easter attacks in Sri Lanka killed 268 people, including five Americans, many while they worshiped," said Assistant Attorney General for National Security John C. Demers. "Today, we charge these defendants with bearing their share of the responsibility for these deaths. According to these charges, the defendants were committed supporters of ISIS, recruited others to ISIS's violent cause, purchased materials for and made IEDs, helped to prepare and trained others who participated in the attacks, and murdered in the name of this deadly foreign terrorist organization. They are in custody in Sri Lanka. We fully support the Sri Lankan investigation and prosecution of these terrorists and will continue to work with the authorities there to pursue our shared goal of holding these defendants accountable for their crimes. At the same time, these charges reflect that the U.S. justice system remains a powerful tool to bring to bear against those who harm our citizens abroad. We will continue to pursue justice for the victims of these heinous attacks and for all American victims of terrorism."

"This case clearly demonstrates that the United States will take decisive action to ensure terrorists face justice when they target Americans anywhere in the world," said Nick Hanna, the U.S. Attorney for the Central District of California. "The United States remains confident in the Sri Lankan authorities' ability to bring the perpetrators to justice – and this complaint makes clear that we stand ready with these charges in the event the defendants attempt to evade justice."

"The domestic charges announced today for an attack on foreign soil represent the FBI's commitment to deliver justice to traveling American victims and to protect U.S. interests here and abroad," said Kristi K. Johnson, the Assistant Director in Charge of the FBI's Los Angeles Field Office. "For decades, and particularly since 9/11, the FBI has deployed agents to various parts of the world to establish an investigative foothold and to liaison with local counterparts

with a shared goal of combatting terror globally. Our enduring hope is that criminal prosecution – whether domestic or foreign – will bring some peace to the hundreds of victims killed or injured in Sri Lanka as a result of this horrific attack.”

The criminal case filed on Dec. 11, 2020, in the U.S. District Court in Los Angeles is the result of a nearly two-year investigation by the FBI, which assisted Sri Lankan authorities in the wake of the suicide bombings that targeted Christian churches and luxury hotels frequented by Westerners. The defendants named in the complaint, along with other suspects linked to the attacks, currently are detained in Sri Lanka, where a criminal investigation is ongoing.

According to the complaint, the three charged defendants and others involved in the conspiracy – including eight terrorists who died in the suicide bombings – conspired to provide, provided, and attempted to provide material support, including services and personnel, to ISIS through various actions, including: (1) creating, maintaining, and serving as members of a group of ISIS supporters in Sri Lanka devoted to ISIS, its ideology, and to planning and encouraging violent attacks to advance ISIS’s goals; (2) obtaining explosive materials and IED components; (3) manufacturing and testing IEDs, including the types of IEDs ultimately used in the attack; (4) recruiting other ISIS in Sri Lanka members; (5) using ISIS-created training materials to instruct and train the attackers and their co-conspirators in the use of firearms and explosives; (6) procuring safe houses for the group to prepare for attacks in the name of ISIS, including the Easter Attacks, while avoiding law enforcement detection; (7) following ISIS directives to use specific end-to-end encrypted messaging applications to conceal the criminal conspiracy; (8) murdering two Sri Lankan police officers to obtain the officers’ firearms; and (9) shooting a suspected police informant.

The three defendants named in the criminal complaint, all of whom pledged allegiance to ISIS, are:

- Mohamed Naufar, the “second emir” for the group of ISIS supporters that called itself “ISIS in Sri Lanka,” who allegedly led the group’s propaganda efforts, recruited others to join ISIS, and led a series of multi-day military-type trainings;
- Mohamed Anwar Mohamed Riskan, who allegedly helped manufacture the IEDs used in the Easter Attacks; and
- Ahamed Milhan Hayathu Moahmed, who allegedly executed a police officer in order to obtain the officer’s firearm, shot a suspected informant, and scouted a location for a separate terrorist attack.

All three defendants are charged with conspiring to provide, providing, and attempting to provide material support to a designated foreign terrorist organization. Additionally, Naufar and Milhan are charged with aiding and abetting the receipt of military-type training from ISIS.

The FBI-led Joint Terrorism Task Force in Los Angeles, including personnel assigned responsibilities for extraterritorial matters, is leading the investigation. This matter is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Annamartine Salick, George E. Pence IV and Christine M. Ro of the Terrorism and Export Crimes Section, and Trial Attorney Alicia Cook of the National Security Division’s Counterterrorism Section. The Criminal Division’s Office of International Affairs provided valuable assistance.

Two Quebec Men Extradited to North Dakota from Canada as Part of 'Operation Denial'

The Department of Justice announced today that Canadian authorities extradited two alleged members of an international fentanyl trafficking organization.

Acting Assistant Attorney General David P. Burns of the Justice Department's Criminal Division, U.S. Attorney Drew H. Wrigley of the District of North Dakota and U.S. Attorney Billy J. Williams of the District of Oregon made the announcement.

Jason Joey Berry, aka Daniel Desnoyers, 37, of Montreal, Quebec, and Xuan Cahn Nguyen, aka Jackie, aka Jackie Chan, 41, of Point-Aux-Tremble, Quebec, arrived in North Dakota Wednesday and had their initial court appearance and arraignment before U.S. Magistrate Judge Alice Senechal today. Their case is assigned to Chief U.S. District Judge Peter D. Welte.

Berry was arrested on Oct. 18, 2019, and Nguyen was arrested on Jan. 16, 2020, by Canadian authorities at the request of the United States. Both Berry and Nguyen were ordered surrendered by the Canadian Minister of Justice on Nov. 30, 2020. Berry and Nguyen were extradited in connection with a superseding indictment in the District of North Dakota charging them with conspiracy to distribute controlled substances and controlled substance analogues resulting in serious bodily injury and death, and conspiracy to import controlled substances and controlled substance analogues into the United States resulting in serious bodily injury and death. The superseding indictment also charges Nguyen with international money laundering conspiracy.

The extradition comes as part of "Operation Denial," an Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force (OCDETF)-funded investigation into the international trafficking of fentanyl and other lethal drugs, aided by the national and international coordination led by the multi-agency Special Operations Division near Washington D.C. as part of "Operation Deadly Merchant." The investigation started in North Dakota on Jan. 3, 2015, with the overdose death in Grand Forks, North Dakota, of 18-year-old Bailey Henke.

Berry and Nguyen's alleged co-conspirator Daniel Vivas Ceron of Columbia was previously extradited from Panama to North Dakota in 2017. Vivas Ceron pleaded guilty on July 12, 2019, for his role in operating an international fentanyl trafficking organization from a Canadian prison and is awaiting sentencing.

This case is being investigated by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security Investigations, the Drug Enforcement Administration, U.S. Postal Inspection Service, Grand Forks Narcotics Task Force, Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Portland Oregon Police Bureau – Drugs and Vice Division, Portland HIDTA Interdiction Task Force, Oregon State Police, and the Grand Forks Police Department. The Justice Department's Office of International Affairs provided significant assistance in bringing Berry and Nguyen to the United States and procuring foreign evidence during the investigation.

Trial Attorney Kaitlin Sahni of the Criminal Division's Narcotic and Dangerous Drug Section, Assistant U.S. Attorney Christopher C. Myers of the District of North Dakota, and Assistant U.S. Attorney Tom Edmonds of the District of

Oregon are prosecuting the cases.

An indictment is merely an allegation. A defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.

Dear Secretary Bernhardt:

America was saddened last Wednesday by the insurrection on the United States Capitol and the impending threats to our democracy. In light of recent events and imminent threats, I am requesting that any and all Public Gathering Permits in the District of Columbia during the period January 11 through January 24, 2021, be rescinded immediately and that no further permits be issued for this period.

Washington, DC has always proudly hosted Inauguration activities, welcoming hundreds of thousands of persons to the city, supporters and protestors alike. But this is not an ordinary January. We are under two separate states of emergency, one relating to the violence and terrorism associated with disputing the results of the election, and one relating to the pandemic that has claimed the lives of 371,000 Americans.

Protecting visitors requires not only the resources of our law enforcement officials, but requires us to call on the mutual aid of other law enforcement departments from other jurisdictions. The larger the crowds, the more people we need, and those persons, like persons coming for the Inauguration events, may be asymptomatic spreaders of the virus.

Dr. Christopher Rodriguez, Director of DC Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency, is my point person on this request and is available to provide you with any additional information. Dear Acting Secretary Wolf:

Following the unprecedented terrorist attack on the United States Capitol on Wednesday, January 6, 2021, and the continued threat of related violence in the District of Columbia, we are extremely concerned about the upcoming National Special Security Event (NSSE) led by the United States Secret Service. We believe strongly that the 59th Presidential Inauguration on January 20 will require a very different approach than previous inaugurations given the chaos, injury, and death experienced at the United States Capitol during the insurrection. While I will be reaching out to a broad range of local, regional, and federal partners to enhance cooperation among our bodies, I strongly urge the United States Department of Homeland Security to adjust its approach to the Inauguration in several specific ways.

First, the District of Columbia is requesting the Department extend the National Special Security Event period to run from Monday, January 11 to Sunday, January 24, 2021. This is an increase from the current period of January 19 to January 21, 2021, which will allow for better Federal and District government interagency preparation for the Inauguration, given the new threats from insurgent acts of domestic terrorists. Further, the District strongly recommends that you secure the permission of the Congress of the United States to include the Capitol and its grounds in the NSSE perimeter.

Second, the District of Columbia is submitting a request for a pre-disaster declaration under the Robert T. Stafford Act for the Inauguration. This declaration will enhance and expedite direct federal assistance needed to prepare for the Inauguration. My Administration is developing specific requests for direct federal assistance and will work with FEMA to execute those requests upon approval of the declaration.

Third, the District of Columbia urges the Department to coordinate with the Department of Defense and the Department of Justice, the United States Congress, and the United States Supreme Court to establish a security and federal force deployment plan for all federal property, which will ensure the Metropolitan Police Department's (MPD) ability to focus on its local mission in the District's eight wards. Earlier this week, MPD officers acted heroically rushing to back-up the United States

Capitol Police to stop the assault on the United States Capitol. Consistent with established protocols and practices, it is the primary responsibility of the federal government to secure federal property in these situations.


In addition, I ask that the Acting Attorney General at the Department of Justice direct the Federal Bureau of Investigation to provide an intelligence and threat briefing on a daily basis during the period of January 11 – 24, 2021, to the DC Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency (HSEMA) and MPD and all law enforcement entities operating in the District of Columbia.

Further, I am requesting that the Secretary of the Department of Interior cancel any and all Public Gathering Permits in the District of Columbia and deny any applications for Public Gathering Permits during the period of January 11 – 24, 2021. We have made this request repeatedly since June 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic, and this week demonstrated the National Park Service's willingness to approve last minute permits and major adjustments.

The requests outlined herein — if issued swiftly and communicated broadly — are essential to demonstrating our collective resolve in ensuring the Constitutional transition of power and our nation's capital in the days leading up to it. And like with previous inaugurations and NSSEs, the District of Columbia will host a press event for agencies engaged in the NSSE to brief the public on the plan and coordination among our agencies. We look forward to federal participation.

‘The storm is here’: Ashli Babbitt’s journey from capital ‘guardian’ to invader

The politician she revered above all others had lost an election. She’d struggled with crippling amounts of debt. Her home state of California was locking down again because of a virus she believed was fiction.

As she walked east along the Mall on Wednesday, wearing a backpack emblazoned with the American flag, Ashli Babbitt was elated.

“It was amazing to get to see the president talk,” Babbitt said, beaming in a video she streamed on Facebook early Wednesday afternoon that was later published by [TMZ](#). “We are now walking down the inaugural path to the Capitol building. Three million-plus people.”

There was no crowd of three million: just a mob, lawless and maskless, that numbered in the thousands. Babbitt’s mission, which she had repeatedly avowed on social media, was to restore American democracy. But she was about to take part in a riot that would go down in history as one of that democracy’s most grievous attacks.

After a long but undistinguished military career and years of personal travails, Babbitt — a 35-year-old Air Force veteran from Southern California who once supported Barack Obama — believed she had found a cause that gave her life purpose. Within hours, that cause would bring her life to a violent end.

Hers was the first death reported Jan. 6, when rioters incited by President Trump overran the seat of the U.S. government. In the coming days there would be others. Brian D. Sicknick, a 42-year-old Capitol police officer who died after being injured while trying to push back the mob. Rosanne Boyland, Kevin D. Greeson and Benjamin Phillips, who died of medical emergencies during the chaos.

But it was Babbitt, fatally shot by police as she attempted to leap through the broken window of a door inside the Capitol, whose name would almost instantly become synonymous with the feverish movement that had propelled thousands of Americans to desecrate a pillar of their government.

Her comrades in that movement now call her a martyr and plan to gather at the Washington Monument Saturday to hold a vigil in her name.

Babbitt’s journey — illuminated through her extensive social media activity, court and military records, and interviews with some who knew her — was one of paranoid devotion and enthusiasm that only increased as Trump’s fortunes waned.

She avidly followed the QAnon conspiracy theory, convinced that Trump was destined to vanquish a cabal of child

abusers and Satan-worshipping Democrats. She believed Wednesday would be “the storm,” when QAnon mythology holds that Trump would capture and execute his opponents.

Long before she embraced those ideas, Babbitt was on a rocky path. She was loyal but rebellious, devoted to her country but often unable to get along with those who shared it. A believer in American pluck and free enterprise, she struggled in her attempts to run a small pool-service company outside San Diego.

She served more than a decade in the armed forces but chafed under the military hierarchy. Six of those years were spent in an Air National Guard unit whose mandate is to defend the Washington region and respond to civil unrest. Its nickname: the Capital Guardians.

Like so many others, she believed Jan. 6 would be not a day of infamy, but an end to her troubles.

“Nothing will stop us,” she tweeted Jan. 5. “They can try and try and try but the storm is here and it is descending upon DC in less than 24 hours....dark to light!”

It was the last thing she would write.

‘Absolutely unafraid’

She was fed up with her executive officer. It was 2014, and Babbitt — along with much of her Air National Guard unit, then stationed at the Al Dhafra Air Base in the United Arab Emirates — detested him, according to a former staff sergeant in the unit who spoke on the condition of anonymity because he fears backlash online.

But despite her reputation for being outspoken, she kept herself in check. Then one day, the executive officer slipped new papers into a briefing binder shortly before quizzing service members on its contents.

Babbitt asked for permission to speak freely, the former staff sergeant said, and the executive officer granted it — “which was a huge mistake for that captain.”

For the next several minutes, she “let him have it,” the former staff sergeant said. He and other members of the unit watched, riveted, as Babbitt shouted and gesticulated, warning that the officer — who far outranked her — was sapping morale. Another former airman who served with Babbitt said he also witnessed the interaction.

“She was like a dog with a bone,” the former staff sergeant said. “She could never let go of whatever her attention was on, and she was absolutely unafraid of anything.”

Babbitt, who grew up in a small town in the foothills of Southern California’s Cuyamaca Mountains, left similarly strong impressions on others who crossed her path. She was a fast talker, whipping through sentences “like a chinchilla that had just done a line of cocaine,” the staff sergeant said. She escaped punishment for confronting the officer in 2014, according to the airmen who served with her, but it was not the only time that her personality put her at odds with the culture and rules of the military.

She deployed at least seven times, an Air Force journalist wrote in 2014, and relished the opportunity to mentor newer airmen. But discipline issues and insubordination stunted her career, said two former airmen who served with her. She was demoted at least once, they said.

Babbitt left the military in 2016 as a senior airman — a relatively low rank for someone who spent more than a decade in uniform.

The same year, Babbitt spotted her husband Aaron Babbitt's ex, Celeste Norris, pulling out of a shopping center parking lot in southern Maryland, according to a court petition for a protective order Norris later filed. Babbitt spun her white SUV in a U-turn and began chasing Norris, according to the petition, eventually rear-ending the other woman's car three times and forcing her to stop.

Babbitt then exited her own car "screaming at me and verbally threatening me," wrote Norris, who declined to comment for this report. Norris filed a second protective order petition in early 2017, saying Babbitt had followed her home from work and called her "all hours of day and night."

Some who served with Babbitt kept in touch with her, remembering how fiercely she defended people she cared for. At one point in her life, that meant other service members.

But within a few years of leaving the military, "she had a new cause," one of her fellow airmen said. "And her cause was QAnon."

'Today we save America'

Babbitt would eventually share more than 8,600 tweets, offering a vivid account of her descent into a world of conspiracy theories and delusion, but her first message was addressed to Trump, the man she believed was destined to rescue her country.

"#love," she wrote Oct. 31, 2016, beside his name and above a photo of three signs nailed to a tree: "Make America Great Again," "H FOR PRISON" and "CHRISTIAN DEPLORABLES LIVE HERE."

A week later, on Election Day, she wrote to Trump again: "today we save America from the tyranny, collusion and corruption." When he won, Babbitt cried.

She was an avid viewer of Fox News, praising Tucker Carlson and other far-right media personalities on the network as she derided their liberal targets. A registered Libertarian, she hadn't always despised Democrats, declaring at least three times in recent years that she voted for Obama.

"I think Obama did great things...I think he jacked some s--- up," she wrote in November 2018, "but I think he did do a lot of good...at a time where we needed him."

But the man we needed now and for years to come, she had decided, was Trump, and her devotion only grew as she became more obsessed with baseless online propaganda — all while her professional life collapsed.

On July 1, 2019, a judge issued a \$71,000 judgment against her pool business because she had apparently failed to repay a loan. The day before, Babbitt had suggested starting a GoFundMe to pay for Trump's addition to Mount Rushmore, and the day after, she lodged an angry tirade at U.S. Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-N.Y.).

"You are losing it," Babbitt wrote, "seriously."

She promoted far-right lies that Hillary Clinton has kidnapped children and described the left as modern-day enslavers. She appeared to use a QAnon hashtag for the first time early last year, parroting the cryptic jargon promoted

by its most ardent followers.

“The best is yet to come,” she wrote Feb. 24.

“What is dark will come to light!” she added a month later.

“We have to #SaveTheChildren,” she demanded in one post, using a humanitarian hashtag that conspiracy theorists hijacked to promote their claim that a secretive group of elites run a pedophilia ring.

Her anger appeared to intensify amid the pandemic, which she insisted was a hoax, calling it the “control virus” and “a F---ING JOKE.”

“We are being hoodwinked,” she wrote in July. “The sheep need to wake up.”

On Dec. 29, eight days before her death, she discovered a tweet from Vice President-elect Kamala D. Harris promising to distribute more vaccines, promote mask-wearing and get students back to school.

“No the f--- you will not!” Babbitt retorted.

In the days leading up to her trip to Washington for the Trump demonstration, however, her online fury receded, replaced with glee and a new sense of mission. She retweeted dozens of figures promoting Trump’s demands that his supporters gather to overturn the election, including Trump supporter Jack Posobiec, QAnon activists, Secretary of State Mike Pompeo and Donald Trump Jr.

“I will be there tomorrow!” she wrote Jan. 4 in response to another supporter heading to the nation’s capital. “Gods speed!”

She boarded a plane in San Diego the next morning and sat beside Will Carless, a journalist from USA Today who would later film the moment just before the pro-Trump rioters stormed the Capitol. He called her “gregarious and chatty” and said they talked about a California beach town each of them loved.

The next day, it was overcast and cold in the District. Babbitt dressed in a hooded jacket and put an American flag backpack on her shoulders. She listened to the president tell her and many others that the country could only be taken back with strength, not weakness. Then she marched to the Capitol, surrounded, she said in her final Facebook video, by fellow “patriots.”

“She loved her country, and she was doing what she thought was right to support her country, joining up with like-minded people that also love their president and their country,” her husband told Fox-5 San Diego.

Not long after 2 p.m., he said, he sent her a message to ask how she was doing. She never wrote back.

A truth affirmed

While her husband was waiting, Babbitt was with the mob that swarmed the lightly staffed barricades surrounding their national legislature. In a scene unlike any in American history, they bashed in the windows of the U.S. Capitol. They fought with the police, screaming and waving Trump campaign flags and Confederate battle flags. They wandered through the halls and chambers of the Capitol as panicked lawmakers sheltered in place or were evacuated. Tear gas canisters were discharged in the Rotunda.

And a gun was fired.

It is unclear exactly how and when Babbitt entered the Capitol. She undoubtedly understood law enforcement could use deadly force in response to the breach. Airmen in the role Babbitt once occupied in the D.C. Air National Guard's 113th Air Wing receive riot-control training, and her former unit was mobilized to protect the Capitol on Wednesday.

But it has since become clear what happened inside: The raging crowd that bashed in the windows of a barricaded door to the Speaker's Lobby, with a short tanned woman in an American backpack at the front of its ranks. Her attempt to climb through one of those windows, leading the way, despite a Capitol Police officer pointing a handgun in her direction. The abrupt way she toppled backward after a single shot resounded.

And it was clear how she left.

At about 3 p.m., a team of paramedics rushed a gurney to an ambulance parked at the southeast corner of the building. On it was Babbitt, staring listlessly in the direction of the building she had just tried to occupy, the place where her dreams of a revitalizing "storm" were supposed to come true.

Blood ran from her nose and covered half of her face. Her eyes were on the verge of closing. Riot police guarded the ambulance as its doors closed and pulled away. And that night — the night Babbitt died far from her home and family — Congress affirmed as true what she had died denying: Donald Trump would not remain president.

Director of National Intelligence John Ratcliffe today welcomed the U.S. Space Force (USSF) as the 18th member of the U.S. Intelligence Community (IC).

During an afternoon ceremony, Ratcliffe and Chief of Space Operations Gen. John W. “Jay” Raymond announced the designation of the intelligence element of the U.S. Space Force as a member of the IC.

“This accession reaffirms our commitment to securing outer space as a safe and free domain for America’s interests,” said Ratcliffe. “American power in space is stronger and more unified than ever before. Today we welcome Space Force to the Intelligence Community and look forward to the power and ingenuity of a space security team unrivaled by any nation.”

The Space Force element is the first new organization to join the IC since 2006.

“Today, we took action to elevate space intelligence missions, tradecraft, and collaboration to ensure the success of the Space Force, the Intelligence Community, and ultimately our National Security,” said Gen. Raymond. “This is a significant milestone, a clear statement that America is committed to a secure and accessible space domain. Our partnership will ensure the Space Force and the Nation remain always above any threat.”

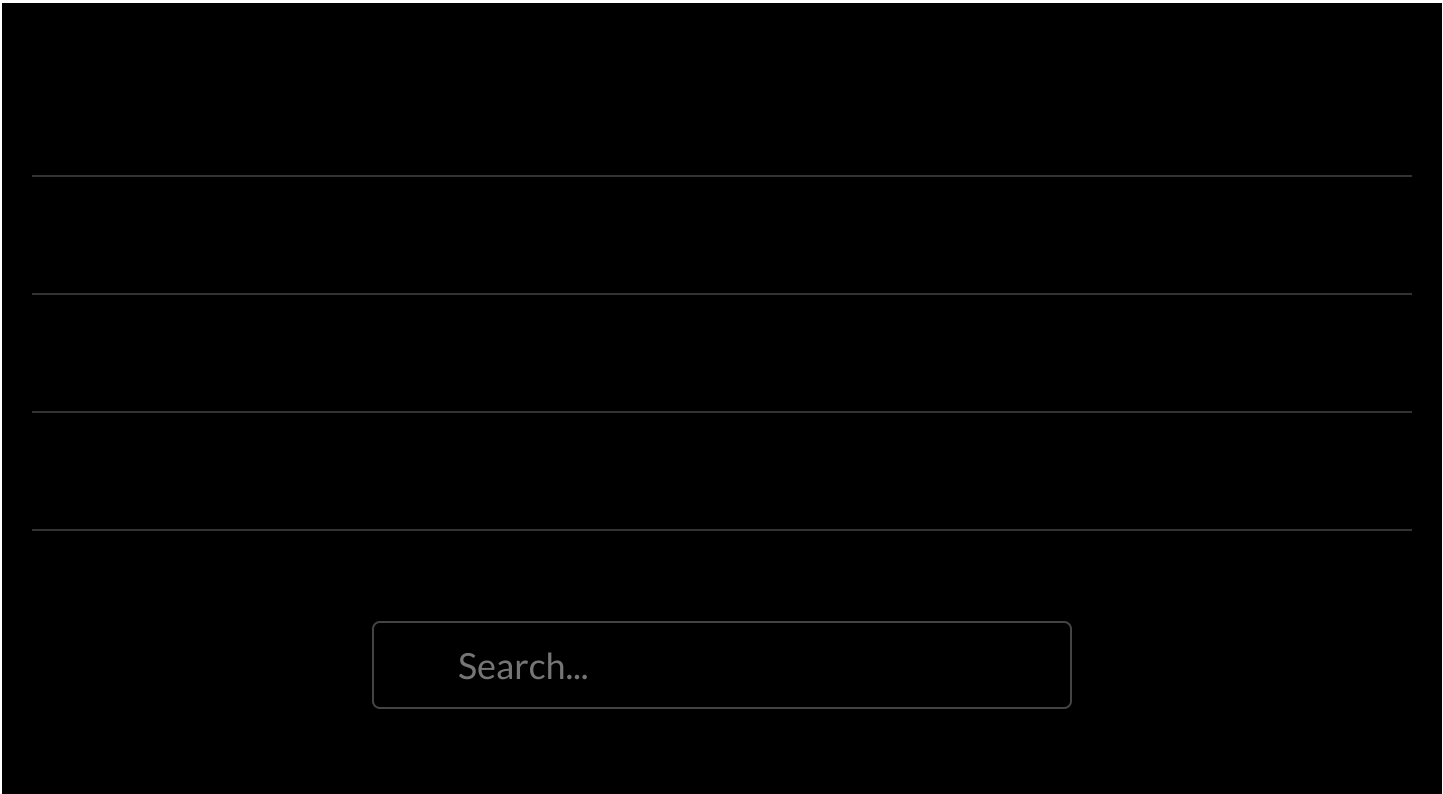
Ratcliffe highlighted how the addition of USSF to the IC marks a historic opportunity to further strategic change across the national security space enterprise.

“Through sharing space-related information and intelligence, the IC and DoD increase integration and coordination of our intelligence activities to achieve best effect and value in executing our missions,” said Ratcliffe. “This move not only underscores the importance of space as a priority intelligence and military operational domain for national security, but ensures interoperability, future capability development and operations, and true global awareness for strategic warning.”

“Today’s change aligns our newest service with the other members of the Defense Intelligence

Enterprise and will help ensure our efforts are coordinated and synchronized across all domains of warfare,” said Ezra Cohen, acting Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence and Security.

Thirteen Charged in Federal Court Following Riot at the United States Capitol

Approximately 40 charged in Superior Court

Thirteen individuals have been charged so far in federal court in the District of Columbia related to crimes committed at the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C., on Wednesday, Jan. 6, 2021. In addition to those who have been charged, additional complaints have been submitted and investigations are ongoing.

"The lawless destruction of the U.S. Capitol building was an attack against one of our Nation's greatest institutions," said Acting U.S. Attorney Michael Sherwin. "My Office, along with our law enforcement partners at all levels, have been expeditiously working and leveraging every resource to identify, arrest, and begin prosecuting these individuals who took part in the brazen criminal acts at the U.S. Capitol. We are resolute in our commitment to holding accountable anyone responsible for these disgraceful criminal acts, and to anyone who might be considering engaging in or inciting violence in the coming weeks – know this: you will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law."

"ATF is committed to the rule of law and the protection of all citizens' Constitutional rights," said Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) Deputy Director Regina Lombardo. "We continue to support our law enforcement partners to ensure those who violated the law during the events at the Capitol this week are brought to justice. ATF has dedicated all appropriate resources to complete these investigations as soon as possible."

"Today's charges are just the beginning of the FBI's ongoing efforts to hold those responsible for the criminal acts of violence and destruction that unfolded during the U.S. Capitol building breach on January 6th," said FBI Director Christopher Wray. "To be clear, what took place that day was not First Amendment-protected activity, but rather an affront on our democracy. The FBI, along with our local, state and federal partners, is committed to ensuring that justice is served. We will continue to aggressively investigate each and every individual who chose to ignore the law and instead incite violence, destroy property, and injure others."

"Deputy U.S. Marshals responded to support U.S. Capitol Police after the incursion into the Capitol building. Our deputies helped to clear the building and escorted members of Congress back to the main chamber for official business," said U.S. Marshals Service Director Donald Washington. "US Marshals will now bring to bear our fugitive investigations expertise to ensure that individuals charged in federal warrants are brought to face justice. Respect for the rule of law is a foundational principle for our democracy and the freedoms that it provides. Unlawful acts will not go unpunished."

"The events that happened at and around the United States Capitol were unconscionable, and those responsible will be held accountable for their attempts to thwart Democracy," said Metropolitan Police Department Chief of Police Robert J. Contee III. "While these charges represent a positive step, there is still work to be done. Our collective intentions are to work diligently to identify all of the persons responsible for the insurrection at our U.S. Capitol."

Thirteen individuals have been charged with federal crimes. The defendants and charges are outlined below:

1. Cleveland Meredith was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with making interstate threats to Speaker Nancy Pelosi.
2. Richard Barnett, of Arkansas, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful entry; violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds; and theft of public money, property, or records. Barnett allegedly entered a restricted area of the Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi.
3. Lonnie Coffman, of Alabama, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with possession of an unregistered firearm (destructive device) and carrying a pistol without a license. It is alleged that Coffman's vehicle contained 11 explosive devices known as Molotov cocktails and firearms. It is further alleged he was in possession of two firearms. Coffman was arrested and is currently being held. His detention hearing is scheduled for Jan. 12, 2021.
4. Mark Leffingwell, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority; assault on a federal law enforcement officer; and violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds. Leffingwell allegedly entered the Senate side of the Capitol and when stopped by law enforcement, struck an officer in the helmet and chest. Leffingwell is currently being held and has a detention hearing in district court today.
5. Christopher Alberts, of Maryland, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with carrying or having readily accessible, on the grounds of the United States Capitol Building, a firearm and ammunition. Specifically a Taurus G2C, 9mm handgun and 9mm caliber ammunition. The defendant appeared in district court and was released. He has a preliminary hearing scheduled for Jan. 28, 2021.
6. Joshua Pruitt, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority. The defendant appeared in district court and was released. He has a preliminary hearing scheduled for Jan. 28, 2021.
7. Matthew Council, of Florida, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority and violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds. Council allegedly unlawfully entered the Capitol building, and when stopped by law enforcement, he pushed the officer.
8. Cindy Fitchett, of Virginia, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority; or knowingly, with intent to impede government business or official functions, engaging in disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds; and violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds.
9. Michael Curzio, of Florida, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority; or knowingly, with intent to impede government business or official functions, engaging in disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds; and violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds.
10. Douglas Sweet, of Florida, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority; or knowingly, with intent to impede government business or official functions, engaging in disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds; and violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds.
11. Bradley Ruskelas, of Illinois, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority; or knowingly, with intent to impede government business or official functions, engaging in disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds; and violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds.
12. Terry Brown, of Pennsylvania, was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority; or knowingly, with intent to impede government business or official functions, engaging in disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds; and violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds.
13. Thomas Gallagher was charged on Jan. 7, 2021, with knowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority; or knowingly, with intent to impede government business or official functions, engaging in disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds; and violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds.

In addition, approximately 40 individuals have been arrested and charged in Superior Court with offenses including, but not limited to, unlawful entry, curfew violations, and firearms-related crimes.

The cases are being prosecuted by the U.S Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia and are being investigated jointly by the FBI; U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives; United States Marshals Service; U.S. Capitol Police Department; and the Metropolitan Police Department.

The ATF and FBI continue to urge the public to report suspected use of explosive devices, or violent, destructive acts associated with the recent unrest. The details contained in the charging documents are allegations. Defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.

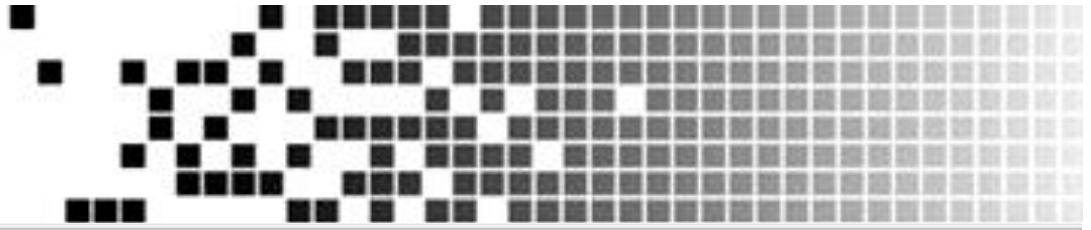

Man caught in Madrid airport smuggling cocaine into Spain in his wheelchair

The National Police stopped a 55-year-old Spanish man in Madrid's Barajas airport after he landed on a flight from the Dominican Republic on Sunday night, January 3. Police had been carrying out routine surveillance when they noticed the man, who was being helped to the airport's disability area in a wheelchair, appeared nervous and agitated.

His luggage was searched, and among his belongings was a folded-up electric wheelchair with a hidden compartment on both the backrest and seat. According to the higher Headquarters of the National Police, ten packages containing almost 10 kilograms of cocaine were discovered in the wheelchair.

According to police sources, the man had booked an internal flight to Malaga in the hope that his checked luggage wouldn't be subject to scrutiny. The National Police have confirmed that the man has a long criminal history for fraud, irregular immigration and falsifying documents and was immediately remanded in custody.

USA– Airlines boost staffing and security after assault on Capitol– 8 January 2021

Major U.S. airlines are increasing staffing and security at airports in and out of the Washington, D.C., area after yesterday's assault on Capitol Building. The violence also prompted an appeal from the nation's biggest flight attendants union.



Carriers including American Airlines and United Airlines said they were taking measures to avoid potential trouble on the ground and in the air after thousands of supporters of President Donald Trump demanding the presidential election be overturned stormed the Capitol building on Wednesday.

The riot was preceded by at least two in-flight incidents on D.C.-bound flights. One involved Senator Mitt Romney, R.-Utah, who was reportedly heckled by a group of Trump supporters on a flight from Salt Lake City on Tuesday.

Romney, a vocal critic of the plan by some GOP lawmakers to formally object to the election results, was also subjected to a tirade by a woman at Salt Lake International Airport who refused to put on a face mask. A video of the confrontation was posted on Facebook. Another in-flight disruption captured on video occurred on an American flight earlier this week from Texas to Washington, D.C., with passengers screaming at each other after one person projected a "Trump 2020" image onto the aircraft's ceiling.

"The mob mentality behavior that took place on several flights to the D.C. area [Tuesday] was unacceptable and threatened the safety and security of every single person onboard," stated Sara Nelson, president of the Association of Flight Attendants, which represents nearly 50,000 flight attendants at 17 airlines. The AFA called for airlines and transportation authorities to make clear that bad behavior wouldn't be tolerated and that unruly travelers would be barred from boarding planes.

Some airline passengers took part in the violence at the Capitol, creating "further concern about their departure from the D.C. area, Nelson said. "Acts against our democracy, our government, and the freedom we claim as Americans must disqualify these individuals from the freedom of flight."

The Federal Aviation Administration on Thursday warned that disruptive acts on airplanes could violate federal law, noting that violators face possible imprisonment and fines of up to \$35,000. "We echo the sentiments of AFA that our first priority must be the safety and security of our passengers and crew," United stated in an email to CBS MoneyWatch. "Since earlier this week our crews have been moved from downtown D.C. hotels. Additionally, we have increased staffing at Washington-area airports and are in close contact with appropriate law enforcement agencies."

American also said it was working with local law enforcement and its airport authority partners to ensure safety on the ground and in the air. "We also have increased staffing at Washington D.C.-area airports and will not serve alcohol on flights to and from this area as a precautionary measure," a spokesperson stated in an email. Delta Air Lines works with law enforcement agencies and others to "enact methods — both seen and unseen — as part of our unwavering efforts to keep everyone safe at our airports and on our flights," a spokesperson said by email.

"We expect our people and customers to treat one another with dignity and respect," the spokesperson added.

"Federal agencies without evidence of adversary follow-on activity on their networks that accept the risk of running SolarWinds Orion in their enterprises should rebuild or upgrade, in compliance with hardening steps outlined in the Supplemental Guidance, to at least SolarWinds Orion Platform version 2020.2.1 HF2," according to the update.

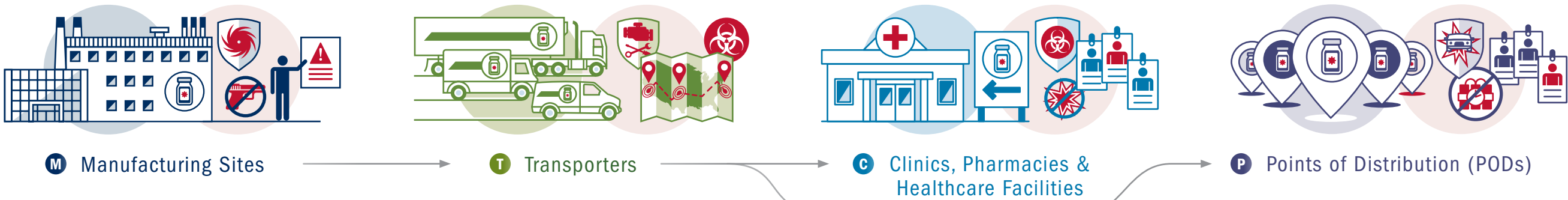

COVID-19 vaccine distribution efforts are underway, and the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) encourages organizations involved in the distribution process to assess potential security vulnerabilities and implement corresponding risk mitigation solutions to reduce the probability of disruptions. Although there are currently no credible or imminent threats, the distribution process could potentially be disrupted by anti-vaccination protesters, insiders, criminals or organized crime, or terrorists. As such, organizations involved in the manufacturing, transportation, and distribution of the vaccine should apply cost-effective protective measures to their operations. Vulnerability assessments, planning, and training are key steps to mitigating potential threats and identifying necessary protective measures. This infographic broadly illustrates four stages of vaccination distribution activity, possible physical threats at these stages, and some potential mitigations. - Maintain alarm systems with panic buttons and remote triggers for staff

- Notify local law enforcement of the vaccine locations

Vehicular Assault



- Ensure that lines and crowds are diverted away from busy roads; if possible, close roads where satellite clinics occupy space
- Train staff to recognize indicators of a possible assault, including an individual repeatedly revving the vehicle's engine, practicing heavy-vehicle manual shifting, or verbalizing threats
- Lay out a serpentine pathway for queuing vehicles so that drivers cannot accumulate significant speed
- Establish clear standoff zones, ensuring a solid passive barrier between workers on foot and vehicle lines

DHS S&T's Master Question List for COVID-19 offers scientifically informed guidance for government decision-makers

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Science and Technology Directorate (S&T) has aggregated a [Master Question List for COVID-19](#), offering scientifically informed briefs in response to the most common public health questions about what is currently known about COVID-19, and what additional information is still needed. The information is intended for use by those with a non-medical, non-scientific background, but is also rigorously cited by the most current publicly available scientific studies. This resource will be useful to government decision-makers and anyone involved in the operational response to COVID-19.

The first iteration of the DHS S&T Master Question List (MQL) was released to the public on December 21, 2020. A selection of the questions discussed in the current version include:

- Transmissibility – How does it spread from one host to another? How easily is it spread?
- Incubation Period – How long after infection do symptoms appear? Are people infectious during this time?

The recent bombing in Nashville, Tennessee on Christmas morning was the result of an explosion reportedly detonated from a recreational vehicle parked in front of an AT&T building in downtown Nashville. Prompt action by local police to evacuate building occupants prior to the explosion prevented fatalities. The high potential for loss of life and property in these types of incidents highlights the importance of first responders' preparedness.

The Joint CT Assessment Team (JCAT) has developed a [First Responder's Toolbox on Vehicle Borne Improvised Explosive Device \(VBIED\): Preparedness, Recognition, And Response](#). This is a comprehensive resource for first responders to increase VBIED awareness to aid in preparedness, recognition, and response. It includes:

- A historical overview of the ten VBIED incidents occurring on United States soil since 2010.
- Specific VBIED tactics, concerns and key safety considerations.
- Lists of pre-incident indicators observable on the vehicle itself, as well as other indicators and behaviors related to the vehicle.

National 911 Annual Report released

The National 911 Program recently released its 2020 [National 911 Annual Report](#), in collaboration with the National Association of State 911 Administrators (NASNA), covering data gathered in the 2019 calendar year. This report provides current and comprehensive state 911 data, voluntarily submitted by states and territories about their own systems.

The report will be of interest to any personnel working in 911 call centers as well as senior staff in emergency management, law enforcement, fire and EMS who may use this data for analysis of their own 911 capabilities for budgeting and planning purposes. The report's data can help answer key questions, such as:

- How many of each type of 911 calls are answered per year?
- How many primary and secondary public safety answering points (PSAPs) does a specific state have?
- Which states provide Emergency Medical Dispatch and follow a specific formal protocol?
- In which states are there minimum training requirements for telecommunicators?
- How far along are states in the procurement process for specific NG911 parts, functions and components?
- What is the progress toward NG911 in each state?

Latest CISA guidance and directives on SolarWinds Orion software supply chain compromise

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Protection Agency (CISA) released another [Joint Statement](#) on January 5, along with the Federal Bureau Of Investigation (FBI), the Office Of The Director Of National Intelligence (ODNI), and the National Security Agency (NSA). The statement officially acknowledges that the incident is "likely Russian in origin" and likely "an intelligence gathering effort." Approximately 18,000 customers of the Solar Winds' Orion product are impacted, but a much smaller number have been compromised by follow-on activity. CISA is identified as the lead agency for asset response and is focused on sharing information about this incident quickly with government and private sector partners.

The significance of this breach has compelled many government agencies to take immediate mitigation measures. CISA has released a CISA Insight, offering concise guidance to leaders of any organization impacted, entitled [What Every Leader Needs to Know About the Ongoing APT Cyber Activity](#).

Microsoft has also been assisting with this cyber incident. Microsoft has created the [Solorigate Research Center](#) for information and resources on the SolarWinds compromise. This information may be useful to IT administrators who are mitigating this cyber incident in their organizations. Microsoft's blog, [Using Microsoft 365 Defender to protect against Solorigate](#), will also be of interest to cybersecurity professionals.

Recent swatting attacks target residents with camera and voice-capable smart devices

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) issued [this public service announcement](#) to warn users who own smart home devices with cameras and voice capabilities to use complex, unique passwords and enable two-factor authentication to help protect against “swatting” attacks. Swatting is a term used to describe a hoax call made to emergency services, typically reporting an immediate threat to human life, to draw a response from law enforcement and the S.W.A.T. team to a specific location.

Recently, offenders have been using victims’ smart devices, including video and audio capable home surveillance devices, to carry out swatting attacks. Smart home device manufacturers recently notified law enforcement that offenders have been using stolen e-mail passwords to access smart devices with cameras and voice capabilities. The offenders then log into the smart device and hijack features, including the live-stream camera and device speakers.

Ten benefits of running cybersecurity exercises

There may be no better way to ascertain your organization's strengths and weaknesses than by running regular security drills. While most organizations understand the need to build defenses and develop policies to reduce the risk and potential impact of a successful cyberattack, many fail to rigorously test those defenses.

Cybersecurity exercises are simulations of specific cyberattack scenarios that organizations can play through to put their defenses to a real-world test. Organizations can gain valuable insights into what their real-world response capabilities to such an attack would be. Consider these ten opportunities for achieving greater resilience to cyberattacks that can come from practicing these types of exercises as an organization:

1. Identify your strengths.
2. Improve your response.
3. Train people.
4. Define costs and timescales.
5. Determine external needs.
6. Collect metrics.
7. Identify your weaknesses.

8. Update your policies.

9. Find non-compliance risks.

10. Increase threat awareness.

Declaring war against cyber negligence

The recent significant cyberattack involving federal government networks first disclosed in December 2020 by FireEye highlight how critical it is that American businesses and government agencies alike take a drastically different approach to cybersecurity.

Cybersecurity professionals need to shift their focus from “indicators of compromise” to data protection, which will limit how widespread the impact of these vicious digital attacks can be. It is far easier for cybersecurity manufacturers to deliver services from their own cloud. It may be less expensive for the vendor but relying on a “trusted 3rd party” for your security is a foundational vulnerability that has been proven to be disastrous for the customer. Firewalls, antivirus and network monitoring tools still have their place, but a shift must be taken to provide more independence between the owner of data and its protectors.

What Are Sources Of Iran's Financing Of Terrorist Groups? – OpEd

Mohammad Reza Naghdi, deputy coordinator of the IRGC, admitted that Iran has spent billions of dollars in the region over the past 30 years, in an interview with “Studio Negah Yek”, of the first channel of Iranian TV.

Of course, the IRGC's budget and its financial aid to its allied forces in the region is not clear, but the main income of the IRGC, in addition to its dedicated official budget by the government, is provided from both domestic and foreign sources. The IRGC is currently involved in all economic and financial affairs in Iran and is the owner or shareholder of the largest commercial and economic sectors of the country, while it is exempt

from paying taxes, and even the government does not supervise the IRGC's financial affairs.

The IRGC controls several berths in the Persian Gulf ports and exports and imports from these berths without customs control, including oil, so nobody is aware of the IRGC's revenue.

Recently, some Hezbollah and Hamas officials announced huge financial contributions from the IRGC to them. In his speech, Mohammad Reza Naghdi introduced these countries as Iran's strategic depth in the region.

In this interview, he spoke about the readiness of the "regional militias" and stated that they have "done great deeds so far." Of course, he did not comment on these "great deeds", but it is clear the major bombings in Saudi Arabia, Iraq and even Argentina are among them.

Recently, Mahmoud Al-Zahar, a senior Hamas figure, announced that Iran's financial aid was made by Qassem Soleimani, the commander of the Quds Force. Hezbollah leader, Hassan Nasrallah, also spoke about Iran's financial aid and the role of Qassem Soleimani in delivering it.

Political groups close to Iran, in Lebanon and the Gaza Strip, occasionally refer to "abundant Iranian aid" to justify to their people the IRGC meddling in their countries, but their words become a problem for the mullahs' regime when it reaches the Iranians.

Hassan Nasrallah said recently, to show the importance of Iran, in one of his speeches, "even our food and clothing money is provided by the Islamic Republic"; "As long as the Islamic Republic has money, we have money," he said of the US sanctions on Lebanese banks. This kind of talk has caused the Iranians, the majority of whom live below the poverty line, to take to the streets to address the

Iranian authorities with slogans such as "Leave Lebanon, think about us".

The mullahs, on the other hand, have no explanation to offer Iranian public opinion for such expenditures and so resort to violently suppressing any protest.

Recently, the speeches of a representative of the Hamas government and the Secretary General of the Lebanese Hezbollah on the anniversary of the killing of Qassem Soleimani, the commander of the Quds Force, once again caused controversy.

In an interview, Mahmoud Al-Zahar said, "Qassem Soleimani had paid \$22 million to Hamas."

Al-Zahar, the former foreign minister and senior member of the Hamas leadership, told Al-Alam, Iran's state-run Arabic-language network, on Sunday, December 27, 2020, "In 2006, I explained to Qassem Soleimani in Tehran, 'the problem of staff salaries and social services and other assistances', of the people of Gaza, 'Haj Qassem immediately responded to our request, handing us \$ 22 million in cash in several suitcases the next day when we left Tehran.'"

According to Mohammad Javad Akbarin, a journalist writing in the Islamic Republic of Iran newspaper, Iran had given more than \$ 6 million to Hamas just in the previous seven months before donating those suitcases full of money.

Hezbollah's secretary general, Hassan Nasrallah, also said in a televised interview that Qassem Soleimani "behind the scenes and out of sight" provided significant financial assistance to certain Lebanese people in addition to providing missiles and military equipment.

In an interview with Al-Mayadin, Nasrallah said that, at that time "Iran's financial situation was better than now, and oil prices were higher, and Soleimani gave the owners of 200,000 homes destroyed in the 33-day war with Israel, one-year rent and living expenses to rebuild their houses."

The Chinese Xinhua news agency reported in May 2019 that Iran had distributed \$651,000 to Palestinian families in Gaza during a Quds Day ceremony in Gaza.

According to Abu Eida, the head of the "Committee of Martyrs" in Gaza, the Islamic Republic provided \$2 million to Hamas in November 2018 alone, which he said was "a small amount compared to previous years."

These figures on Qassem Soleimani's "aid" to Hamas and Hezbollah are published, while it is not clear what exactly is his or the IRGC's source for such generosity.

Given that Iran, in addition to paying the salaries of its army and IRGC personnel, has spent a lot of money on industries, such as nuclear, missile and submarine, during these years, spends millions of dollars for the military presence of its forces in Iraq, Syria and Yemen and pays more millions of dollars to its proxy groups in various countries. Iran's military budget does not appear to cover all these costs, and Qassem Soleimani may have used other informal sources of funding.

The Iranian regime, via its Quds Force, over the past forty years also gained influence over the Lebanese who emigrated to Latin America many years ago. This minority is accused of involvement in drug trafficking and money laundering.

The CIA claims that Latin America is one of the most important money laundering centers of the Quds Force and part of the proceeds of drug trafficking are transferred to Hezbollah.

Hezbollah of Lebanon also made news headlines for drug trafficking in Italy in recent times. Italian media reported a couple weeks ago that a shipment of more than \$1 billion worth of amphetamine pills discovered in June 2020 belonged to Lebanese Hezbollah.

The US Treasury Department said in a statement eight years ago that it had obtained evidence that Gholamreza Baghbani, a senior commander in the Quds Force, was allowing Afghan smugglers to send their drugs across Iran to European countries. In return he used them to deliver weapons and ammunition to Taliban forces in Afghanistan.

It seems that the IRGC and its affiliated forces, including the Lebanese Hezbollah, despite their idealistic slogans, do not shy away from anything, and the income from this drug related work probably goes a long way towards the

Quds Force being able to cover the massive expenses of its interventions in other countries.

But pro-Kremlin lawmakers jumped on the unrest.

"The United States certainly cannot now impose electoral standards on other countries and claim to be the world's 'beacon of democracy'," the foreign affairs chief in the lower house, Leonid Slutsky, told Russian news agencies.

He said Washington was suffering after having promoted "color revolutions" around the world, like anti-Moscow uprisings in Ukraine and Georgia and the recent protests in Belarus.

"The boomerang of the colour revolutions is turning back on the United States," Slutsky said. "All this threatens to turn into a crisis in the American system of power."

'Extremists' jibe

Others appeared to use the events to justify Moscow's domestic policies.

Anton Gorelkin, a lawmaker on the lower house telecommunications committee, praised Twitter and Facebook for suspending Trump's accounts, saying it showed the need to better control social media.

"Social networks must work under strict rules within a legal framework. Because absolute freedom of information is becoming a weapon in the hands of extremists," he said in a post on his Telegram channel.

The United States and other Western countries have repeatedly condemned Russia for moves to tighten controls on social media.

Washington has been a fierce critic of moves by Putin to clamp down on dissent, most recently accusing Russia of "intensifying repression of its civil society" with a new law last month expanding rules against NGOs and media considered foreign agents.

Moscow says the United States cynically uses such claims to pursue its agenda and maintain its global position.

Tensions between the Cold War-era rivals have hit new highs in recent years, with a raft of U.S. sanctions imposed on Russian officials, disputes over arms control treaties and American accusations of major Russian hacking attacks.

As part of the agreement, Israir will dry lease EAT's Full-Flight Simulators at the training facility located in Abu Dhabi. The training will be conducted by Israir instructors at the Etihad training facility. Captain Paolo La Cava, Managing Director Etihad Aviation Training, said: "Continuing our commitment to providing highly skilled pilots by offering state-of-the-art training facilities, EAT is looking forward to working with Israir Airlines and is anticipating further collaboration with the airline to cement this landmark agreement."

[Blackstone, Gates Team Up for Signature Aviation Bid as Carlyle Circles](#)

Blackstone won over Signature Aviation's biggest shareholder Bill Gates for a possible \$4.3 billion bid for the British private jet servicing company, going head-to-head with another potential suitor Carlyle. Blackstone's agreement with Gates' Cascade Investment Llc for its planned offer announced on Friday comes just hours after Signature confirmed an initial takeover approach from Carlyle. Blackstone and Cascade, which already owns a 19% stake in London-based Signature, are in advanced talks with the company about their proposal that involves a cash offer of 3.81 pounds per share. The company said last month it was minded to recommend the Blackstone proposal.

[Aviation Bosses Demand End to Quarantine After Introduction of Mandatory Testing](#)

The aviation industry has called for the government to scrap its quarantine regime following the introduction of a mandatory testing regime. Under the new rules, which kick in next week, all international arrivals, including UK nationals, will be required to present a negative coronavirus test taken up to 72 hours prior to departure. The airline industry welcomed the development, but said that the government should use the new system to get rid of the quarantine regime for good. Heathrow Airport chief exec John Holland-Kaye said: "There needs to be a plan for what's going to come next so that we can start to get aviation back to some level of normality while keeping people safe. What we'd like to see is that testing before you take off becomes the standard as an alternative to quarantine."

MARITIME

[Albanian PM in Athens with Maritime Zones on Agenda](#)

Albanian Prime Minister Edi Rama will hold informal meetings Friday with his Greek counterpart Kyriakos Mitsotakis and Foreign Minister Nikos Dendias during a private visit to Athens against the backdrop of the agreement between the two countries for recourse to the International Court of Justice in The Hague for the delimitation of their maritime zones. The issue is also connected with Albania's European aspirations. Rama and Dendias had met during the latter's visit to Tirana, where it was agreed to refer the dispute over maritime zones to The Hague. However, the move requires the two sides to sign a formal statement of intent, which has not yet been done.

[GDF, US Coast Guard to Conduct Exercises Offshore Guyana This Weekend](#)

The Guyana Defense Force (GDF) and the United States of America (USA) Coast Guard are expected to commence their first joint service operation tomorrow to combat illegal fishing activities in local waters. According to a GDF press release, on Saturday, the GDF and US Coast Guard will engage in their first series of activities, stemming from the Shiprider Agreement that was signed last September by the two countries. The agreement allows the US Coast Guard to patrol local waters along with the GDF coast guard to combat illicit activities. The US Coast Guard will be using its Cutter Stone vessel, one of its newest, to conduct the joint service patrol.

[United Overseas Group to Acquire United Arab Chemical Carriers](#)

01/07/2021

Investment company United Overseas Group (UOG) is to acquire Dubai-based shipping company United Arab Chemical Carriers (UACC), the two companies said on Thursday. The deal is subject to regulatory approvals and is expected to close in the first quarter, they said in a statement, without disclosing the value. The sale of UACC, whose shareholders include the sovereign wealth funds of Saudi Arabia and Qatar, was held up in 2017 after a bitter diplomatic rift broke between the Gulf Arab states. A source close to the deal said political differences among UACC's shareholders had not been a recent obstacle to the sale. Instead, shareholders had sought an all cash transaction, declining offers involving share swaps, the source said.

RAIL / TRANSIT

[China Cancels Democratic Republic of Congo Loans as It Joins Belt and Road](#)

China has cancelled the Democratic Republic of Congo's interest-free loans that matured in 2020 and promised to fund infrastructure projects as the Central African

nation joined the Belt and Road Initiative. Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi said Beijing would write off loans to DRC worth an estimated US\$28 million to help the country overcome the impact of Covid-19, and give US\$17 million in other financial support. On Wednesday, DRC became the 45th country to join the belt and road, President Xi Jinping's pet trade and infrastructure development plan, which has funded construction of highways, railways and power plants across Africa.

[Hyundai Says in Early Talks with Apple After Electric Vehicle Tie-Up Report](#)

01/08/2021

South Korea's Hyundai Motor Co said it was in early talks with Apple, after local media reported the firms were discussing an electric car and battery tie-up, sending Hyundai shares surging 25%. The report comes weeks after Reuters reported that Apple was moving forward with self-driving car technology and was aiming to produce a passenger vehicle that could include its own breakthrough battery technology as early as 2024. Earlier on Friday, Korea Economic Daily TV said the iPhone maker and Hyundai were in discussions to develop self-driving electric vehicles by 2027 and develop batteries at U.S. factories operated by either Hyundai or its affiliate Kia Motors Corp. Apple and Hyundai are in discussion, but as it is early stage, nothing has been decided.

[Azerbaijani Gas Reaches Italy Through New Pipeline](#)

01/08/2021

Azerbaijani gas has reached Italy through the Trans Adriatic Gas Pipeline (TAP), Turkish Foreign Ministry said on Friday. "Southern Gas Corridor has become operational," the ministry said on Twitter. "A new chapter has been opened in Turkey's contribution to energy supply security of the rest of Europe," it added. TAP transports natural gas from the Shah Deniz field in the Azerbaijan sector of the Caspian Sea to Europe. The last segment and the European leg of the Southern Gas Corridor, TAP was completed in October 2019 after a construction period of four and half years. The \$40 billion value chain of the Southern Gas Corridor includes the South Caucasus Pipeline, the Trans-Anatolian Natural Gas Pipeline (TANAP) and TAP.

COMMERCIAL USE OF SPACE

[Space Development Agency Contracts to Build Missile-Warning Satellites](#)

01/07/2021

Following a series of contract protests, the Space Development Agency again awarded SpaceX a \$149 million contract and L3Harris a \$193.5 million contract to each build four satellites to detect and track ballistic and hypersonic missiles. The contracts to both companies were originally awarded Oct. 5 but work had to be stopped after competitors Airbus and Raytheon filed protests with the Government Accountability

Office challenging the awards. Space Development Agency spokeswoman Jennifer Elzea said in a statement Jan. 7 that work on the eight satellites, known as Tracking Layer Tranche 0, recommenced Dec. 28 when a temporary stop-work order was lifted. The Space Development Agency is planning to launch Tranche 0 satellites in late 2022.

TERRORISM / EXTREMISM

[Pakistan Anti-Terror Court Jails Mumbai Attack Mastermind Lakhvi](#)

01/08/2021

A Pakistani court on Friday sentenced Zakiur Rehman Lakhvi, the globally designated terrorist leader of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and mastermind of Mumbai attack, to three prison terms of five years each over terror financing. The sentences, under three sections of Anti-Terrorism Act, will run concurrently. The court on Friday announced its verdict after recording the statements of all witnesses in the case. India accuses Lakhvi of masterminding the 26/11 attacks of November, 2008 in Mumbai that killed 166 people. He was arrested by Pakistan in 2008 but later released on bail. Pakistan claims that India didn't provide concrete evidence to convict Lakhvi.

[Bomb Kills 4 Soldiers, One Civilian in Cameroon](#)

01/07/2021

Four soldiers and a civilian were killed Wednesday when an official convoy was hit by makeshift explosives in a restive English-speaking region of Cameroon, the government said. A government spokesman blamed "separatist terrorists" for the killings in the Northwest province, where Anglophone separatists are fighting for independence. The official whose convoy was apparently targeted was unhurt, spokesman Rene Emmanuel Sadi said in a statement. In Anglophone Cameroon, the army and separatist groups have been fighting each other for three years.

CYBER

[Hackney Council Stolen Data Published on Dark Web Forum](#)

01/08/2021

Cyber criminals who launched a ransomware attack on Hackney Borough Council in October have published on a dark web forum what they claim to be documents from the council. Operators of Pysa (or Mespinoza) ransomware said they were behind the cyber-attack which disrupted the Council's online services and left many of its systems inoperable four months ago. In a statement on its website, the Council said that only a 'limited set' of data has been released which is easily findable. Some media reports claimed that the data dump appears to contain a large amount of sensitive information, including passport data, staff data, photo IDs, scans of tenancy audit documents for public housing tenants, and information on community safety.

[Iran's Revolutionary Guards Unveil Underground Missile Base in Gulf](#)

Iran's elite Revolutionary Guards unveiled an underground missile base at an undisclosed Gulf location on Friday, Iranian state media reported, at a time of heightened tension between Tehran and the United States. Last year, the Guards said Iran had built underground "missile cities" along the Gulf coastline, warning of a "nightmare for Iran's enemies." "The base is one of several bases housing the Guards' Navy's strategic missiles," the state media quoted the head of the Guards, Major General Hossein Salami, as saying.

[Chinese Embassy Tweet About Uighurs Draws Instant Condemnation](#)

In a new state media report, the Chinese government is defending its policies against Muslim women in the country's westernmost province, where it's been accused of forced mass sterilization -- a horrific crime it strongly denies. In a tweet Thursday, the Chinese Embassy in the U.S. shared the report, saying that Muslim women in Xinjiang province are "no longer baby-making machines" and that the decrease in population growth throughout the province led to a drop in terrorism. The tweet garnered instead blowback and calls for Twitter to remove it, given the Chinese government's oppressive campaign against Uighurs and other Muslim ethnic minorities.

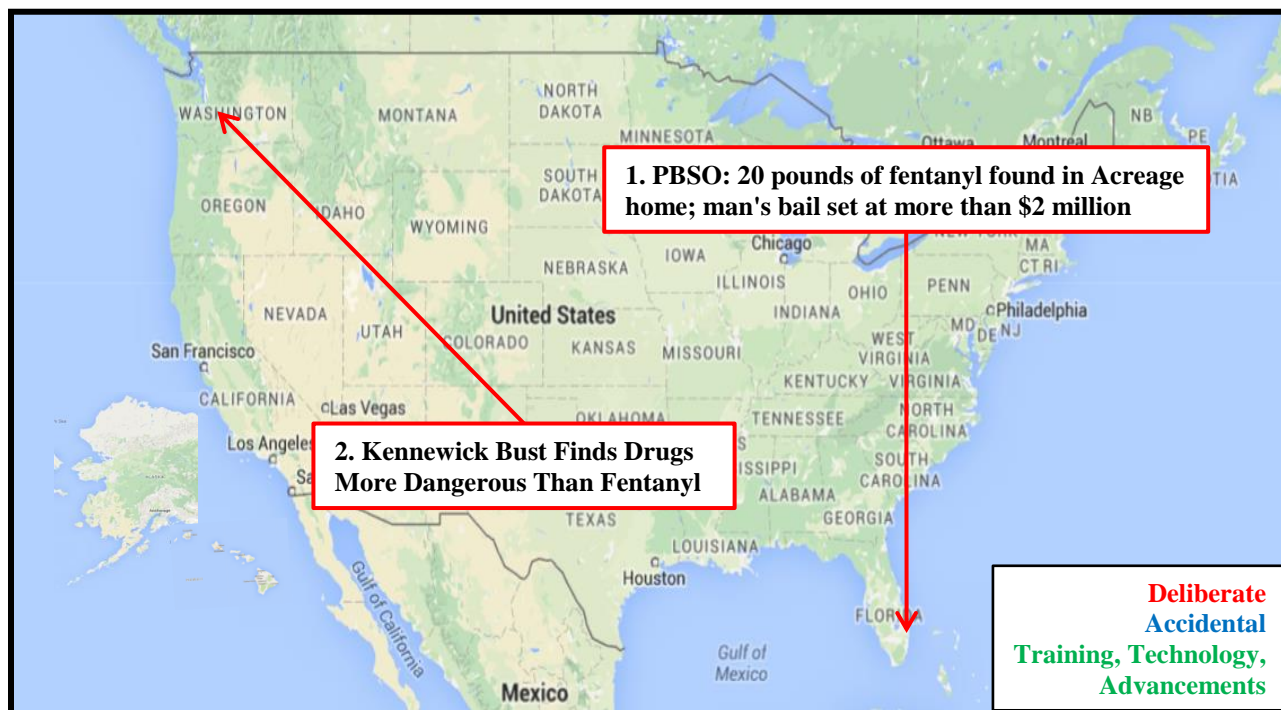
[Kim Jong Un Shows Intention to Expand Diplomacy](#)

North Korea's state-run television says that leader Kim Jong Un has laid out the direction for developing the country's diplomatic relations in a policy speech he gave at the ongoing ruling Workers' Party congress. Korean Central Television reported on Friday that Kim commented on reviewing inter-Korean ties in the speech delivered on Thursday, the third day of the congress. It reported Kim raised the issue of reshaping South Korean relations "as required by the prevailing situation and the changed times." 1. PBSO: 20 pounds of fentanyl found in Acreage home; man's bail set at more than \$2 million.

January 6, 2021 (The Palm Beach Post). Acreage, Florida. What started with a search warrant at a storage unit near Royal Palm Beach led to the arrest of a 38-year-old man for allegedly trafficking drugs he kept at the facility and in his Acreage home, according to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office [PBSO]. On Monday, agents went to Cubesmart storage on Belvedere Road near State Road 7, where they found thousands of oxycodone pills, a pill press, plastic bags and other drugs, including cocaine, bath salts, ecstasy and 28 pounds of methamphetamines. From there, investigators made their way to his Acreage home on Tangerine Boulevard, where they waited until he returned. After getting a search warrant, they found several other drugs and related items throughout the house. In the kitchen, they found a black pistol, rubber gloves and a respirator mask that investigators say is typically used when working with chemicals, and a detector used to find "bugs," or surveillance equipment. PBSO did not disclose how it came to identify Henry's storage unit for possible drug trafficking other than **a receipt for the unit that investigators found during a "trash pull"** from his home Dec. 29. It's unclear how long they had been monitoring Henry for alleged drug activity.

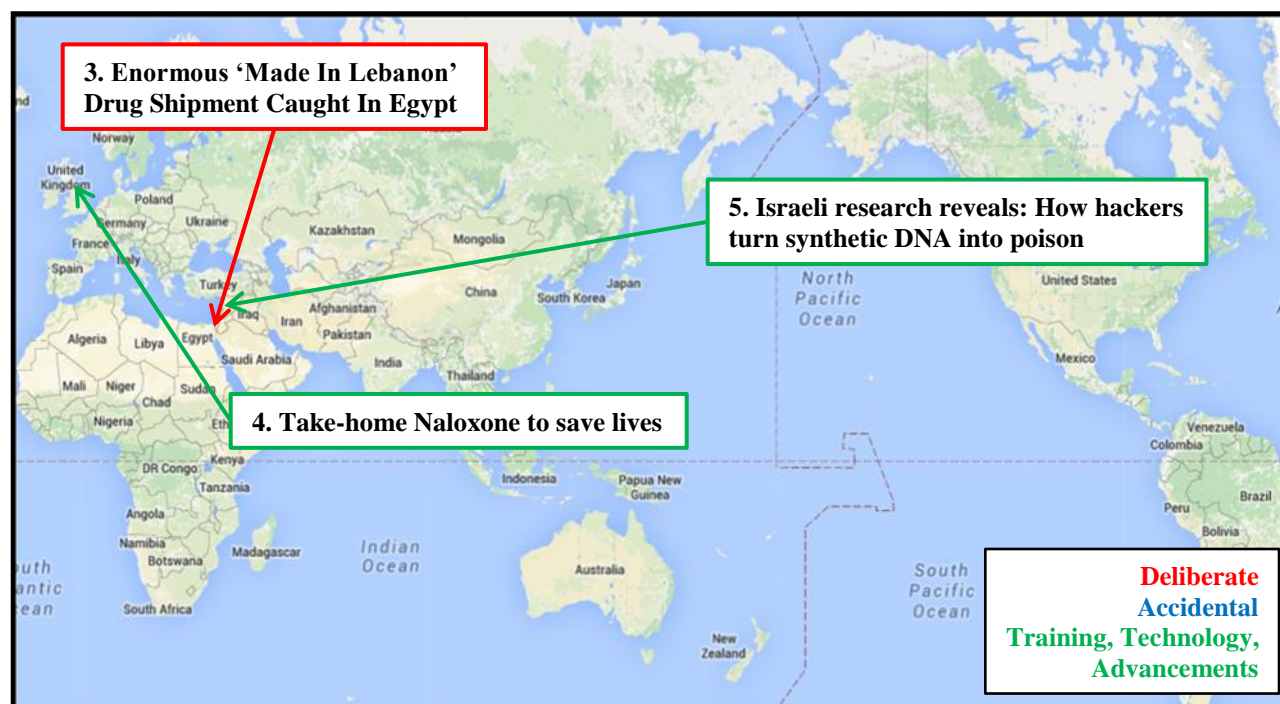

2. Kennewick Bust Finds Drugs More Dangerous Than Fentanyl. January 6, 2021 (KFLD News Talk). Kennewick, WA. On December 27th Kennewick Police responded to the Comfort Inn and Suites on Plaza Way, for a report of people using drugs in one of the rooms. 31-year-old Jeremy Barwick was

one of the suspects, he tried to run but was apprehended. A vehicle linked to him was located and impounded for investigative purposes. Wednesday January 6th Police announced they had confiscated about **1000 suspected carfentanil pills**, along with smaller amounts of other drugs and U.S. currency.

3. Enormous ‘Made In Lebanon’ Drug Shipment Caught In Egypt. January 6, 2021 (The 961). Lebanon was revealed to be the origin of a massive drug shipment, involving 8.22 tons of hashish and more than 8 million captagon tablets, recently busted in Egypt. The drugs were found in a shipment that recently reached Egypt’s Port Said, which was only supposed to be a transit point in its path toward Khoms, Libya, the intended final destination. The container was loaded on December 19th, 2020, in a warehouse belonging to the exporting company in Lebanon, before being sent to the Port of Beirut. The official said the drugs were likely manufactured in Syria and smuggled through illegal land routes toward the warehouse of the plastic fabrication company, which in turn packed the narcotic substances into boxes of its own, bearing the signature, “Made in Lebanon.” The street value of the busted drugs was estimated by the Egyptian Interior Ministry to be close to \$39 million.

4. Take-home Naloxone to save lives. January 6, 2021 (Scottish Government). Take-home Naloxone will be given to people at high risk of accidental overdoses, in a move designed to reduce the number of drug deaths. This will include those who have been resuscitated by the Scottish Ambulance Service (SAS) following an accidental overdose. SAS crews responded to around 5,000 incidents in which Naloxone, an opiate antidote, was administered in 2019. Providing take-home kits means friends and relatives of those at risk will be able to administer Naloxone themselves while the ambulance is on its

way, further reducing the chance of a fatality. The kits will be supplied at incidents after 999 has been called for a person experiencing an accidental overdose. Those at risk of witnessing a future opiate overdose, such as family and care groups, will be given a kit and training in how to administer it.

5. Israeli research reveals: How hackers turn synthetic DNA into poison. January 6, 2021 (Geektime). According to the [Ben Gurion University research team's findings](#), a vulnerability in a U.S. Department of Health's protocol could lead synthetic DNA manufacturers to be exposed to cyber-attacks. The vulnerability made it possible to bypass strict filtering processes and further complicate the security software's ability to identify the harmful DNA sequence. The team, led by Dr. Rami Puzis from the Software and Systems Engineering Department, added that the vulnerability they discovered, comprised of numerous DNA reliability failures, can enable cyber-attacks. A poisonous DNA is injected into a routine shipment. This kind of new threat demonstrates how malicious code can disrupt biological processes. Puzis further adds that from trials performed by his team showed that 16 out of 50 malicious DNA sequences were left undiscovered based on U.S. screening policies: "This attack scenario highlights the need to strengthen the synthetic DNA supply chain with security measures to prevent bio-cyber attacks. In order to tackle these threats, we provide an improved filtering algorithm, which takes into account the availability of genetic editing tools and gene shuffle." <https://www.geektime.com/israeli-research-reveals-how-hackers-turn-synthetic-dna-into-poison/>

BOSTON – A Chinese national was sentenced today in federal court in Boston for making false statements in connection with his theft of 19 vials of biological research. Zaosong Zheng, 31, was sentenced by U.S. District Court Judge Denise J. Casper to time served (approximately 87 days), three years of supervised release and ordered removed from the United States. In December 2020, Zheng pleaded guilty to one count of making false, fictitious or fraudulent statements. Zheng was arrested on Dec. 10, 2019, at Boston's Logan International Airport and charged by criminal complaint. In August 2018, Zheng entered the United States on a J-1 visa and conducted cancer-cell research at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in Boston from Sept. 4, 2018 to Dec. 9, 2019. On Dec. 9, 2019, Zheng stole vials of biological research, hid the vials in his luggage, and attempted to take them out of the United States aboard a flight destined for China. Federal officers at Logan Airport discovered the vials hidden in a sock inside one of Zheng's bags, and not properly packaged. When asked by federal officers whether he was traveling with any biological items or research, Zheng lied and answered "no." Zheng later admitted he had stolen the vials from a lab at Beth Israel. Zheng stated that he intended to bring the vials to China to use them to conduct research in his own laboratory and publish the results under his own name...

The attack on the Capitol was "unlike any I have ever experienced in my 30 years in law enforcement here in Washington, D.C.," said Sund, a former city police officer. "Make no mistake: these mass riots were not First Amendment activities; they were criminal riotous behavior. The actions of the USCP officers were heroic given the situation they faced." Sund's statement came after lawmakers from both parties vowed an investigation into how law enforcement handled Wednesday's violent breach at the Capitol, questioning whether a lack of preparedness allowed a mob to occupy and vandalize the building...

The bureau is still examining evidence and has not announced any conclusions, but investigators are known to be reviewing whether Anthony Warner believed in conspiracy theories involving aliens and 5G cellphone technology. Warner died in the Christmas Day explosion of a recreational vehicle that also wounded three other people. "When we assess an event for domestic terrorism nexus, it has to be tied to an ideology. It's the use of force or violence in the furtherance of a political or social ideology or event. We haven't tied that yet," Doug Korneski, the FBI agent in charge of the agency's Memphis office, told reporters last week at a news conference...

A federal judge upheld a Manhattan jury's conviction of a Bangladeshi immigrant for blowing up a pipe bomb in a crowded subway tunnel in Times Square, according to a decision released Monday. Lawyers for Akayed Ullah, 30, had challenged the 2018 guilty verdict on several grounds — including claiming that their client had not acted on behalf of ISIS when he detonated the crude explosive that injured only himself. But Circuit Judge Richard Sullivan, who presided over the Manhattan federal trial before he was promoted to the appeals court, knocked down the assertion. "The record evidence...amply establishes that Defendant acted at ISIS's direction by heeding the call of the organization's propaganda and recruiting materials," Sullivan wrote of the bungled Dec. 11, 2017, terrorist attack in a pedestrian tunnel during the morning rush hour. "Perhaps most importantly, Defendant told police that he carried out the attack 'for the Islamic State.'..."

There is no indication classified systems were affected, Mr. Raimondi said, as the department classified the breach as a major incident requiring notification to other agencies and Congress. Even unclassified email accounts, though, can contain sensitive information about investigations and potentially national security related issues, said Chris Painter, a former senior official at the Justice and State departments who worked on cybersecurity issues. “A lot of DOJ work happens on unclassified systems.”...

The funds are the United States' share of a civil forfeiture investigation that is part of the government's pursuit of a complex international conspiracy which spanned the globe. The conspiracy's purpose was to violate the United States imposed international economic sanctions regime on Iran and included several Iranian nationals and others, who fraudulently transferred approximately \$1 billion worth of Iranian-owned funds to accounts around the world... The majority of UBAF's violations occurred in late 2011 following an executive order that significantly expanded U.S. sanctions against Syria, and pertained to the processing of internal transfers on behalf of Syrian entities that were followed by corresponding funds transfers through a U.S. bank, OFAC said. UBAF ultimately processed 127 transactions, totaling \$2.08 billion, in apparent violation of the executive order, according to OFAC...

21. Money Laundering Watchdog Turns Focus to Digital Tools, Extremism

The coronavirus halted a wide range of economic activities, but it hasn't stopped criminals from using the global financial system to commit fraud and engage in other types of illicit behavior. Yet the pandemic has forced some countries to divert resources away from fighting money laundering and made it harder for compliance officers in the private sector to detect it, according to the Financial Action Task Force. The organization, which sets international standards and assesses countries' anti-money-laundering and counterterrorism-financing policies, has been closely monitoring the impact of the pandemic on its global network, says Marcus Pleyer, FATF's president. Mr. Pleyer began a two-year term as FATF's head in July, about two months after the organization released its first report on the AML and CTF risks posed by the pandemic. In an interview with Risk & Compliance Journal, Mr. Pleyer discussed FATF's priorities under his presidency. Edited excerpts follow...

A Bangladeshi national formerly residing in Monterrey, Mexico, was sentenced to 46 months in prison followed by three years of supervised release for his role in a scheme to smuggle aliens from Mexico into the United States. According to the plea agreement, Moktar Hossain admitted that from March 2017 to August 2018, he conspired to bring, and did bring, Bangladeshi nationals to the United States at the Texas border in exchange for payment. Hossain operated out of Monterrey, Mexico, where he maintained a hotel that housed aliens on their way to the United States. Hossain paid drivers to transport the aliens to the U.S. border, and gave the aliens instructions on how to cross the Rio Grande river...

The Libyan man who stabbed three people to death in a Reading park last June, in what prosecutors claim was a terrorist attack, was befriended by the notorious hate preacher Omar Brooks while in prison, it has emerged. Khairi Saadallah, who was granted asylum in Britain despite committing a string of criminal offences, became close to Brooks when they were both being held at HMP Bullingdon in 2017. The 26-year-old was described as being "ruthlessly efficient" when he went on the rampage in Forbury Gardens in Reading on the evening of June 20 last year, stabbing to death James Furlong, 36, David Wails, 49, and Joseph Ritchie-Bennett, 39. He also stabbed Stephen Young, Patrick Edwards and Nishit Nisudan, causing them significant injuries. Saadallah has admitted murdering three people and attempting to kill three more in the attack, but has denied he was motivated by a religious ideology...

24. North Macedonia Arrests Eight Men Suspected Of Creating Terrorist Organization

One of the suspects had a previous conviction of participation in the Islamic State group. The eight have been charged with

creating a terrorist organization based on the ideology of Islamic State “for committing murders and destroying public buildings” and with the aim of creating fear or insecurity among the public...

25. South Korea Pushes Iran to Release Seized Oil Tanker

South Korea is mounting a diplomatic effort to free an oil tanker seized by Iran amid a dispute over frozen bank funds, the latest flare-up of tensions between Tehran and a U.S. ally. A South Korean delegation arrived in Tehran on Thursday, three days after the 9,797-ton oil tanker Hankuk Chemi and its 20 crew members were detained. The delegation is expected to lay the groundwork for a visit to Iran on Sunday by the country's vice foreign minister, according to the South Korean Foreign Ministry. The tanker seizure coincides with rising international tensions between Iran and U.S. allies over the nation's potential links to commercial shipping disruptions, progress toward a possible nuclear weapon and alleged cyberattacks. Tehran said the ship flouted environmental regulations, but Seoul disputes the claim. The tanker's most recent inspection during a 2019 port visit in China showed no environmental violations and just minor safety breaches, according to the European Union's shipping database, Equasis...

Iranian Foreign Ministry spokesman Saeed Khatibzadeh said talks aren't likely to begin before the South Korean vice foreign minister arrives, and called the detainment a technical issue that's “being processed within its professional and judicial framework.”...

26. 100 Civilians Are Reported Dead After Attacks in Niger

The court in the southern city of Karachi ruled that Omar Sheikh be freed from a temporary detention order that had kept him in jail since the same court overturned his conviction in April. The court also directed Thursday that he can't be detained again without its permission, the judgment said. After Thursday's court ruling, it was unclear if Mr. Sheikh, a British national, would actually be set free. The Pakistani authorities have been legally fighting the release since the Karachi court in April set aside the death sentence handed down to Mr. Sheikh for terrorism, kidnapping for ransom, and murder, downgrading it to the lesser crime of kidnapping. As kidnapping carries a maximum of seven years in jail, and Mr. Sheikh had already been locked up for 18 years at that point, he was eligible for release...

He surrendered to the police earlier this month and faces up to six years in prison. The order dissolving the group said that its government registration had lapsed last year and that it was no longer a recognized organization. It is now banned from conducting activities and using its logo, a triangular symbol with a star at the center and its name in Indonesian and Arabic lettering...

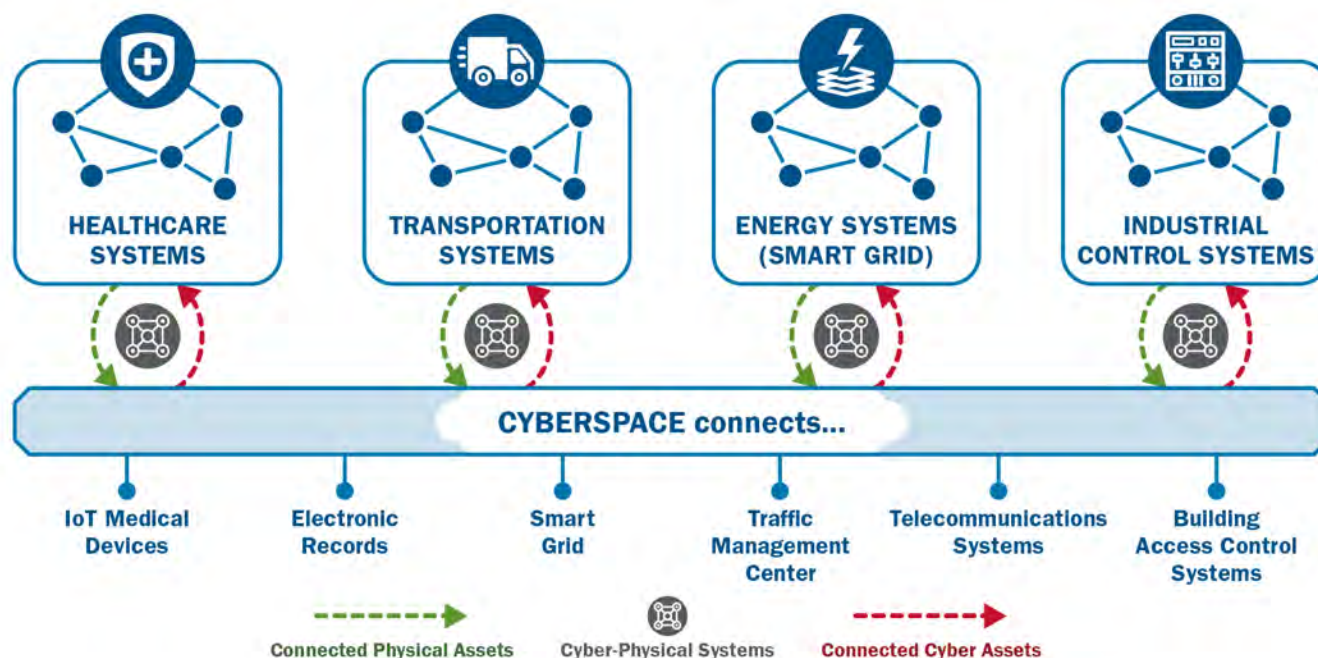

A CONNECTED OPERATING ENVIRONMENT

Today's threats are a result of hybrid attacks targeting both physical and cyber assets. The adoption and integration of Internet of Things (IoT) and Industrial Internet of Things (IIoT) devices have led to an increasingly interconnected mesh of cyber-physical systems (CPS), which expands the attack surface and blurs the once clear functions of cybersecurity and physical security. Meanwhile, efforts to build cyber resilience and accelerate the adoption of advanced technologies can also introduce or exacerbate security risks in this evolving threat landscape.

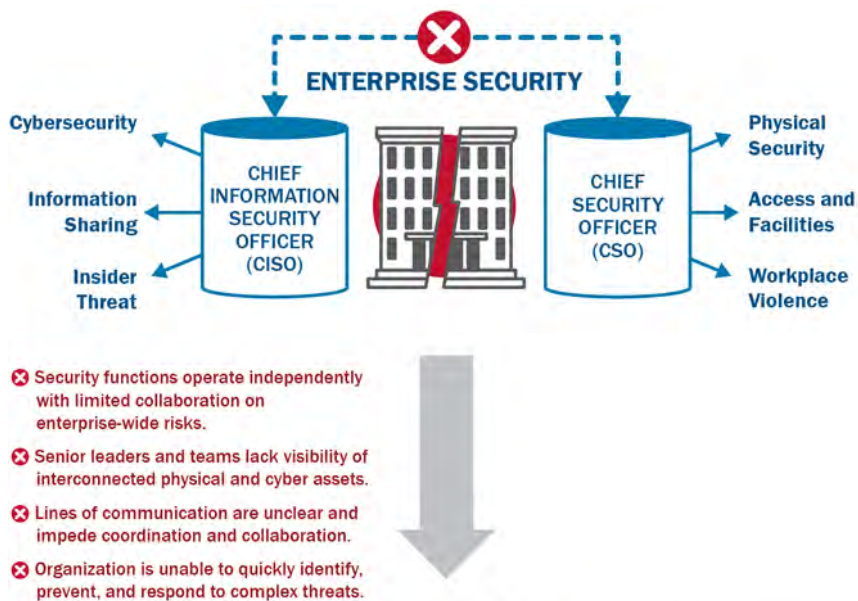


A successful cyber or physical attack on connected industrial control systems (ICS) and networks can disrupt operations or even deny critical services to society. For example:

- A security gap in access controls, such as unauthorized access to facilities or system permissions, can allow an individual to use a universal serial bus (USB) device or other removable hardware to introduce a virus or malware into a network.
- Heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems can be virtually overridden, causing a rise in temperature that renders network servers inoperable.
- A cyber-attack on telecommunications can impair communication with law enforcement and emergency services, resulting in delayed response times.
- An unmanned aircraft system (UAS) can compromise sensitive information by gaining access to an unsecured network using wireless hacking technology.
- A cyber-attack exploiting healthcare vulnerabilities can compromise sensitive data or cause a connected medical device to malfunction, resulting in injury or loss of life.

ORGANIZATIONAL CHALLENGE: SILOED SECURITY FUNCTIONS

Together, cyber and physical assets represent a significant amount of risk to physical security and cybersecurity—each can be targeted, separately or simultaneously, to result in compromised systems and/or infrastructure. Yet physical security and cybersecurity divisions are often still treated as separate entities. When security leaders operate in these siloes, they lack a holistic view of security threats targeting their enterprise. As a result, attacks are more likely to occur and can lead to impacts such as exposure of sensitive or proprietary information, economic damage, loss of life, and disruption of National Critical Functions (NCFs).¹



ORGANIZATIONAL SOLUTION: CONVERGED SECURITY FUNCTIONS

Convergence is formal collaboration between previously disjointed security functions. Organizations with converged cybersecurity and physical security functions are more resilient and better prepared to identify, prevent, mitigate, and respond to threats. Convergence also encourages information sharing and developing unified security policies across security divisions.



BENEFITS OF CONVERGENCE

An integrated threat management strategy reflects in-depth understanding of the cascading impacts to interconnected cyber-physical infrastructure. As rapidly evolving technology increasingly links physical and cyber assets—spanning sectors from energy and transportation to agriculture and healthcare—the benefits of converged security functions outweigh the challenges of organizational change efforts and enable a flexible, sustainable strategy anchored by shared security practices and goals:

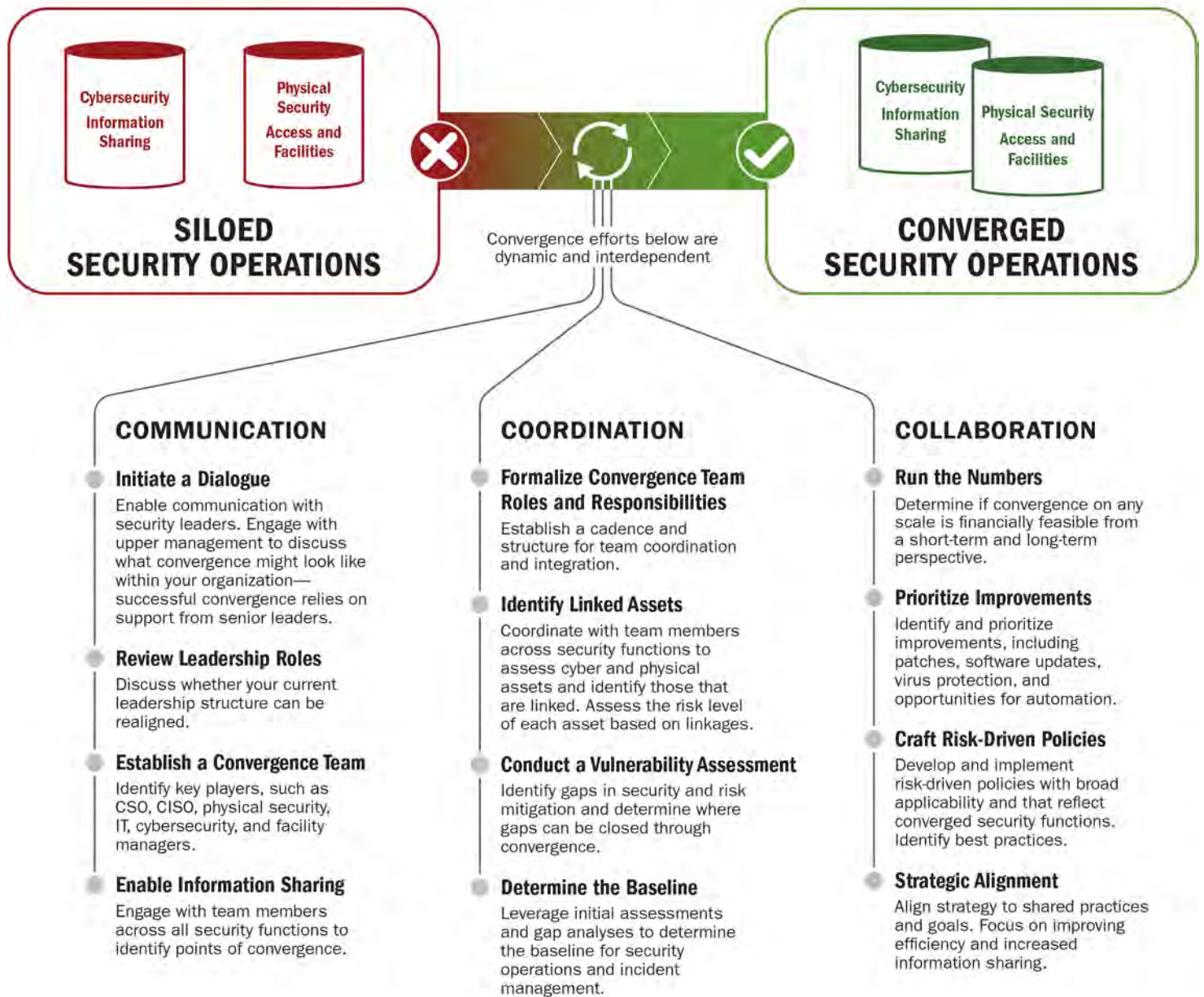

CONVERGENCE CASE STUDIES

Large Foreign Shipping Company, June 2017 – An indiscriminate state-sponsored cyber-attack unleashed a virus or “worm” that halted operations across hospitals, power companies, airports, banks, and government agencies and crippled the global shipping industry for more than a week. The virus was able to penetrate the network of the world’s largest container shipping company through a single computer operating outdated accounting software. Although not the primary target, the company’s global systems were quickly paralyzed, corrupting proprietary data and hampering communications. Maritime shipping ground to a halt as the outage isolated 76 ports and 800 vessels carrying millions of tons of cargo. The company’s own financial losses exceeded \$300 million and the ripple effects on global supply chains included impacts to the U.S. national security supply of vaccines. With total estimated costs in damages exceeding \$10 billion, this incident is regarded as one of the most devastating cyber-attacks in recent history.

Large U.S. Energy Company, January 2019 – The company observed an evolving threat landscape and a lack of formal collaboration between physical security and cybersecurity functions, hindering the development of a comprehensive threat management strategy. These siloed operations led to significant financial consequences when an internal probe revealed 127 security violations that ultimately cost the company millions, all stemming from non-compliant security practices and lack of collaboration across organizational units. In response, the company increased oversight; restructured roles; hosted discussion panels on best practices for security and compliance; added resources to manage and implement compliance and security efforts; and updated/enhanced systems to track access and vulnerabilities. As a result, the company saw an improvement in information sharing and collaboration, as well as rapid identification and mitigation of threats.

U.S. Power Grid Operator, March 2019 – One of the first attacks on the U.S. power system occurred when hackers exploited a firmware vulnerability and caused a grid operator’s firewalls to continuously reboot, leading to a brief communications outage. The attack led the North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) to issue a series of recommendations, including: applying best practices for vulnerability and patch management; minimizing Internet-facing devices; using virtual private networks (VPNs) and access control lists (ACLs); layering defenses; segmenting and monitoring networks; identifying exploitable vulnerabilities; and employing redundant solutions.

IoT Devices Impacted by Ripple20 Vulnerabilities, June 2020 – A group of 19 vulnerabilities known as Ripple20 impacted millions of connected devices, including smart home devices, power grid equipment, healthcare systems, industrial gear, transportation systems, mobile/satellite communications equipment, and commercial aircraft devices. These high-risk vulnerabilities in critical IoT devices across numerous sectors could lead to compromised data and device malfunctions. In response, some vendors released their own recommendations to mitigate potential risks. The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) issued an alert on potential weaknesses that malicious actors could exploit and provided recommended mitigation approaches, including performing an impact analysis and risk assessment; minimizing network exposure for control system devices and systems; and ensuring access points are updated to the latest software version. Security researchers have identified additional impacted vendors and devices since Ripple20 was initially discovered.

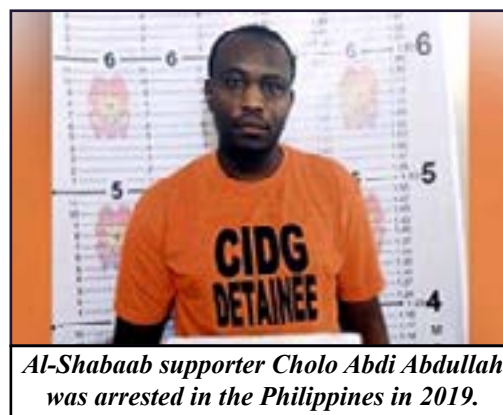

Foreign Terrorist Groups Direct Operatives to Attack US

Foreign terrorist organizations (FTOs) maintain the ability to train operatives to plot external operations in the United States while supporters and affiliates focus on regional conflicts. Since 2019, three FTOs have instructed and supported a foreign national to engage in preoperational planning to conduct an attack in the United States, resulting in one attacker killing three US sailors and wounding eight others before responding officers killed him.

- On December 15, the US Department of Justice charged Cholo Abdi Abdullah, a 30-year-old Kenyan national, with six counts of terrorism-related offenses for plotting to hijack an aircraft and conduct a 9/11-style attack in the United States. Senior leaders of al-Shabaab, a Salafi-jihadist group that supports al-Qa'ida in East Africa, directed Abdullah to obtain pilot training in 2016 in the Philippines and to test flaws in airport security. The group coined the operation, "Jerusalem will never be Judaized," referring to US support for Israel and its embassy moving from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem in May 2018. Abdullah was first arrested in the Philippines in July 2019 on local charges and remained in that country's custody until he was transferred to US law enforcement on December 15, 2020.
- In February, al-Qa'ida in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) released a video claiming responsibility for the attack at a Naval Air Station in Pensacola, Florida, in December 2019. Mohammed Saeed Alshamrani, an officer in the Saudi Air Force participating in a military training program at the base, killed three sailors and wounded eight others after legally purchasing a firearm. Law enforcement revealed in May that Alshamrani was radicalized as far back as 2015, directly associating with several AQAP operatives to plan an attack.
- In July 2019, Alexei Saab, a 42-year-old New Jersey resident, was arrested for his support of Hizballah. While living in the United States, Saab served as a Hizballah operative conducting surveillance of multiple targets in major cities to help the group plot potential future attacks. Prior to entering the United States in 2000 and becoming a naturalized citizen in 2008, Saab joined Hizballah in 1996 in Lebanon, where he observed and reported on the movements of Israeli troops.

WASHINGTON — The head of the U.S. Capitol Police will resign effective Jan. 16 following the breach of the Capitol by a pro-Trump mob.

Chief Steven Sund said Thursday that police had planned for a free speech demonstration and did not expect the violent attack. He said it was unlike anything he'd experienced in his 30 years in law enforcement.

He resigned Thursday after House Speaker Nancy Pelosi called on him to step down. His resignation was confirmed to The Associated Press by a person familiar with the matter who was not authorized to speak publicly.

The breach halted the effort by Congress to certify President-elect Joe Biden’s victory. Protesters stormed the building and occupied for hours. The lawmakers eventually returned and finished their work.

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Capitol Police says an officer who was injured after responding to riots at the Capitol has died.

Officer Brian D. Sicknick died Thursday due to injuries sustained while on-duty, physically engaging with protesters at the U.S. Capitol, the statement said.

Supporters of President Donald Trump stormed the Capitol on Wednesday as Congress was tallying the Electoral College votes to confirm Democrat Joe Biden won the election. Sicknick returned to his division office and collapsed, the report said. He was taken to a hospital and later died.

The death will be investigated by the Metropolitan Police Department's Homicide Branch, the USCP, and federal law enforcement. Sicknick joined the Capitol police in 2008.

Democratic leaders of the House Appropriations Committee said the "tragic loss" of a Capitol police officer "should remind all of us of the bravery of the law enforcement officers who protected us, our colleagues, Congressional staff, the press corps and other essential workers" during the hourslong takeover of the Capitol by pro-Trump protesters.

Bangladeshi National Sentenced for Conspiracy to Bring Aliens to the United States

A Bangladeshi national formerly residing in Monterrey, Mexico, was sentenced to 46 months in prison followed by three years of supervised release for his role in a scheme to smuggle aliens from Mexico into the United States.

According to the plea agreement, Moktar Hossain admitted that from March 2017 to August 2018, he conspired to bring, and did bring, Bangladeshi nationals to the United States at the Texas border in exchange for payment. Hossain operated out of Monterrey, Mexico, where he maintained a hotel that housed aliens on their way to the United States. Hossain paid drivers to transport the aliens to the U.S. border, and gave the aliens instructions on how to cross the Rio Grande river.

"The defendant was a key player in an organized smuggling network that operated for profit and preyed on Bangladeshi nationals who wanted to enter the United States illegally," said Acting Assistant Attorney General David P. Burns of the Justice Department's Criminal Division. "This sentence serves as a clear deterrent to participants of such transnational criminal organizations who seek to undermine the security of our borders by illegally facilitating the travel of foreigners into the United States for a financial gain."

"Border security and national security are one in the same," said U.S. Attorney Ryan K. Patrick for the Southern District of Texas. "We must know who is coming into the country, and we cannot allow unfiltered access. My office continues to work with all our partners executing this mission."

"The investigation, prosecution, and sentencing of Hossain is a result of HSI's expertise in transnational investigations and unique ability to coordinate investigative efforts across international boundaries with foreign counterparts," said Special Agent in Charge Shane Folden of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) San Antonio. "HSI will continue to work with our law enforcement partners both domestic and international to aggressively dismantle criminal travel networks that pose a threat to U.S. national security."

This case was investigated by HSI Laredo, with assistance from the HSI Human Smuggling Unit, HSI Monterrey, HSI Houston, HSI Calexico, U.S. Customs and Border Patrol, U.S. Border Patrol, and the U.S. Marshals Service. The investigation was conducted under the Extraterritorial Criminal Travel Strike Force (ECT) program, a joint partnership between the Justice Department's Criminal Division and HSI. The ECT program focuses on human smuggling networks that may present particular national security or public safety risks, or present grave humanitarian concerns. ECT has dedicated investigative, intelligence and prosecutorial resources. ECT coordinates and receives assistance from other U.S. government agencies and foreign law enforcement authorities.

This case was prosecuted by Trial Attorneys James Hepburn and Erin Cox of the Criminal Division's Human Rights and Special Prosecutions Section with assistance from the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Southern District of Texas.

Justice Department Announces Civil Investigation into Chemical Restraint Use at Two Nevada Juvenile Facilities

The Justice Department announced today that it has opened an investigation into the use of pepper spray at two juvenile correctional facilities run by the Nevada Juvenile Justice Services Agency: the Nevada Youth Training Center and the Summit View Youth Center. The investigation will examine whether staff at the two facilities use pepper spray in a manner that violates youth's rights under the Constitution.

The department has not reached any conclusions regarding the allegations in this matter. The investigation will be conducted under the Civil Rights of Institutionalized Persons Act (CRIPA) and the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act. Both statutes give the department the authority to investigate systemic violations of the constitutional rights of young people in juvenile detention and correctional facilities. The department's work has led to important reforms to protect the rights of young people housed in those facilities.

Pittsburgh Man Charged with Threatening Communications and Impeding FBI Investigation

PITTSBURGH – Khaled Miah, 27, a resident of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and former student at the University of Pittsburgh, has been charged by federal criminal complaint with one count of making interstate threatening communications, one count of influencing, impeding or retaliating against a Federal law enforcement officer, and one count of destruction of records in a federal investigation, United States Attorney Scott Brady announced today. Miah was arrested on Wednesday and made an initial appearance in U.S. District Court via video teleconference. A preliminary and detention hearing is scheduled for tomorrow, January 8, 2021, at 10 a.m., before Chief Magistrate Judge Cynthia Eddy.

"Khaled Miah's use of multiple Twitter accounts to threaten and harass federal law enforcement officers and their family members and to obstruct a federal investigation are clear violations of federal law," said U.S. Attorney Brady. "We will not hesitate to pursue and prosecute individuals who cross the line from interest to intimidation."

"This arrest is the culmination of a year-long investigation which included threatening federal law enforcement officers," said FBI Pittsburgh Special Agent in Charge Michael Christman. "Threatening online statements, whether directed to a federal officer or any other person, is not harmless activity. It is serious criminal activity with consequences. Threats against law enforcement officers are particularly egregious in that it interferes with our ability to protect the communities we are charged with serving. We should all understand that the First Amendment is not a license to threaten others with harm and that the FBI and our law enforcement partners will relentlessly pursue those who pose a threat to the community."

According to an affidavit filed in U.S. District Court in Pittsburgh, on or about December 27, 2020, Miah posted threats directed at individual FBI agents who were investigating him, as well as the FBI generally. In December 2020, FBI personnel identified a publicly visible Twitter account created by Miah. From the date of its creation to on or about January 1, 2021, Miah used this Twitter account to threaten, intimidate and harass FBI Pittsburgh Agents and the FBI. In addition, after posting the threatening statements, and with full knowledge of the FBI investigation into his conduct, Miah subsequently deleted those posts which impeded, obstructed, and influenced the FBI investigation.

Specifically, as referenced in the criminal complaint, among other statements, Miah posted the following statement on Twitter: "Currently eating pasta and watching videos of the second plane hit the south tower."

Based upon their lengthy investigation of Miah, the FBI assessed that by referring to watching "videos of the second plane hit the south tower," Miah was referring to the coordinated Al-Qaeda terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, at which time two commercial airplanes were hijacked and crashed into the North and South towers of the World Trade Center in New York City. As a result, the North and South towers ultimately burned and collapsed causing the deaths of more than 2900 people. Miah went on to state that "the deed will be done, at a time which is most opportunistic for me, chosen by myself."

Miah additionally commented on December 29, 2020, that the "zero hour" was approaching and posted the geographic location of FBI Headquarters in Washington, D.C. According to the criminal complaint affidavit, Miah also traveled to Washington, D.C., and was surveilled on at least 11 occasions in the immediate vicinity of the FBI headquarters building in Pittsburgh between November 1, 2020, and January 3, 2021.

The criminal complaint affidavit also details that, after seizing and searching Miah's electronic devices pursuant to a federal search warrant, FBI's forensic analysis revealed that Miah apparently idealized the Boston Marathon Bombers, Tamerlan and Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, and visited several landmarks in Massachusetts associated with the bombings, including where each of the two bombings took place, where the Tsarnaev brothers participated in a violent shootout with local police, and the gym where Tamerlan Tsarnaev previously trained in mixed martial arts.

Members of the FBI's Joint Terrorism Task Force who were directly involved in this investigation include: FBI, University of Pittsburgh Police Department, Pittsburgh Bureau of Police, Allegheny County Police Department, Allegheny County Port Authority Police, Pennsylvania State Police, Allegheny County Probation, and the Internal Revenue Service – Criminal Investigation.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Jessica Lieber Smolar and Soo C. Song of the Western District of Pennsylvania.

Charges pursuant to a criminal complaint are merely allegations, and the defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.

Predicted Heart Age Among Cancer Survivors — United States, 2013–2017

Approximately 15.5 million cancer survivors were alive in the United States in 2016 with expected growth to 26.1 million by 2040 (1). Cancer survivors are living longer because of advances in early detection and treatment, but face psychosocial, cognitive, financial, and physical challenges (1,2). Physical challenges include cardiovascular complications, partly because cancer and cardiovascular disease (CVD) share some cumulative risk factors including tobacco use, physical inactivity, obesity, poor diet, hypertension, diabetes, and dyslipidemia (3). In addition, many cancer treatments damage the heart, and some cancer types increase risk for developing CVD (4). The recognition and management of heart disease in cancer survivors has given rise to the discipline of cardio-oncology, which focuses on the cardiovascular health of this population (5). CVD risk has been previously estimated using prediction models, and studies suggest that physician-patient communication using predicted heart age rather than predicted 10-year risk has led to a more accurate perception of excess heart age, encouraged actions to adopt a healthy lifestyle, and improved modifiable CVD risk factors (6,7). Using the nonlaboratory-based Framingham Risk Score (FRS) to estimate 10-year risk for developing CVD, predicted heart age is estimated from the 10-year risk of CVD (predicted by age, sex, diabetes status, smoking status, systolic blood pressure, hypertension treatment status, and body mass index); it is the age of an otherwise healthy person with the same predicted risk, with all other risk factors included in the prediction model at the normal level (systolic blood pressure of 125 mmHg, no hypertension treatment, body mass index of 22.5, nonsmoker, and nondiabetic) (6). Using data from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), this study estimates predicted heart age, excess heart age (difference between predicted heart age and actual age), and racial/ethnic and sociodemographic disparities in predicted heart age among U.S. adult cancer survivors and noncancer participants aged 30–74 years using previously published methods (7). A total of 22,759 men and 46,294 women were cancer survivors

with a mean age of 48.7 and 48.3 years, respectively. The predicted heart age and excess heart age among cancer survivors were 57.2 and 8.5 years, respectively, for men and 54.8 and 6.5 years, respectively, for women, and varied by age, race/ethnicity, education and income. The use of predicted heart age by physicians to encourage cancer survivors to improve modifiable risk factors and make heart healthy choices, such as tobacco cessation, regular physical activity, and a healthy diet to maintain a healthy weight, can engage survivors in informed cancer care planning after diagnosis.

Data were drawn from the BRFSS 2013, 2015, and 2017 survey cycles because CVD-specific modules are conducted in odd-numbered years. CDC pooled results for those years to produce stable estimates. The median combined response rate

across states for each year was 45.9%, 47.2%, and 45.9%. The eligible sample included nonpregnant adults aged 30–74 years, who had no self-reported history of CVD, including coronary heart disease, myocardial infarction, and stroke. Among 1,362,270 BRFSS participants, the following were excluded: 337,836 participants outside the age range, 3,927 who were pregnant, 103,658 with self-reported CVD, and 70,453 with missing covariates for blood pressure prediction. Among the remaining 846,396 participants for the analysis, 69,053 (8.2%) were cancer survivors. Cancer survivors were defined as having answered “yes” to the question “(Ever told) you had any other type of cancer?” (i.e., excluding skin cancer) by a doctor, nurse, or health professional. Exclusions based on cancer type, which can be found in the cancer survivorship module (https://www.cdc.gov/brfss/questionnaires/pdf-ques/2017_BRFSS_Pub_Ques_508_tagged.pdf), were not made because the survey included that module for only 2017 and did not survey all states.

To account for the complex sampling design, CDC calculated estimates using weights and strata in SAS (version 9.4; SAS Institute) or SAS-callable SUDAAN (version 11.0; RTI International). Systolic blood pressure was calculated using a previously published method (8) with National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey 2011–2012, 2013–2014, and 2015–2016 cycles. Predicted heart age was capped with an upper limit of 100 years (6).

Age-adjusted weighted means, prevalences, and 95% confidence intervals were calculated for actual age, predicted heart age, and excess heart age. Prevalence of excess heart age of ≥ 5 years was calculated by age group, race/ethnicity, educational attainment, and annual household income stratified by sex and cancer-survivor status. Adjusted differences in predicted heart age for cancer-survivor versus noncancer status and racial/ethnic differences in predicted heart age for cancer survivors were calculated using multivariate linear regression. A t-test across all age groups was used to ascertain differences within categories, and pairwise t-tests were used for education, income, and race/ethnicity.

A total of 22,759 men and 46,294 women were cancer survivors, with mean ages of 48.7 and 48.3 years, respectively. The predicted heart age and excess heart age among cancer survivors were 57.2 and 8.5 years, respectively, for men and 54.8 and 6.5 years, respectively, for women. The prevalence of excess heart age ≥ 5 years was 52.4% for men and 43.6% for women. Among cancer survivors, groups with the highest average excess heart age were those in which persons were aged 60–74 years, were non-Hispanic Black, had less than a high school education, and had $< \$35,000$ annual household income (excess heart age range = 11.6–14.9 years for men and 9.8–14.0 years for women). Prevalence of excess heart age ≥ 5 years was highest for those aged 60–74 years among both men and women; excess heart age ≥ 5 years was 3.0 percentage points higher for men and

6.5 percentage points higher for women among cancer survivors than among noncancer participants (Table 1).

Among men, adjusted difference in excess heart age was higher among lower income cancer survivors and non-Hispanic Black cancer survivors than among noncancer participants. Among women, the adjusted difference in excess heart age decreased with age and was higher among lower education, lower income, non-Hispanic Black, and Hispanic cancer survivors than among noncancer participants (Table 2).

The difference in predicted heart age between Hispanic and non-Hispanic White cancer survivors was small and not

statistically significant for most subgroups, as opposed to a much larger and mostly statistically significant difference between Hispanic and non-Hispanic Black survivors. In addition, disparities were larger among female cancer survivors than among male cancer survivors. The adjusted difference in excess heart age between non-Hispanic Black and non-Hispanic White female cancer survivors increased with age, education level, and income (Table 3). Disparities between non-Hispanic Black and non-Hispanic White persons were greater for women (7.4 years) than for men (4.3 years). The largest differences in excess heart age between non-Hispanic

Summary

What is already known about this topic?

Cancer and cardiovascular disease (CVD) share long-term risk factors. Physician-patient communication using heart age has been effective in motivating patients to improve modifiable CVD risk factors.

What is added by this report?

The predicted heart age and excess heart age among cancer survivors were 57.2 and 8.5 years, respectively, for men and 54.8 and 6.5 years, respectively, for women, and varied by age, race/ethnicity, education, and income. The prevalence of excess heart age ≥ 5 years was higher among men, cancer survivors with lower income and lower educational attainment, and non-Hispanic Black cancer survivors, particularly women.

What are the implications for public health practice?

Health care providers should counsel cancer survivors about ways to reduce modifiable shared risk factors such as tobacco use, physical inactivity, poor diet, hypertension, and obesity that contribute to excess heart age.

with annual household income $> \$35,000$, the difference in excess heart age was 2.4 years higher than that among those with lesser income. Overall, excess heart age is similar among Hispanic and non-Hispanic White cancer survivors, and higher for non-Hispanic Black survivors (Table 3).

Discussion

In this study, both excess heart age and prevalence of excess heart age ≥ 5 years were higher among cancer survivors than among noncancer participants. Consistent with previous findings, the prevalence of excess heart age was larger among men than among women; however, racial disparities among women were larger than those among men (7).

This study also confirms previous findings that few adults meet ideal cardiovascular health metrics, such as not smoking, having normal body mass index, being physically active, eating a healthy diet, and having normal levels of total cholesterol and blood pressure, resulting in excess heart age ≥ 5 years (9). As cancer survivors live longer, more attention can be focused on modifiable risk factors that affect both cancer and CVD (1,2,5). In this study, the prevalence of excess heart age ≥ 5 years was higher among the following groups: men, cancer survivors with lower income and lower educational attainment, and non-Hispanic Black cancer survivors, particularly women. The findings indicate that wellness plans for all cancer survivors, and particularly the most affected groups, should include a focus on cardiovascular risk.

The findings in this report are subject to at least six limitations. First, BRFSS data are self-reported and thus are subject to recall and social desirability biases (10), which might underestimate predicted heart age in all persons. Second, the

predicted heart age calculation used model-estimated systolic blood pressure rather than measured systolic blood pressure, which might introduce bias in predicted heart age estimates (7). Third, the nonlaboratory-based FRS used in the study might overestimate predicted heart age compared with the laboratory-based FRS (7). Fourth, several lifestyle choices such as sodium consumption, physical activity, and diet are not included in the FRS heart age calculation (7). Physical activity and diet are specifically linked to both heart disease and cancer, and their exclusion is likely to cause underestimates of predicted heart age in cancer survivors. Fifth, specific risks for some cancer survivors such as cardiotoxic treatment are not considered in the model and are likely to result in further underestimates. Finally, the definition of cancer in this study was nonspecific and could result in misclassification of some study participants.

Adult cancer survivors aged 30–74 years had higher predicted heart age than did noncancer participants, and the degree of excess heart age varied by racial/ethnic and sociodemographic groups. Cancer survivors are living longer and are more likely to experience long-term side effects from therapy that require

treatment from multiple types of physicians (5). The management of cardiovascular complications and involvement of cardiologists in the integrated approach of cardio-oncology is becoming more important given the steady increase in cancer survival, and the literature suggests the use of a low threshold for referral to a cardio-oncologist or cardiologist (4,5). The use of predicted heart age by physicians to encourage cancer survivors to improve modifiable risk factors and make heart-healthy choices, such as tobacco cessation, regular physical activity, and a healthy diet to maintain a healthy weight, can engage survivors in informed cancer care planning after diagnosis. In addition, physicians can consider additional components and complications of cancer survivorship, such as mental, social, and financial issues, when formulating a survivorship plan. Cancer survivors might experience numerous macro-level challenges and barriers, which can be included in future analyses to determine potential effect on heart age. By determining and communicating predicted heart age of cancer survivors at a personal level, cancer care teams can provide education to prevent long-term cardiovascular complications and improve quality of life and heart outcomes for cancer survivors.

Time from Start of Quarantine to SARS-CoV-2 Positive Test Among Quarantined College and University Athletes — 17 States, June–October 2020

To safely resume sports, college and university athletic programs and regional athletic conferences created plans to mitigate transmission of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). Mitigation measures included physical distancing, universal masking, and maximizing outdoor activity during training; routine testing; 10-day isolation of persons with COVID-19; and 14-day quarantine of athletes identified as close contacts* of persons with confirmed COVID-19. Regional athletic conferences created testing and quarantine policies based on National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) guidance (1); testing policies varied by conference, school, and sport. To improve compliance with quarantine and reduce the personal and economic burden of quarantine adherence, the quarantine period has been reduced in several countries from 14 days to as few as 5 days with testing (2) or 10 days without testing (3). Data on quarantined athletes participating in NCAA sports were used to characterize COVID-19 exposures and assess the amount of time between quarantine start and first positive SARS-CoV-2 test result. Despite the potential risk for transmission from frequent, close contact associated with athletic activities (4), more athletes reported exposure to COVID-19 at social gatherings (40.7%) and from roommates (31.7%) than they did from exposures associated with athletic activities (12.7%). Among 1,830 quarantined athletes, 458 (25%) received positive reverse transcription–polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) test results during the 14-day quarantine, with a mean of 3.8 days from quarantine start (range = 0–14 days) until the positive test result. Among athletes who had not received a positive test result by quarantine day 5, the probability of having a positive test result decreased from 27% after day 5 to <5% after day 10. These findings support new guidance from CDC (5) in which different options are provided to shorten quarantine for persons such as collegiate athletes, especially if doing so will increase compliance, balancing the reduced duration of quarantine against a small but nonzero risk for postquarantine transmission. Improved adherence to mitigation measures (e.g., universal masking, physical distancing, and hand hygiene) at all times could further reduce exposures to SARS-CoV-2 and disruptions to athletic activities because of infections and quarantine (1,6).

CDC partnered with representatives of the NCAA conferences to analyze retrospective data collected by participating colleges and universities. A request for participation was sent to all NCAA members regardless of whether athletics programs had resumed. Colleges and universities were provided with a data dictionary to standardize data collection (Supplementary Table, <https://stacks.cdc.gov/view/cdc/99431>). Deidentified, individual-level retrospective testing and exposure data from quarantined, SARS-CoV-2–exposed collegiate athletes across the United States were provided to CDC for analysis. Information on the types of exposure was collected by athletic staff members or public health professionals and categorized as sports settings (e.g., game, practice, team workouts, scrimmage, shared equipment, or team travel), roommate, social gatherings (e.g., party, shared car, or friends), unspecified or other (e.g., class, meetings, work, or travel unrelated to sports). Data cleaning and analyses were conducted in duplicate using SAS (version 9.4; SAS Institute) and R (version 3.6.3; The R Foundation). This activity was reviewed by CDC and was conducted consistent with applicable federal law and CDC policy.[†]

For this analysis, athletes were excluded if they 1) had not received testing using RT-PCR during their 14-day quarantine period; 2) had received a positive SARS-CoV-2 RT-PCR test result before starting quarantine; 3) were still under quarantine and had not had positive test results at the time of data submission (October 27–November 17); or 4) were missing data on quarantine start date, test date, test type (i.e., antigen or RT-PCR), or RT-PCR test result (positive, negative, or indeterminate). For all athletes who received a positive SARS-CoV-2 RT-PCR test result during quarantine, time-to-event analyses were conducted by separately calculating the interval from the exposure date or the quarantine start date to the positive specimen collection date. Quarantined athlete data were excluded from time-to-event analyses if the exposure date or the quarantine start date was missing or if the athlete had positive test results >14 days after commencing quarantine. Kaplan-Meier survival analysis estimated the probability and 95% confidence intervals (CIs) of athletes receiving a first positive SARS-CoV-2 RT-PCR test result after days 5, 7, and 10 of quarantine.

Twenty-four colleges and universities contributed data on 2,257 quarantined athletes, irrespective of test result; data from 427 athletes were excluded based on the described exclusion criteria. Among the remaining 1,830 quarantined athletes, the most common sports played were football (46.2%, 846), track and field or cross-country (10.4%, 190), and soccer (6.6%, 121) (Table). The most commonly reported exposures were at social gatherings (40.7%, 745) or from roommates (31.7%, 580); overall, 232 (12.7%) quarantined athletes reported exposure associated with athletic activities. Athletes received a total of 3,345 RT-PCR tests (mean = 1.8 per athlete, range = 1–14) while in quarantine. A total of 458 (25.0%) quarantined athletes ever received a positive test result, including 137 (29.9%) who never reported symptoms. Among 386 quarantined athletes who became symptomatic, 321 (83.2%) ever received a positive test result.

Three colleges and universities contributed data only on quarantined athletes who received positive test results during quarantine (193); after exclusion of 31 who did not meet inclusion criteria, 162 athletes remained. Therefore, a total of 620 athletes with positive SARS-CoV-2 test results during quarantine were included in a time-to-event analysis. Among 436 (73.4%) of these athletes with available exposure date, quarantine commenced a mean of 1.1 days after reported exposure (range = 0–11 days). Among these athletes, 302 (48.7%) reported symptoms before collection of the specimen that returned positive; the mean interval from symptom onset to positive specimen collection date was 1.1 days (range = 0–12 days). Among the 620 athletes with positive test results, the positive test results occurred by day 2 of quarantine for 303 (48.9%) (Figure 1) and by day 5 for 453 (73.1%) with a mean of 3.8 days from quarantine start (range 0–14 days) until the positive test (Supplementary Figure, <https://stacks.cdc.gov/view/cdc/99765>). Among all SARS-CoV-2 RT-PCR tests administered, the positivity rate decreased over the quarantine period (Figure 2). The median interval between the start of quarantine and collection of a positive specimen was 2 days (range = 0–14 days). Among those whose test results remained negative at day 5, the estimated probability of having a positive test result was 26.9% (95% CI = 23.7–30.7) after day 5, 14.2% (95% CI = 11.7–17.2) after day 7, and 4.7% (95% CI = 3.3–6.7) after day 10. Among the 29 athletes who received positive test results during days 11–14, 26 (89.7%) had not been tested previously during their quarantine period.

Discussion

A positive SARS-CoV-2 test result was received by one quarter of quarantined athletes during June–October 2020. Once an athlete entered quarantine, the probability of a positive test result among those who had no previous positive test result

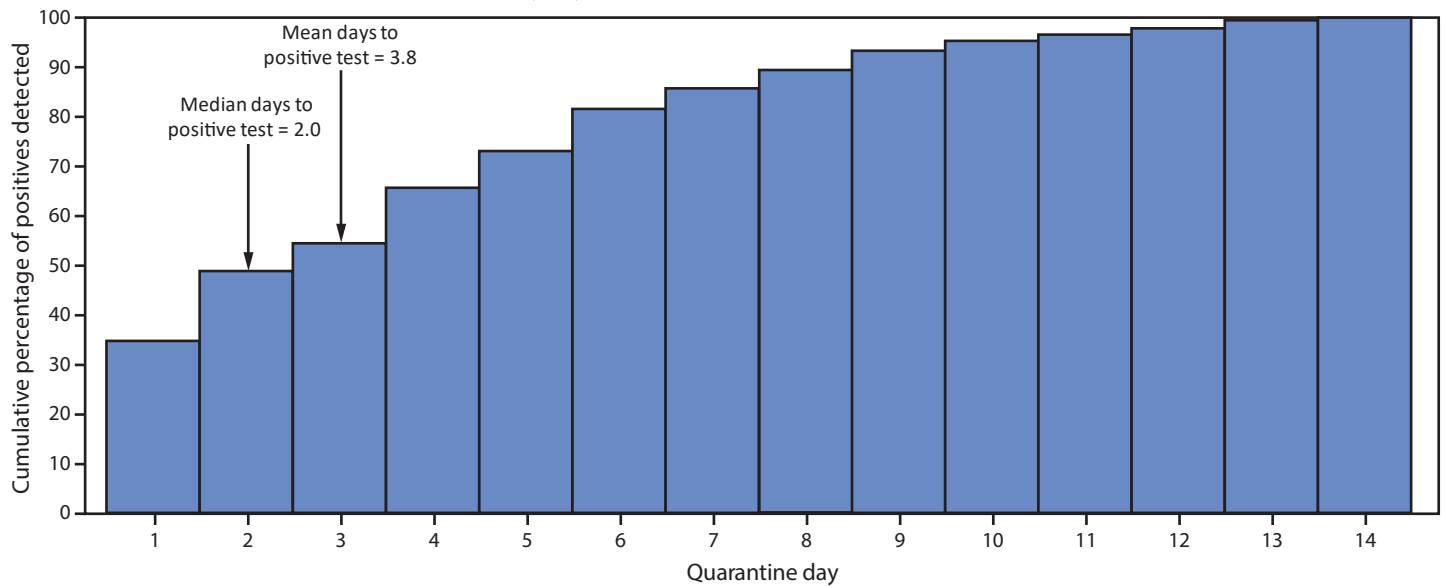
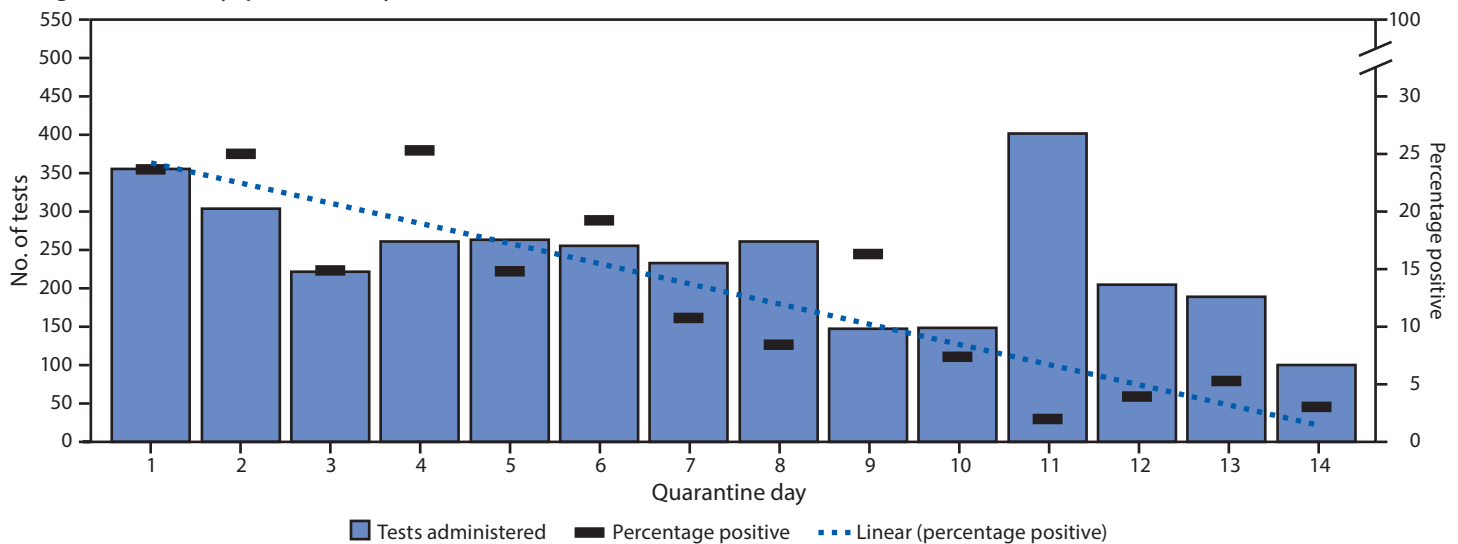

decreased from 27% after day 5 to <5% after day 10. New shortened quarantine options (after day 10 without testing or after day 7 with negative test result) were based on decreasing transmission risk over the duration of quarantine (5). Findings from this investigation support shortened quarantine options for collegiate athletes, given the low proportion of athletes who had positive test results after day 10.

Multiple, concurrent mitigation measures can effectively lower the risk for SARS-CoV-2 transmission (7). The majority

of exposures among these athletes occurred at social gatherings and from roommates, indicating that the implementation of targeted mitigation measures helped minimize exposures associated with athletic activities. These findings underscore the need for adherence to mitigation measures (e.g., universal masking, physical distancing, and hand hygiene) at all times to reduce the risk for transmission of SARS-CoV-2 (1,6). In this cohort of collegiate athletes, fewer than one half who ultimately had a positive test result had symptoms consistent with COVID-19 before collection of the positive specimen. This finding is consistent with recent reports of asymptomatic

screening programs in general university campus populations, where 51% of students with positive test results were asymptomatic (8). In this study, 86% of quarantined athletes who ever had positive test results did so by day 7, which is consistent with a reported median incubation period of 4.3–6.4 days (9,10).

The findings in this report are subject to at least five limitations. First, almost all athletes who had a positive specimen collected after quarantine day 10 had not been tested previously during quarantine. It is possible that those athletes might have had positive test results before day 10. Second, time-to-event analyses used quarantine start date rather than exposure date

because more data were missing on exposure date than on quarantine start date; also, using exposure date was subject to validation errors. Therefore, using the quarantine start date rather than exposure date likely resulted in conservative estimates of the probability of receiving positive test results in quarantine. Third, adherence with quarantine was not assessed, and quarantined athletes possibly had additional exposures leading to infection during the 14-day quarantine. This might explain positive specimens collected after day 10 and could have overestimated the probability of a positive test result after day 10. Fourth, the data relied on self-reported exposure type. Although data were validated by case investigation and contact tracing efforts, 8.1% of athletes reported unspecified exposures, and 3.5% reported multiple exposures. Finally, this study was undertaken in a population of young, healthy athletes undergoing frequent testing. The findings might not be generalizable to other settings and populations.

Data from this report support CDC's guidance on quarantine options shorter than 14 days, with the caveat that a small residual increased risk for transmission remains with a shortened quarantine period. Persons released from quarantine before 14 days should continue daily symptom monitoring, avoid close contact and wear masks when around others. Adherence to quarantine is a known challenge (5) and reducing the duration of quarantine might improve adherence at a population level. Transmission of SARS-CoV-2 can be reduced through a multipronged application of evidence-based mitigation strategies (7), including within large congregate and crowded settings found at colleges and universities. Adherence to mitigation measures during athletic and nonathletic activities is important to protect collegiate athletes from SARS-CoV-2, lessen disruptions in play because of quarantine and isolation protocols, and reduce transmission to others in the community.

Summary

What is already known about this topic?

Quarantine after SARS-CoV-2 exposure is critical to preventing transmission. A 14-day quarantine can prevent further transmission but might be challenging to maintain.

What is added by this report?

Among collegiate athletes exposed to COVID-19, one quarter had positive test results during quarantine. Among athletes who had not received a positive test result by day 5, the probability of testing positive decreased from 27% after day 5 to <5% after day 10.

What are the implications for public health practice?

Among young, healthy athletes, the probability of receiving positive test results after day 10 of quarantine is low. A shorter quarantine after COVID-19 exposure could increase adherence but still poses a small residual risk for transmission.

Assessment of Day-7 Postexposure Testing of Asymptomatic Contacts of COVID-19 Patients to Evaluate Early Release from Quarantine — Vermont, May–November 2020

On May 8, 2020, the Vermont Department of Health (VDH) issued a Health Update* recommending shortening the duration of quarantine for persons exposed to SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). Exposed persons who were in quarantine could be tested by polymerase chain reaction (PCR) on or after quarantine day 7. Those who had remained asymptomatic throughout quarantine and who received a negative SARS-CoV-2 PCR test result on or after day 7 could end quarantine. This policy was based on a report suggesting that symptom onset occurs within this time frame in approximately three quarters of COVID-19 cases (1) and on consultation of the Vermont Health Commissioner with the U.S. Surgeon General. VDH implemented this policy to minimize restrictions on state residents, recognizing that some reduction could occur in the prevention benefit of quarantine to contain the spread of SARS-CoV-2. State-run SARS-CoV-2 testing sites were made available to increase access to no-cost testing and facilitate implementation of this policy. During August 1–December 1, among persons seeking testing at a VDH SARS-CoV-2 testing site, 36% stated that their reason for seeking testing was to end quarantine early (VDH, unpublished data, December 7, 2020), indicating that persons were aware of and following the policy and using the testing services provided. To assess the effectiveness of this policy, VDH analyzed testing data for contacts of persons with a COVID-19 diagnosis. During May 8–November 16, VDH identified 8,798 exposed contacts of COVID-19 patients; 3,983 (45%) had sought testing within 14 days of their exposure, with day 0 defined as the date of last exposure noted in the case investigation record. Among these persons, 2,200 (55%) who received testing on days 7–10 were included in this analysis; 977 (44.9%) of these contacts had a specimen collected for testing on day 7. Among these, 34 (3%) had test results that were positive, 940 (96%) had results that were negative, and three (<1%) had results that were indeterminate (Table). Among the 34 contacts who received a positive SARS-CoV-2 PCR test result on day 7 after exposure, 12 (35%) were asymptomatic. The remaining 22 contacts with positive test results were symptomatic at the time of testing; approximately one half had developed symptoms on days 4–7

after exposure. Among the 940 contacts who received negative test results on specimens collected on day 7 after exposure, 154 (16%) had a subsequent test within the next 7 days (i.e., days 8–14); among these, 152 (99%) had tests that remained negative, and two (1%) had results that were indeterminate.

In addition to the 977 persons who received testing on day 7 after exposure, 1,223 (55.1% of all contacts tested on days 7–10 postexposure) had a specimen collected for SARS-CoV-2 PCR testing on day 8, 9, or 10. Among those persons, 53 (4%) had test results that were positive, 1,159 (95%) had results that were negative, and 11 (1%) had results that were indeterminate. Among the 53 contacts who received a positive SARS-CoV-2 PCR result on specimens collected days 8–10 after exposure, 12 (23%) were asymptomatic (mean time since symptom onset = 6 days). Among the 1,170 contacts who received a negative or indeterminate test result on specimens collected on days 8–10 after exposure, 108 (9%) had a subsequent specimen tested; 107 (99%) remained negative, and one (1%) had a result that was indeterminate. Therefore, among all 2,200 contacts tested on days 7–10 after exposure, 87 (4%) persons had a positive test result, 24 (28%) of whom were asymptomatic.

The findings in this report are subject to at least three limitations. First, this analysis was conducted on a convenience sample that included only positive test results received

electronically or by fax and negative test results received electronically. Negative test results that were received by fax were not entered into the surveillance system and so are not included in this analysis. Second, the limited demographic data on contacts of patients could hamper the matching of a contact with a laboratory result; thus, the number of contacts tested might be underreported. Although persons who were retested remained negative (1% indeterminate), they represented only 16% of the total number of persons who discontinued quarantine. Finally, asymptomatic status during quarantine until the time of testing for persons testing negative could not be verified.

These results indicate that among the persons in quarantine who tested negative at day 7 after exposure, none who were retested between day 8 and 14 were positive. Allowing asymptomatic persons to shorten quarantine with a negative test at day 7 or later has not been demonstrated to result in transmission of SARS-CoV-2, indicating that the policy has been effective. These results also indicate that 3.9% of contacts tested on days 7–10 after exposure were infected with SARS-CoV-2. In addition to reducing the duration of quarantine for exposed contacts, Vermont's policy might have

provided additional benefits to the state's pandemic response by identifying some asymptomatic patients earlier in the course of their illness through enhancing statewide surveillance testing of an exposed group. This assessment supports Vermont's policy as being effective and offers data to support recommendations to shorten quarantine with testing such as those provided in CDC's updated quarantine guidance.[†]

Opening of Large Institutions of Higher Education and County-Level COVID-19 Incidence — United States, July 6–September 17, 2020

During early August 2020, county-level incidence of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) generally decreased across the United States, compared with incidence earlier in the summer (1); however, among young adults aged 18–22 years, incidence increased (2). Increases in incidence among adults aged ≥60 years, who might be more susceptible to severe COVID-19–related illness, have followed increases in younger adults (aged 20–39 years) by an average of 8.7 days (3). Institutions of higher education (colleges and universities) have been identified as settings where incidence among young adults increased during August (4,5). Understanding the extent to which these settings have affected county-level COVID-19 incidence can inform ongoing college and university operations and future planning. To evaluate the effect of large colleges or universities and school instructional format* (remote or in-person) on COVID-19 incidence, start dates and instructional formats for the fall 2020 semester were identified for all not-for-profit large U.S. colleges and universities (≥20,000 total enrolled students). Among counties with large colleges and universities (university counties) included in the analysis, remote-instruction university counties (22) experienced a 17.9% decline in mean COVID-19 incidence during the 21 days before through 21 days after the start of classes (from 17.9 to 14.7 cases per 100,000), and in-person instruction university counties (79) experienced a 56.2% increase in COVID-19 incidence, from 15.3 to 23.9 cases per 100,000. Counties without large colleges and universities (nonuniversity counties) (3,009) experienced a 5.9% decline in COVID-19 incidence, from 15.3 to 14.4 cases per 100,000. Similar findings were observed for percentage of positive test results and hotspot status (i.e., increasing among in-person–instruction

university counties). In-person instruction at colleges and universities was associated with increased county-level COVID-19 incidence and percentage test positivity. Implementation of increased mitigation efforts at colleges and universities could minimize on-campus COVID-19 transmission.

The National Center for Educational Statistics' Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (6) was used to identify not-for-profit baccalaureate degree–granting colleges and universities enrolling ≥20,000 full-time and part-time students. Colleges and universities that enrolled <20,000 students or were considered for-profit were excluded. Fall class start dates and instructional formats on the first day of scheduled classes were abstracted from college and university websites during early September 2020. Counties with large colleges and universities were assigned the start date and instructional format of the school. If a county contained multiple large colleges or universities with different start dates, the earliest start date and corresponding instructional format was assigned. If a county contained multiple large schools with the same start date but different instructional formats, then in-person instruction was assigned. Among 133 counties with large colleges and universities (university counties),[†] the 101 (76%) in which classes started from July 27 to August 28 were included in the analysis (i.e., 32 were excluded because they included institutions that started on or after August 29 and had insufficient data for the 21 days after the start of classes at the time of analysis). County-level mean estimates of COVID-19 incidence,[§] testing rates, percentage test positivity,[¶] and hotspot status** were compared for university counties with remote-instruction, in-person–instruction, and nonuniversity counties during the 21 days before and after the start of classes.

*Instructional format was assigned based on the advertised method of instruction for the first day of fall 2020 classes. "Remote" format was defined as an instructional format that appeared to minimize in-person classwork on campus. This definition did allow in-person instruction for a very select number of students, including those in laboratory courses, studio courses, or courses for small groups of students with specific instructional needs. In contrast, the "in-person" format was defined for all other colleges and universities that were not considered remote, which included any instructional format that did not appear to minimize in-person classwork on campus. "Hybrid" instructional formats that had reduced, but reoccurring, in-class experiences for many college and university courses (i.e., beyond laboratory and studio courses) were considered "in-person" for this study. The assignment of instructional format was based on the advertised method of instruction and was not based on the college or university policy toward on-campus housing; therefore colleges and universities with remote instruction could have allowed students to stay in on-campus housing.

For all analyses, mean county population size, full-time student enrollment size, urban-rural classifications (large central metro, large fringe metro, medium metro, small metro, micro-political, and noncore), and COVID-19 outcomes are reported and stratified by county university status and instructional format. The COVID-19 outcomes included incidence and testing rates per 100,000 population, test positivity by SARS-CoV-2 reverse transcription–polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) testing, and the percentage of counties identified as hotspots for ≥ 1 day during the observation periods. COVID-19 outcomes were reported as means for the 21 days before and after the class start date. Absolute differences (i.e., percentage point differences) are described for percentage-based measures (test positivity and hotspot detection) and relative changes described for rate-based measures (testing rate and incidence). Seven-day moving averages for testing rates, percentage test positivity, and incidence are presented as trends over the observation period (day –21 to day +21). In an unmatched analysis, remote-instruction and in-person instruction university counties were compared with nonuniversity counties. Nonuniversity counties were assigned the median start date of university counties. In the matched analysis, in-person–instruction university counties were matched with nonuniversity counties based on geographic proximity and population size. This analysis of 68 matched pairs was conducted to account for differences in population size, urbanicity, and geographic location between university and nonuniversity counties.^{††} Nonuniversity counties in the matched sample were assigned the start date of their matched university-county counterpart. In the matched analysis, a regression-based difference-in-difference approach^{§§} was used to quantify the impact of in-person instruction on COVID-19

incidence, with and without adjustment for transient student populations,^{¶¶} and percentage test positivity. A sensitivity analysis was conducted to explore whether students' early return to campus might affect observed changes using day –7 as the demarcation between before and after periods. Statistical significance was set at $\alpha = 0.05$. Analyses were conducted using R statistical software (version 4.0.2; The R Foundation).

Among 101 university counties (3.2% of all U.S. counties, accounting for 29.4% of the U.S. population), instructional format was remote for 22 (22%) and in-person for 79 (78%). University counties had higher mean population size and were more urban than were nonuniversity counties (Table). Before the start of school, COVID-19 testing rates at the county-level were already higher in university counties than in nonuniversity counties (Figure). Comparing the time from the start of classes through day 21 with the 21 days before classes began, mean daily testing increased 4.2% and 14.1% among remote instruction and in-person instruction university counties, respectively, and decreased 1.0% among nonuniversity counties. Mean test positivity decreased among remote-instruction university counties (absolute change = –1.8%) and nonuniversity counties (–0.6%) but increased among in-person instruction university counties (1.1%). Incidence decreased in nonuniversity counties (–5.9%) and remote-instruction counties (–17.9%), whereas, incidence increased in in-person (56.2%) university counties. The percentage of counties identified at least once as a hotspot

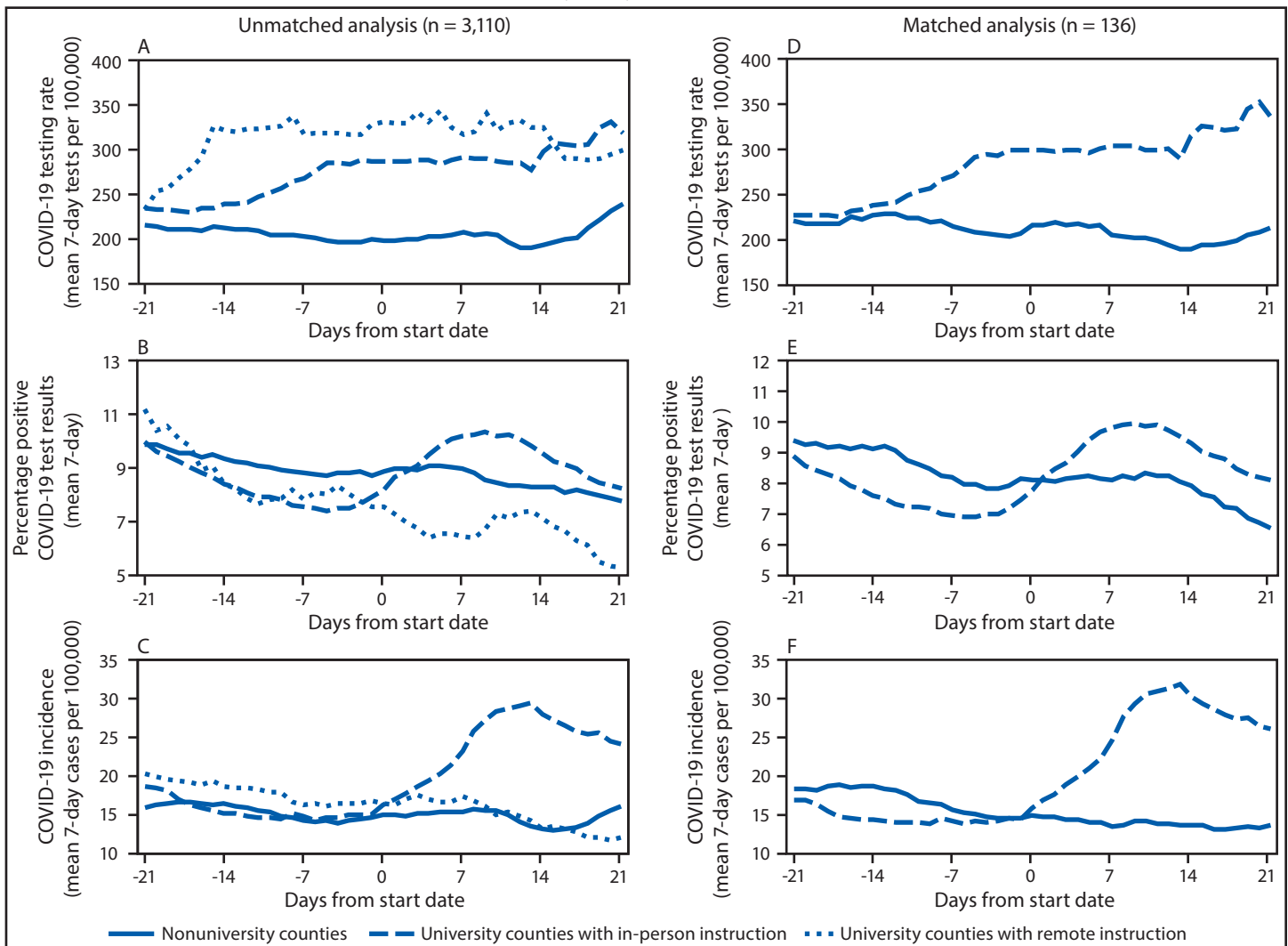

increased for all three groups, with the highest percentage observed in in-person instruction university counties (30.4% absolute increase), followed by remote-instruction university counties (9.1%) and nonuniversity counties (1.5%).

COVID-19 outcomes were similar in the matched analysis. Compared with nonuniversity counties, in-person instruction university counties experienced a higher relative change in testing rates (18.8% versus -5.6%), a higher absolute change in test positivity (1.6% versus -0.8%), a higher relative change

in incidence (78.3% versus -19.5%) (Table) (Figure), and a higher absolute change in the percentage identified as hotspots (33.8% versus 1.5%). Based on the difference-in-difference analysis, university counties with in-person instruction were associated with an increase of 14.4 cases per 100,000 ($p < 0.05$) and an increase of 2.4 percent test positivity ($p < 0.05$) relative to nonuniversity counties with in-person instruction. When adjusting incidence for the influx of full-time students, in-person instruction university counties were associated with an

increase of 10.6 cases per 100,000 ($p < 0.05$) (Supplementary Table, <https://stacks.cdc.gov/view/cdc/99533>). These results did not change meaningfully in the sensitivity analysis.

Discussion

County-level COVID-19 incidence decreased in much of the United States in late summer 2020. Comparing the 21 days before and after instruction start dates, university counties with in-person instruction experienced a 56% increase in incidence and 30% increase in hotspot occurrence as well as increases in COVID-19-related testing and test percentage positivity. Results from the unmatched analysis were consistent with those from the matched analysis. If percentage positivity had been stable or declining across the observation period, then efforts on the part of many colleges and universities to conduct or require testing before students' return to campus and their ongoing surveillance efforts might explain an increase in case counts, as a result of increased case discovery. However, the concurrent increases in percentage positivity and in incidence in these counties suggest that higher levels of transmission, in addition to increased case discovery, occurred in these communities (2).

The findings in this report are subject to at least six limitations. First, data abstraction for schools' instructional formats was conducted in early September and focused on identifying the format used on the first day of classes; some misclassification of instructional format might have occurred because of changes during the first few weeks of instruction. Second, this study did not adjust for mitigation strategies (e.g., mask and social distancing requirements and limits on large crowds and athletic events) implemented at local or state levels or at colleges and universities, which could have affected the association between the institution's opening and county-level incidence. Similarly, whether cases in university counties were college- or university-related (i.e., through contact in classrooms, dormitories, cafeterias, or off-campus activities) or related to community transmission could not be discerned. Third, these results might not be generalizable to counties with smaller colleges and universities. Fourth, U.S. Census 2019 population estimates were used to calculate rates, which do not include all college and university enrollments. County-level rate calculations could be inflated for university counties, especially those for which the enrollment numbers are relatively large compared with the county's population size. Fifth, the longer-term implications for county incidence (i.e., beyond 21 days) were not assessed. Finally, the university counties in the unmatched analysis have larger populations and likely additional characteristics that are different from those of nonuniversity counties. This limitation prompted the decision to conduct the matched analysis, which focused on counties

Summary

What is already known about this topic?

Increasing COVID-19 incidence was observed among young adults in August 2020, and outbreaks have been reported at institutions of higher education (colleges and universities).

What is added by this report?

U.S. counties with large colleges or universities with remote instruction ($n = 22$) experienced a 17.9% decrease in incidence and university counties with in-person instruction ($n = 79$) experienced a 56% increase in incidence, comparing the 21-day periods before and after classes started. Counties without large colleges or universities ($n = 3,009$) experienced a 6% decrease in incidence during similar time frames.

What are the implications for public health practice?

Additional implementation of effective mitigation activities at colleges and universities with in-person instruction could minimize on-campus COVID-19 transmission and reduce county-level incidence.

with more similar population levels and geographic proximity. However, broader generalizations based on the matched analysis might not be warranted because 11 university counties with in-person instruction were excluded from the matched analysis because no appropriate matches were available.

COVID-19 incidence, hotspot occurrence, COVID-19-related testing, and test positivity increased in university counties with in-person instruction. Efforts to prevent and mitigate COVID-19 transmission are critical for U.S. colleges and universities. Congregate living settings at colleges and universities were linked to transmissions (7). Testing students for COVID-19 when they return to campus and throughout the semester might be an effective strategy to rapidly identify and isolate new cases to interrupt and reduce further transmissions (8). Colleges and universities should work to achieve greater adherence to the recommended use of masks, hand hygiene, social distancing, and COVID-19 surveillance among students (9), including those who are exposed, symptomatic, and asymptomatic. The increase in testing rates likely reflects local efforts already underway to improve COVID-19 surveillance and response. Increasing testing capacity and engaging in other COVID-19 mitigation strategies might be especially important for colleges and universities in areas where transmission from students into the broader community could exacerbate existing disparities, including access to and utilization of health care, as well as the disproportionate morbidity and mortality of COVID-19 among populations with prevalent underlying conditions associated with more severe outcomes following infection. Some university counties might have one or more concerning factors, such as higher levels of older adult populations, high rates of obesity and cardiovascular disease,

or strained health care resources. These counties might need to consider the implications of in-person instruction on spread of COVID-19 among a student population that might have interactions with persons at higher risk in the community. College and university administrators should work with local decision-makers and public health officials to strengthen community mitigation, in addition to continuing efforts to slow the spread of COVID-19 on college and university campuses.

Participation in Fraternity and Sorority Activities and the Spread of COVID-19 Among Residential University Communities — Arkansas, August 21–September 5, 2020

Preventing transmission of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), in colleges and universities requires mitigation strategies that address on- and off-campus congregate living settings as well as extracurricular activities and other social gatherings (1–4). At the start of the academic year, sorority and fraternity organizations host a series of recruitment activities known as rush week; rush week culminates with bid day, when selections are announced. At university A in Arkansas, sorority rush week (for women) was held during August 17–22, 2020, and consisted of on- and off-campus social gatherings, including an outdoor bid day event on August 22. Fraternity rush week (for men) occurred during August 27–31, with bid day scheduled for September 5. During August 22–September 5, university A–associated COVID-19 cases were reported to the Arkansas Department of Health (ADH). A total of 965 confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases associated with university A were identified, with symptom onset occurring during August 20–September 5, 2020; 31% of the patients with these cases reported involvement in any fraternity or sorority activity. Network analysis identified 54 gatherings among all linkages of cases to places of residence and cases to events, 49 (91%) were linked by participation in fraternity and sorority activities accounting for 42 (72%) links among gatherings. On September 4, university A banned gatherings of ≥10 persons, and fraternity bid day was held virtually. The rapid increase in COVID-19 cases was likely facilitated by on- and off-campus congregate living settings and activities, and health departments should work together with student organizations and university leadership to ensure compliance with mitigation measures.

University A began the academic year on August 24, offering in-class and virtual instruction for approximately 20,000 students; a majority of students used virtual instruction. Before and during the start of the academic year, students might have participated in on- and off-campus fraternity or sorority activities. Cases were identified by the university during an ADH-sponsored testing event (September 1–3) or linked to the university by ADH. Case data were reported to ADH by clinic staff members at university A and stored in an electronic database (REDCap, version 8.8.0; Vanderbilt University). Using a standardized questionnaire, ADH nurses interviewed persons with university-associated COVID-19

to ascertain demographic characteristics, date of symptom onset, university status, class attendance type (in-class or virtual), place of residence, and involvement in community- and school-related activities during the 14 days preceding illness onset. Illness onset was defined as the earliest date of reported symptoms for symptomatic cases* or as date of specimen collection for asymptomatic cases (ADH followed up with cases that had testing and diagnosis before symptom onset to identify date of symptom onset). Initial case reviews by ADH identified patients who reported recent participation in sorority or fraternity activities; subsequent infections were observed among cohabitants of these persons.

A network analysis was performed to assess the relationship between participation in university fraternity or sorority activities and the spread of COVID-19 among residential communities at university A. MicrobeTrace, a network analysis and visualization tool developed by CDC,[†] was used to visualize and describe the full network of persons with COVID-19 and identify potential transmission-related gatherings (network analysis terminology would refer to these as “communities”), defined as one or more gatherings in which multiple cases are identified and epidemiologically linked. COVID-19 patients were included in the network if they lived on campus, participated in fraternity or sorority activities, or lived in the same off-campus dwelling as a person who participated in these activities. Case-to-residence and case-to-event networks were constructed to map residential university A transmission-related gatherings. These networks were used to infer gatherings by algorithmically partitioning the network into the most densely linked cases (nodes) (5,6). In this network analysis method, the algorithm randomly assigns nodes a “community” identifier, and community connectivity is measured. For each person in the network, community identifiers are swapped with their neighbors and then remeasured. Only changes in community affiliation that improve connectivity are preserved, reversing any swaps that do not improve connectivity. This activity was reviewed by CDC and was conducted consistent with applicable federal law and CDC policy.[§]

During August 22–September 5, a total of 965 university-associated COVID-19 cases with illness onset on or after August 20 were identified, including 699 (72%) confirmed cases (with positive reverse transcription–polymerase chain reaction test results) and 266 (28%) probable cases (with positive results for SARS-CoV-2 antigen test, performed at the university clinic). A 3-day, ADH-sponsored testing event, held during September 1–3 in response to an increase in university-associated cases detected by ADH, resulted in a 22% test positivity rate and identified 324 cases; overall, 34% of cases were identified through this testing event. Among the 965 confirmed and probable cases with illness onset dates during August 20–September 5, 673 (70%) occurred in women and 936 (97%) were in persons aged 18–24 years (Table). Five cases (<1%) in persons identified as faculty or staff members were reported. The number of cases with reported illness onset on a given day increased and peaked on August 31 (Figure 1). Forty-eight (5%) persons with COVID-19 had received in-class instruction, 292 (31%) participated in fraternity or sorority activities, and 149 (15%) lived in a fraternity or sorority house.

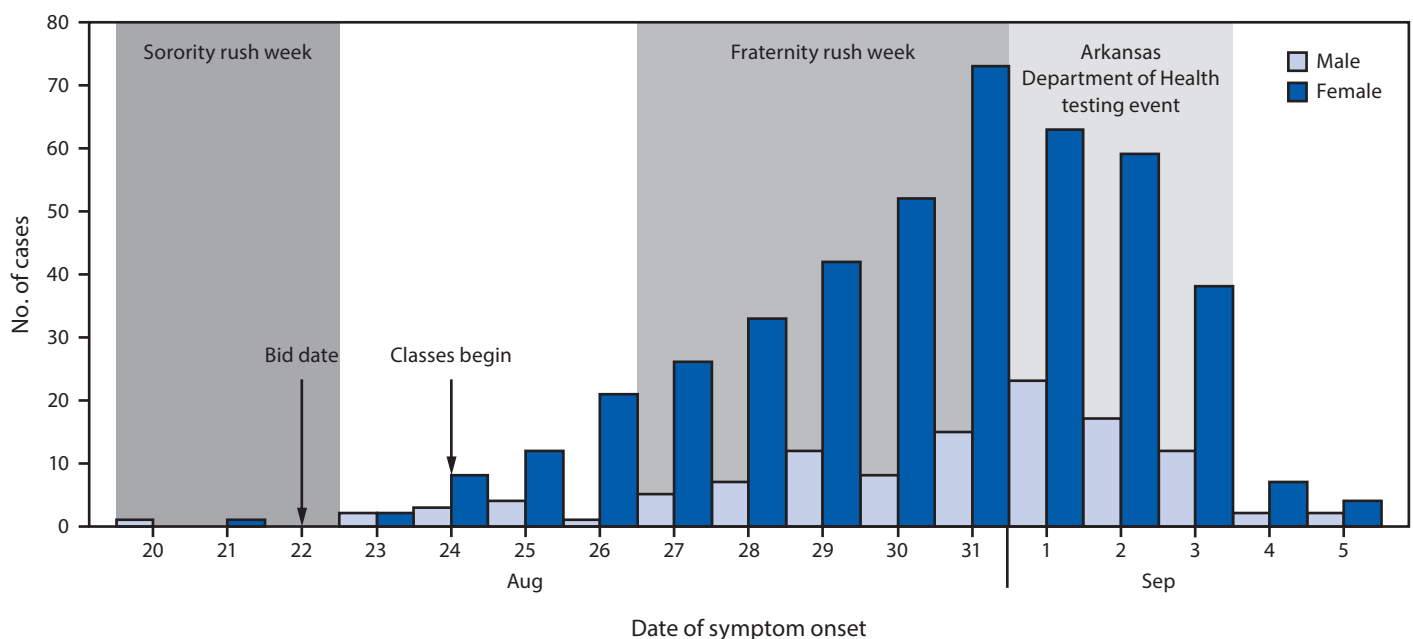
The network analysis linked 565 (59%) cases to 56 residences (16 dormitories, 20 apartments and houses, and 20 fraternity or sorority houses) and to their case-to-event associations (Figure 2). The full network consisted of one large, linked cluster of 471 (83%) cases (86% in women and 14% in men) and eight smaller, unlinked gatherings of 94 total cases (49%

FIGURE 1. University-affiliated COVID-19 cases (N = 555),* by symptom onset date† and sex — Arkansas, August 17–September 5, 2020§



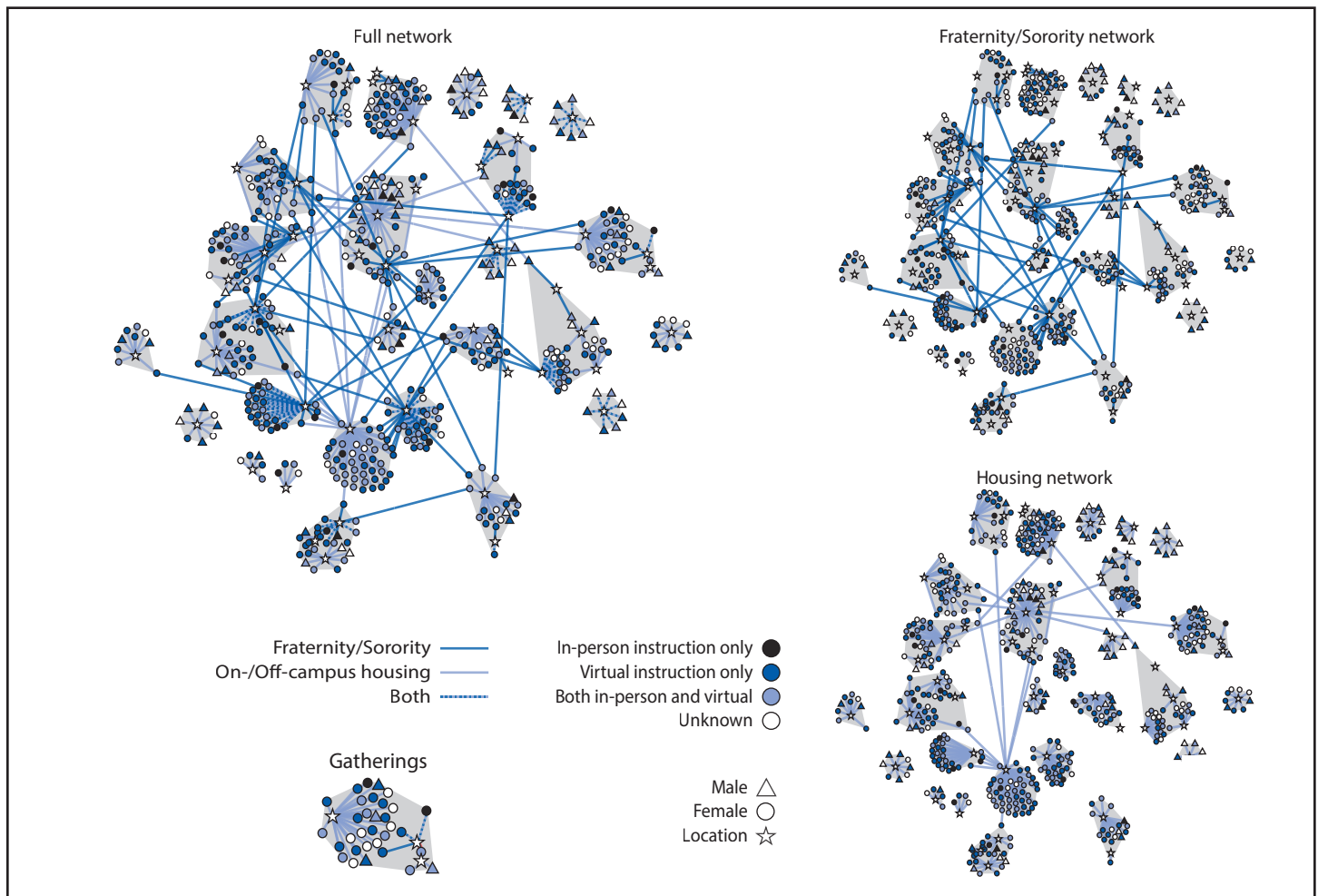

in women and 51% in men; cluster size range = 4–12 cases). Fifty-four gatherings were detected, including 27 (50%) with at least five cases. Among persons in 44 (81%) gatherings, at least one member regularly attended in-person classes, and at least one member of each of the 49 gatherings (91%) reported participation in fraternity or sorority activities or events. Gatherings included an average of 20.3 cases (median = 21; range = 5–44). Among 58 links between gatherings, 42 (72%) were associated with fraternity or sorority activities, 11 (19%) with on-campus dormitories, and five (9%) with off-campus apartments and houses.

Discussion

Within 2 weeks of the start of the 2020–21 academic year, COVID-19 cases rapidly increased among persons associated with university A. Transmission was likely facilitated by on- and off-campus congregate living settings and activities, with

a majority of the gatherings (91%) and links between them (72%) associated with fraternities or sororities. Most patients reported virtual instruction only, which indicates transmission likely occurred primarily outside the classroom; this finding is supported by the very small proportion of cases among faculty and staff members (0.5%). Women constitute 54% of university A's 2020 student body but accounted for 70% of university A's COVID-19 cases. Among linked gatherings, women accounted for 86% of cases, a finding that could reflect involvement in gender-specific activities, including sorority rush week, which held an in-person outdoor bid day event and occurred before fraternity rush week, which was both held later and virtually.

Understanding networks can provide insights into COVID-19 transmission dynamics and inform effective mitigation strategies. In the absence of detailed person-to-person transmission data from contact tracing, network analysis using

Summary

What is already known about this topic?

Preventing COVID-19 in colleges and universities requires mitigation strategies addressing on- and off-campus congregate living settings, extracurricular activities, and social gatherings.

What is added by this report?

At the start of the 2020–21 academic year, COVID-19 cases increased rapidly at an Arkansas university. Network analysis indicated that 91% of gatherings were associated with fraternity or sorority activities. Recruitment events held virtually were associated with fewer cases than those held in-person.

What are the implications for public health practice?

Given the potential for rapid SARS-CoV-2 transmission in on- and off-campus settings and activities, colleges and universities should work with local health departments and student organizations to ensure compliance with mitigation guidelines.

available data on place of residence and involvement in on- and off-campus activities was used to describe university A's transmission network, potential gatherings where transmission might have taken place, and links between nodes. The network visualization tool depicted algorithm-detected gatherings to identify links indicating likely recent contact. Visualized in real-time, information from such links and networks could support implementation of targeted mitigation activities, such as isolation of cases and quarantining of contacts.

The findings in this report are subject to at least four limitations. First, incomplete case investigations resulted in missing or unknown data and exclusion from the network analysis. Second, housing and event attendance might not approximate transmission histories. Third, many cases were identified during mass testing events, and event advertisement and location could have resulted in a biased sample. Finally, data were not collected from uninfected persons or on adherence to mitigation strategies, such as social distancing, mask use, and hand hygiene.

Because of the potential for rapid transmission of SARS-CoV-2 in on- and off-campus university settings, student organizations could help ensure compliance with CDC-recommended COVID-19 mitigation measures, such as limiting the size of social gatherings, adhering to social distancing recommendations, requiring mask use, improving hand hygiene, and increasing testing. Encouraging more virtual

activities, including those related to fraternity and sorority rush week, might help minimize the risk for transmission on university and college campuses. To ensure compliance with mitigation measures, health departments should work together with student organizations and university leaders.

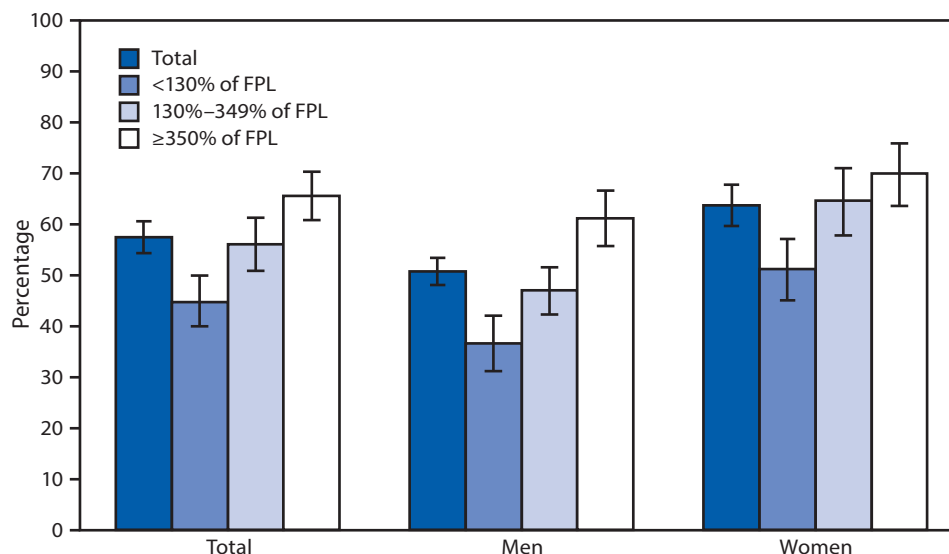

The increase with family income was seen for both men and women. Women were more likely than were men to use a dietary supplement overall (63.8% versus 50.8%) and at each income level.
