PROPOSED ORDER

Upon consideration of the parties' Joint Status Report, it is HEREBY ORDERED that:

- CBP shall make an initial release to CREW of non-exempt records responsive to CREW's FOIA request no later than July 11, 2022, and continue rolling productions on 11th day of each month until the productions are complete, unless that date is a holiday or weekend, in which case the production will be made the following business day.
- The parties shall file a Joint Status Report no later than July 15, 2022 articulating a
 more detailed agreement or competing proposals on the number of records that are to
 be reviewed and the order and time frame in which CBP will complete review and
 disclosure of these records.
- Sixty days after CBP makes its final production to CREW, the parties shall file a Joint Status Report proposing a briefing schedule for dispositive motions, if needed.
