Hi Patrick.

Thank you for your email. For the November 8, 2022 federal general election, the Civil Rights Division expects to send monitors to three Texas counties only: Dallas, Harris, and Waller. Those counties are mentioned in the Department's <u>press release</u> regarding the 2022 federal general election. Our past press releases note that we have monitored in Texas in every federal general election since at least 2002. We expect to have about six monitors in Dallas County, about 10 in Harris County, including monitors from the Disability Rights Section of the Department's Civil Rights Division (DRS), and about three in Waller County. The monitoring is pursuant to the Voting Rights Act, including Section 203 for Harris and Dallas Counties, Section 2 for Waller County, and Section 11(b) for all three counties. DRS's accessibility monitoring in Harris County is being conducted pursuant to an Americans with Disabilities Act agreement with the County that allows access to the polls. We have notified each county of our intended presence, and have worked cooperatively with them. The purpose of our calls to you last week was to provide notice in good faith to the Texas Secretary of State's Office via the Texas Attorney General's Office.

Attached is our letter from 2014 to the Texas State Election Director, Mr. Ingram, which helps explain our monitoring. We reemphasize here that DOJ monitors deployed pursuant to federal law are trained merely to observe and gather information on polling place procedures, and not interfere in any way with the conduct of elections.

I just returned from a vacation, and I received voice mails apparently left late last week in my absence about election monitors or observers. I am aware of no other communications directed to me or our office that address this matter by email or letter.

As an initial matter, please include Christopher Hilton on future communications on this issue. He is working on this matter for OAG and is copied here.

In your voice mail you advised that DOJ intended to send monitors or observers to three areas in Texas: Waller County, Dallas County and Harris County. We have several questions about your message.

- Is DOJ intending to send monitors or observers to other locations or just those three counties?
- 2. How many election monitors or observers are you intending to send to each county?
- **3.** What is the scope of your proposed monitoring or observing efforts and what is their specific charge? Also, where do you intend to station these monitors or observers in those areas?

- 4. Have you previously notified the specific counties or the Secretary of State of your intentions?
- 5. As you are likely aware the Texas Election Code has various provisions that may be relevant to monitors or observers, among others Section 61.001 that limits the role of election bystanders. Please provide us the basis of DOJ's claimed authority to undertake the monitoring or observations in the proposed areas and advise if you intend to adhere to those provisions.

Please respond to the above questions as soon as possible in view of the impending deadlines.

This letter follows up on our phone conversation on October 31. As you have requested previously and as we have done in years past, we contacted you then to let you know about upcoming election monitoring by the Civil Rights Division of the U.S. Department of Justice in Texas for the November 4, 2014 election. On November 4, the Department will be sending Civil Rights Division staff members to Harris and Waller Counties. We have already contacted county attorneys for those counties to discuss the monitoring.

The federal voting rights statutes that fall within the jurisdiction of the Civil Rights Division provide the Attorney General with enforcement authority on behalf of the United States. This includes statutes such as the Voting Rights Act (52 U.S.C. §§ 10308, 10504, 10701), the National Voter Registration Act (52 U.S.C. § 20510), the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (52 U.S.C. § 20307), the Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act (52 U.S.C. § 20105), the Civil Rights Act (52 U.S.C. §§ 10101, 20703) and the Help America Vote Act (52 U.S.C. § 21111), among others. Pursuant to that enforcement authority, through election-day monitoring and in-person visits to jurisdictions, the Department investigates potential violations of the federal voting rights statutes, such as the minority language provisions of Section 203 or the anti-intimidation provisions of Section 11(b) of the Voting Rights Act, for example.

As you are aware, the Department of Justice has sent Civil Rights Division staff members to Texas for monitoring during many elections in years past, including on dozens of occasions just since 2000. We have appreciated working cooperatively with your office and your counties on these monitoring efforts in the past, and we look forward to continuing to do so in the future.

From its legislative history, Texas Bill Analysis, H.B. 1128, 5/11/2021:

The 2020 elections caused many people across the country to lose confidence in the process and outcome of elections. One concern includes multiple election workers who expressed concerns about the individuals and elected officials who entered polling and ballot processing facilities and refused to leave. Current election laws were too vague to give election judges the authority or confidence to expel certain people loitering in election facilities. H.B. 1128 clarifies which people are allowed in facilities where voting or ballot processing occurs. This bill further secures elections from elected officials or bad actors who might seek to intimidate voters, election workers, or otherwise influence elections.

Tex. Elec. Code Ann. § 61.001:

- (a) Except as permitted by this code and as described by Subsection (a-1), a person may not be in the polling place from the time the presiding judge arrives there on election day to make the preliminary arrangements until the precinct returns have been certified and the election records have been assembled for distribution following the election.
- (a-1) Under this code, a person may be lawfully present in a polling place during the time described by Subsection (a) if the person is:
- (1) an election judge or clerk;
- (2) a watcher;
- (3) the secretary of state;
- (4) a staff member of the Elections Division of the Office of the Secretary of State performing an official duty in accordance with this code:
- (5) an election official, a sheriff, or a staff member of an election official or sheriff delivering election supplies;
- (6) a state inspector;
- (7) a person admitted to vote;
- (8) a child under 18 years of age who is accompanying a parent who has been admitted to vote;
- (9) a person providing assistance to a voter under Section 61.032 or 64.032;
- (10) a person accompanying a voter who has a disability:
- (11) a special peace officer appointed by the presiding judge under Section 32.075;
- (12) the county chair of a political party conducting a primary election, as authorized by Section 172.1113;
- (13) a voting system technician, as authorized by Section 125.010;
- (14) the county election officer, as defined by Section 31.091, as necessary to perform tasks related to the administration of the election; or
- (15) a person whose presence has been authorized by the presiding judge in accordance with this code.


Yes. And BTW, the main reason I favor the NIOSH app over the small, hand-held devices is simply a matter of convenience. (Not to mention that the app is free and the (decent) standalones run anywhere from \$40 to \$150.) The standalone instrument is one more tool to carry onsite and one more device for which batteries changes will be needed, whereas we always have our phones with us. The approx. \$120 microphone that attaches to the iPhones is tiny and simple to use. And it's my opinion that the iPhone as decibel meter would function as well as the standalone decibel meters.

Having said all that, I think it would be pretty cool to use one of those standalone meters onsite, so long as we could find an alternative to that goofy cardboard thingie.
