

Open source social media reporting discovered the following demonstration(s) scheduled to take place in Washington, DC on 06/05/20, with an unknown number of confirmed participants. As group numbers are obtained, PID will provide updates. The demonstration activity for 06/05/20, is summarized below:

From 06/04/20 to 06/11/20, at 6:00 PM, social media user using #logancircle and #protestdc will host a vigil at Logan Circle. The vigil will last 8 minutes and 46 seconds. There is no indication of civil disobedience. Numbers of anticipated participants are unknown.

On 06/05/20, at 10:00 AM, an unknown individual utilizing the email [REDACTED] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) will host a demonstration at the White House called "National Marijuana Protest March/Weed Walk on Washington." The purpose of the event is "to express the countless reasons why marijuana is a huge benefit to our country." Participant numbers are unknown at this time. No civil disobedience is expected. No known permit has been issued for this event.

On 06/05/20, from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM, approximately 32 members of Shut Down the Dog and Cat Meat Trade Worldwide will host a demonstration at the Embassy of China called "Shut Down the Yulin Dog Meat Festival!" The purpose of the event is "to urge public awareness and stop the cruelty of torturing and killing dogs for the Dog Meat Festival in Yulin, China." No civil disobedience is expected. No known permit has been issued for this event. The event has been postponed.

On 06/05/20, at 1:00 PM, Black Lives Matter will host a demonstration at Cathedral Lawn called "Die-In (Lie-In)." The purpose of the event is "to lie on the ground for 8 minutes and 46 seconds to represent how long the cop had his knee on George Floyd's neck." Participant numbers are unknown at this time. No civil disobedience is expected. No known permit has been issued. The group has conducted numerous demonstrations at USSS protected sites. Demonstrations have resulted in arrests. The group has conducted several demonstrations at/near the White House over the past seven days.

On 06/05/20, from 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM, approximately 151 members of This Ends Now: A Peaceful Protest to End Police Brutality in America (NRID) will host a demonstration at the White House. The purpose of the event is "to peacefully assemble outside of the White House and pressure the US Government to enact forceful policies against the systematic issues that this country faces." Participant numbers are unknown at this time. No civil disobedience is expected. No known permit has been issued for this event. This event could not be confirmed at this time.

On 06/05/20, from 2:00 PM to 6:00 PM, approximately 11 individuals will join [REDACTED] (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) in hosting a march called "March for reform in Washington." The march will begin at the Lincoln Memorial and end at the White House. The purpose is "to bring about a new standard for the police and their actions." No civil disobedience is expected. No known permit has been issued for this event.

On 06/05/20, from 3:00 PM to 6:30 PM, The Episcopal Diocese of Washington will assemble at St. John's Cathedral near Lafayette Park. The purpose of the event is "to support racial justice by praying

and witnessing." Participant numbers are unknown at this time. No civil disobedience is expected. No known permit has been issued for this event.

On 06/05/20, from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM, approximately 20 members of Diaspora en Accion will host a demonstration at the White House called "Cacerolazo BLM / BLM Saucepan." The purpose of the event is "for the entire Latino community (black and non-black) to join the demands of the #BlackLivesMatter movement...we will do it in the most Latin way we know how: to the sound of a saucepan." No civil disobedience is expected. No known permit has been issued for this event.

SUBJECT: DHS Support to Protect Federal Facilities and Property

Purpose: The purpose of this memorandum is to provide guidance for direct support to the Federal Protective Service and our interagency partners to protect all federal facilities and property.

Introduction: The Department plays a key role in protecting Federal facilities and property primarily through the Federal Protective Service (FPS) and in partnership with other DHS law enforcement Components, interagency partners, and state and local partners. Recently, we have seen numerous instigators, criminals and other bad actors use peaceful protests to harm people and property, both Federal and private. For the past month, these bad actors have continued their unlawful activity which has resulted in numerous threats, disruption, and damage to Federal facilities and property.

Background: On June 26, the President issued the following Executive Order: Protecting American Monuments, Memorials, and Statues and Combating Recent Criminal Activity. In this order, the President directed that DHS “shall provide, as appropriate and consistent with applicable law, personnel to assist with the protection of Federal monuments, memorials, statues, or property.”

In furtherance of this directive, I have formalized the DHS Protecting American Communities Task Force (PACT) to provide an ongoing assessment of potential civil unrest and property destruction and to address internal resource allocation and potential surge activity to ensure the continuing protection of people and property.

Additionally, with the consent of other Departments and Agencies, I have determined that it is in the public interest and fiscally sound for FPS to partner with other federal law enforcement to execute the direction of the President. To that end, DHS began coordination with the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Department of the Interior (DOI) to establish information/intelligence sharing and resource coordination as outlined in the order.

Action: The upcoming July 4th holiday weekend has the potential for increased disruptive activity at specific locations across the country that could threaten our personnel and the Federal facilities and property they protect. DHS will be forward leaning in preparing to protect Federal facilities and property.

Components with law enforcement personnel will coordinate with the Office of Operations Coordination and the FPS to:

DHS' Office of Operations Coordination will continue to facilitate Department-level information sharing, reporting, and all other supporting actions across the Components and with our DOJ/DOI partners. FPS will continue to serve as the Department's lead for the protection of Federal facilities and property and shall be supported by Operational Components and all other DHS organizations.



There is a constant ask for who all has been arrested, what charges are the facing, and the outcome. FPS case agents are getting the affidavits done as quick as the can but they are behind. FPS is adding 4 more case agents to help handle the work load.

For OPR, we have been working with (b)(6), (b)(7)(C). He calls often based on news reports and mis-information that is received for who did what. OPR thought it was BORTAC that deployed the LL munition that struck the subject in the head. We were able to clarify that and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) has been doing a good job keeping OPR informed and current on the situation.

Reporting is somewhat stable for reporting times, but the DHS NOC is constantly changing what they want and when. Right now, I send an initial Sit Rep to the Commissioner's SITROOM at 0600 EST and then the one page wrap up at 1000 hours. The NOC wants reports at 0300-0500 for the AS1 0800 briefing and I have pushed back on that since information is incomplete at that time on the West Coast. As long as you get the correct info to the SITROOM, they will handle the distribution of it. The SITROOM does call several times a day to get clarifying info.

That is the main POC and work flow at HQ for coordination. Below is from (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and what his daily rhythm is. The connection between the ground piece and the HQ piece has been good and having that direct call link is essential.

Below is the outline and current battle rhythm for how this has been going at HQ as well as some notes from (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) in Portland. The last stand by roster that was done for USBP and OFO is attached along

with the AS1 Action memo and FPS POCs.

This began on June 26th following the President's Executive Order: Protecting American Monuments, Memorials, Statues, and Combating Recent Criminal Activity. AS1 then formalized the DHS Protecting American Communities Task Force (PACT) to provide an ongoing assessment and internal resourcing to protect federal property and personnel. Operational Support, led by EAC William Ferrara and DEAC Linda Jacksta, asked me to be the lead for CBP for the response efforts over the 4th of July Holiday weekend. EAC Ferrara is the primary CBP rep for the PACT but asks USBP for all the info and COAs and does often defer to me for briefing on the SNAP OPSDEPS calls. We had already established the working relationship with the EOC, IICC, and SITROOM tie ins based on the NCR response efforts during early June for the D.C. protests. This was only intended to be short term but has now turned out to be a long term effort in Portland with no end in sight.

The DHS PACT is led by Christopher Tomney. He is retired USCG. The main person I deal with at DHS is Shawn Phillips. He is the Deputy Chief of Staff (Operations) and understands real world tactics from his military days.

FPS is the lead agency that the PACT is allocating resources to. POCs for FPS that I deal with are below. [REDACTED] is who I talk to daily and make sure all our sit reps line up with what they are reporting to ensure we do not send DHS any conflicting reports. FPS is very likely to ask for an increase in the next day or two with the new fencing going in.

- 07/06/2020 at 2355 hours PST: Protesters have moved east away from the courthouse. Protesters appear to be staging in front of the Justice Center building next to the courthouse. Information gathered from social media indicates that the protesters are being told not to incite Federal Agencies within the Federal Courthouse. USBP SOG team is prepared to respond to other locations if requested.
- 07/07/2020 at 2445 hours PST: USBP SOG arrested three subjects that were pointing harmful green lasers directly into the eyes and faces of USBP SOG and FPS personnel in observation positions. All three subjects are currently in custody of the FPS.
- 07/07/2020 at 0147 hours PST: Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by SOG personnel. Federal Courthouse was not targeted by protesters this evening due to heavy federal enforcement actions over the last two nights. No injuries sustained by SOG personnel.

On July 7, 2020 at 2100 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all (b)(7)(E) forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E). The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at (b)(7)(E) along with (b)(7)(E) Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers (b)(7)(E) U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and (b)(7)(E) Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

- 07/08/2020 at 2400 hours PST: USBP SOG Operators were conducting observation on suspicious subjects near the Edith Green Federal Building. During this time, USBP SOG personnel were targeted with harmful green lasers. As a result of the laser deployment, USBP SOG personnel attempted to perform an arrest. A foot pursuit ensued from the federal building into the Chapman Park area where several other protesters were congregated.

A group of over 200 protesters saw our personnel chasing the subject. The protesters began assaulting agents with rocks and bottles as they ran towards the USBP SOG team. No SOG personnel were injured, one FPS Officer rolled his ankle.

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/8/20 to 7/9/20: 1700-0300 hours PST

On July 8, 2020 at 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all ~~(b)(7)(E)~~ forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the ~~(b)(7)(E)~~ located at ~~(b)(7)(E)~~. The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at ~~(b)(7)(E)~~ along with ~~(b)(7)(E)~~ Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, ~~(b)(7)(E)~~ U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and ~~(b)(7)(E)~~ Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

- 07/08/2020 at 2110 hours PST: An individual that has been observed assaulting law enforcement personnel with a laser and destroying federal property (video surveillance camera) over the last couple of days was seen by the USBP SOG observation team in Lownsdale Square Park. The subject is also responsible for the injuries to HSI Special Agent ~~(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)~~ whom is currently unable to work due to the injury. SOG recon teams were sent to canvas the federal park area in an attempt to confirm the identity the subject. During this sweep, the recon team positively identified the individual and reported his location back to the command center. The recon team sent a picture of the individual for confirmation and positive ID was established. USBP SOG command formulated a plan to deploy ~~(b)(7)(E)~~ mobile teams comprised of SOG BORTAC, SOG US Marshalls and HSI SRT with FPS support and SOG BORTAC overwatch to apprehend the individual. The teams converged on the individual in the northeast corner of Lownsdale Square Park near the corner of 3rd avenue and SW Salmon Street. The subject attempted to flee the area, but was apprehended by the combined units. The subject was escorted back to the Hatfield Courthouse without incident. No less lethal was deployed. Two law enforcement personnel sustained minor injuries during the apprehension, one SOG BORTAC agent and one US Marshall. The subject was asked and stated that he had not sustained any injuries and declined any medical attention.

- 07/09/2020 at 0130 PST: A white SUV crossover that according to social media posts is a 2018 Kia Sportage with Oregon license plate ~~(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)~~ was driving recklessly through the protesters and throwing out fireworks. The vehicle appeared to crash into the foundation of the Elk statue in Chapman park. A crowd of protester converged on the vehicle to confront the occupants. After some arguing, the protesters allowed the vehicle to leave the scene. As the vehicle was leaving, an individual in the vehicle was reported to have fired 5 or 6 shots into the air above the heads of the protesters. No protesters were reported to have been injured. Soon afterwards, social media posts and live streams claimed that the vehicle was still in the general location. SOG BORTAC and FPS deployed ~~(b)(7)(E)~~ mobile teams to canvass the area in a search for the vehicle.
- 07/09/2020; 0230: Situation update: The mobile teams consisted of SOG BORTAC, SOG US Marshalls, and FPS personnel. The mobile teams search was negative on locating the suspects' vehicle. All law enforcement personnel have returned to the Hatfield Courthouse without injury. Protesters have dispersed and all SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No munitions were required to be used by USBP SOG personnel. The Federal Courthouse was not targeted by protesters this evening due to heavy federal enforcement actions over the last three nights.

On July 10, 2020 at 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), all 29 forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located (b)(7)(E). The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at (b)(7)(E) along with (b)(7)(E) Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, (b)(7)(E) U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and (b)(7)(E) Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

The teams are divided between (b)(7)(E) locations;

(b)(7)(E)

07/11/2020 at 2110 hours PST: A subject was told to leave the federal property at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. When he refused, USBP SOG, SOG US Marshalls and FPS deployed to arrest the subject. The subject ran through the park to evade arrest. When law enforcement pursued, they began to be assaulted by the crowd. The primary subject was arrested and well as another subject that assaulted a US Marshall. (b)(7)(E) was deployed by USBP SOG, SOG US Marshalls and FPS to push the crowd away from the law enforcement personnel who were being assaulted. Law enforcement personnel are still on scene at the location of the subject that was in need of medical assistance. The situation is very fluid and updates will follow as details are received.

07/11/2020 at 2330 hours PST: All law enforcement personnel are back in their respective buildings. There was an additional arrest of a subject for failure to leave the federal property. The protesters are using shields, umbrellas, gas masks and goggles. They continue to engage law enforcement personnel and then retreat into the crowd. This crowd of protesters are much different from the previous night of protesters. They are better organized and more violent. They are much more willing to engage with law enforcement. Protesters were walking a young child between the crowd and the law enforcement personnel. A warning was given to them to depart from federal property and they eventually complied with the request.

07/11/2020 at 2345 hours PST: Protesters are crowding the property line for the Hatfield Federal Courthouse and are ignoring multiple warnings. Protester radio traffic stated that they were moving shields and umbrellas forward to ward off CS gas canisters. FPS used a loud speaker to move the crowd back. SOG recon team reported a sUAS launching location in the park and provided the coordinates to the (b)(7)(E). Social media is showing video of an individual whom they claim was injured from less lethal munitions. EMS responded and the subject was taken to the hospital. No further information available at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0025 hours PST: The crowd of protesters had been repeatedly crossing the property line at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. They were ignoring warnings over the loud speaker to move back from the building. The protesters then began throwing hard objects and shooting fireworks at law enforcement personnel. USBP SOG, SOG US Marshalls and FPS personnel deployed less lethal munitions to include

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(b)(7)(E) against the crowd of protesters pushing them back into the park across the street from the courthouse. No law enforcement personnel were injured and no protesters appear to have been injured at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0110 hours PST: The law enforcement personnel at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse attempted to move back inside after giving the protesters warnings not to follow them onto the sidewalk surrounding the building. As law enforcement personnel moved into the building, the protesters followed them and began throwing objects at them. Less lethal munitions were deployed to include (b)(7)(E). Law enforcement personnel moved back into the building and continued to issue warnings to stay off federal property. No law enforcement personnel were injured and no protesters appear to have been injured at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0155 hours PST: A protester was observed defacing the Hatfield Federal Courthouse and another was refusing to leave the federal property. USBP SOG, SOG US Marshalls and FPS deployed and arrested both individuals. Less lethal munitions were deployed to include (b)(7)(E). Portland Police Bureau declared the area surrounding the federal buildings downtown closed to the public. In conjunction with Portland Police Bureau, USBP SOG, SOG US Marshalls and FPS pushed protesters out of the area. Federal law enforcement personnel moved back into the building. Portland Police Bureau remained at the edge of the perimeter keeping the protesters out the downtown area. No law enforcement personnel were injured and no protesters appear to have been injured at this time.

07/12/2020 at 0330 hours PST: Prior to the USBP SOG, SOG US Marshall and FPS deployment, rioters were issued warnings via a loud speaker to remain off of federal property and to not assault law enforcement personnel. On July 12, 2020 at 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), USBP SOG, SOG US Marshalls, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Region 10 Director that the decision had been made, collectively, by the United States Marshall for the District of Oregon, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and the FPS Regional Director to reduce the proactive posture by teams at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. The Director briefed that the operational posture to be taken would be to seal the courthouse and hold a non-reactive posture to all minor violations without a Law Enforcement response or resolution. The Director advised that Federal enforcement action from the Federal Courthouse would only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points.

After the brief, all (b)(7)(E) forward deployed SOG personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E). The USBP SOG team conducted an operations brief and were deployed in mobile units, to the (b)(7)(E) and to the (b)(7)(E). Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers are deployed between the three Federal buildings (b)(7)(E) U.S. Marshal's Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) Enforcement and Removal (ERO) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel are pre-staged at the (b)(7)(E). SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to Federal property and personnel.

07/13/2020 at 0015 hours PST: Protesters attempted to barricade the front doors of the Hatfield Federal Courthouse with sheets of plywood. They also set-up plywood barriers at the edge of the sidewalk and tied fishing line across the steps of the front of the courthouse. From live stream video, mallets, wrist rockets and tasers have been observed in the crowd. One individual was observed shooting the courthouse and the Justice Center with the wrist rocket. Law Enforcement witnessed over 20 individual instances of vandalism to the courthouse throughout the night.

At 1700 hours Pacific Daylight Time (PDT), USBP SDC/SOD, SOG BORTAC key leaders, SOG US Marshalls, ERO SRT, and FPS Team leaders were briefed by FPS Region 10 Director that the Law Enforcement Posture from the previous night, would remain the same. The posture will be reactive only by teams at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. The courthouse will be sealed and all minor violations against the Federal property will not be reacted to by law enforcement. Federal enforcement action from

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the Federal Courthouse will only occur in response to major felonies occurring, including attempts to breach the courthouse, setting fire to the structure, or attempts to barricade the egress points.

After the brief (b)(7)(E) forward deployed SDC/SOD personnel reported to the (b)(7)(E) located at (b)(7)(E). The SDC/SOD team conducted an operations brief and were deployed at the (b)(7)(E) and the (b)(7)(E) Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers are deployed between the three Federal buildings. (b)(7)(E) U.S. Marshal's Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel are staged at the (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(E) Enforcement and Removal (ERO) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel are staged at the (b)(7)(E) Building. SDC/SOD will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to Federal property and personnel.

A large crowd, approximately 400-500 protestors, gathered and focused attention at the Portland Police Association (PPA) Building (Non-Federal), located at 1868 N Lombard St, Portland, OR 97209 (Approximately 4 miles away from the Hatfield Courthouse). (b)(7)(E) Portland Police Bureau (PPB) Officers were on location and protecting the facility while city workers were boarding up the glass. Situational reporting indicates that the protest is against Police Unions, believed to be protecting Police Officers, and to further the movement to defund police.

7/13/20 at 2345 hours PST: Rioters began to assault Portland Police Officers at the Police Association Building with harmful laser pointers and set mattresses on fire to block routes of ingress/egress.

7/14/20 at 0008 hours PST: Rioters began assaulting Portland Police Officers and City Workers with rocks and bricks, one of the Officers was struck in the helmet with a large rock. Portland Police maneuvered crowd control elements to disperse the crowd.

7/14/20 at 0011 hours PST: PPB declared the demonstration a riot and have begun moving the crowd away from the PPA Building.

7/14/20 at 0025 hours PST: PPB continues to be assaulted with hard objects and encounter resistance from the large group of rioters.

7/14/20 at 0100 hours PST: PPB continues to push the rioters away from the PPA building. They continue to be assaulted intermittently with objects.

7/14/20 at 0200 hours PST: PPB pushed the crowd approximately two blocks away from the PPA and are holding ground.

7/14/20 at 0200 hours PST: The crowd in front of the Hatfield Courthouse remained small and peaceful.

7/14/20 at 0215 hours PST: Nothing significant to report at the Federal Facilities. All USBP personnel have been released. No arrests were made. No vandalism reported. No Use of Force incidents.

7/14/20 at 2045 hours PST: Open source reporting indicated a group of 300-400 protestors gathered at the Portland City Hall would be relocating to the Pioneer Courthouse. The protestors are moving from the City Hall building and arriving in Pioneer Square located directly in front of the Pioneer Courthouse. Protestors are currently peaceful.

7/14/20 at 2045 hours PST: FPS deployed (b)(7)(E) Officers and SDC/SOD deployed (b)(7)(E) mobile units (agents) to the (b)(7)(E) for situational awareness. (b)(7)(E) law enforcement are deployed into the crowd at Lowndale Park in front of the Hatfield Courthouse to observe and gain situational awareness.

07/14/20 at 2100 hours PST: Protestors departed from Pioneer Square and relocated to the Justice Center, just north of the Hatfield Courthouse. Protester numbers are 300-400. Protestors remain peaceful.

07/14/20 at 2318 hours PST: A subject placed a plywood board with nails pointing up in front of the Hatfield Courthouse Front door in an attempt to prevent law enforcement from exiting the building.**No Law enforcement response was initiated.

07/14/20 at 2320 hours PST: Protestors have barricaded several streets, setting up signs to indicate the area is the "Chinook Land Autonomous Territory" "CLOT". Open source reporting indicates the PNW Youth Liberation Front is organizing the occupation.

- Portland Police Bureau (PPB) has indicated that they will not allow the protestors to occupy the parks.
- PPB advised they intend to clear the park and all barricades before 7:00AM (PST)

07/14/20 at 2330 hours PST: A fire was reported in Terry Schunk Plaza (Federal Property) to the east of the Edith Green Federal Building. FPS Officers investigated and determined it to be a bottle full of flammable liquid. FPS extinguished the fire and returned to the Edith Green Building. No arrests or subjects were identified associated to the fire.

- 0224 hours PST (b)(7)(E) agents made Positive Identification of the assaulter. Subject was located walking south on 3rd toward Madison in a small group. Agents will continue to maintain visual until the

07/15/2020 at 0300 hours PST: The crowds were remaining peaceful and all personnel were ordered released by FPS. As FPS and ERO SRT were exiting the Edith Green Federal Building, their vehicles were assaulted with lasers and hard objects. SDC/SOD BORTAC has vehicles remaining at the Edith Green Building and were attempting to re-enter the building. Protestors blocked the ingress route to the parking structure.

- 0315 hours PST: FPS contacted PPB to provide assistance. PPB advised that they would not be responding.
- 0325 hours PST: ERO SRT returned to assist SDC/SOD re-enter the building to recover their vehicles.
- 0340 hours PST: ERO SRT blocked the street to allow SDC/SOD to re-enter the Edith Green Building, but were unable to hold the street as they were being assaulted with hard objects. Exit was blocked by rioters and law enforcement personnel were not able to depart the area. 0345 hours PST: SDC/SOD exited the Edith Green Building on foot and ordered the crowd (approx. 50-75 subjects) to back away from Federal property to allow the vehicles to exit. The crowd refused several orders to depart Federal property. SDC/SOD was assaulted with hard objects. SDC/SOD deployed less lethal and (b)(7)(E) munitions in order to disperse the hostile rioters. SDC/SOD pushed the rioters away from the Edith Green Federal Building but the crowd refused to stay away. SDC/SOD pushed the crowd from the Edith Green Building to the Hatfield Federal Courthouse. SDC/SOD was met at the Hatfield Federal Courthouse by FPS and entered the building.
- 0400 hours PST: SDC/SOD was escorted by FPS and additional agents back to the Edith Green Building to recover their vehicles.

07/15/2020 at 0415 hours PST: No other significant incidents to report at the Federal Facilities. No arrests were made and no injuries to law enforcement reported. All USBP personnel have been released.

FPS reports that on four occasions tonight, individuals were witnessed by security camera defacing/vandalizing the Hatfield Courthouse. **No Law Enforcement response.

- Seattle, WA PAX: OFO SRT is providing SRT Officers from the Blaine POE, USBP is providing agents from the Blaine Sector (BLW) and agents from the Spokane Sector, (SPW) to support FPS in Seattle, WA.
- Standby SOG RDT PAX: USBP SOG will maintain agents on standby in El Paso, TX, able to deploy to any location within the United States within hours of notification via AMO flight(s).
- Secondary Standby Team LESC has identified agents/officer to assist DOI in Gettysburg if requested. OFO in Baltimore will provide officers to assist DOI if requested. Blaine Sector has an additional agents identified to support FPS in Seattle if requested.
- AMO has staged aircraft and necessary flight crews in Corpus Christie, TX to provide air transport to the USBP SOG RDT in El Paso, TX to a location TBD. Stand by times are 1000-1800 CDT
- AMO is presently on standby at the request of the Detroit Police Department to provide air support.
- AMO will have a Mobile Command Center stationed in Seattle to cover events in Settle and Portland.
- An AMO from Chicago and a Aircraft from Detroit will provide support in St Louis, Missouri if requested by DOJ. Response time from notification is hours to St Louis.
- AMO helicopters are available locally in the NCR if requested.
- USBP Sectors have identified an additional personnel that could be activated in response to support requests beyond what is pre-deployed and identified as fly away teams. USBP personnel are assigned to Special Operations teams and are trained and equipped to respond to mobile field force situations.
- OFO Field Offices have identified an additional personnel that could be activated in response to support requests beyond what is pre-deployed and identified as fly away teams. OFO SRT identified personnel are trained and equipped to respond to mobile filed force situations. The additional CBPOs have

CBP Portland Team Sit Rep 7/3/20 to 7/4/20:

On July 3, 2020, all [redacted] SOG personnel reported to the [redacted] (b)(7)(E) located at [redacted] (b)(7)(E) [redacted] (b)(7)(E). The SOG team conducted an operations brief and are pre-staged at the [redacted] (b)(7)(E) along with [redacted] Federal Protective Service (FPS) Officers, [redacted] U.S. Marshal Special Operations Group (MSOG) personnel and [redacted] Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Response Team (SRT) personnel. SOG will conduct quick reaction force (QRF) duties in support of FPS operations providing security and safety to federal property and personnel.

- 07/03/20 at 2230 hours PDT: [redacted] (b)(7)(E)
[redacted] (b)(7)(E)
- 07/04/2020 at 0100 hours PDT: A group of approximately 30 protesters gathered at the courthouse, became violent and broke a courthouse window. No law enforcement action was taken.
- 07/04/2020 at 0349 hours PDT: The group of 30 protesters broke the two front doors of the courthouse and were attempting to enter the building. Due to the violent actions of the protesters and safety concerns, USBP SOG team deployed less lethal [redacted] (b)(7)(E) and [redacted] (b)(7)(E) munitions to regain control of the building and protect all law enforcement personnel.
- 07/04/2020 at 0419 hours PDT: The SOG team and other law enforcement partners have pushed the group of protesters away from the courthouse front doors, past the closed off street and off the federal park property.
- 07/04/2020 at 0427 hours PDT: The protesters returned and came back on to federal park property. Federal law enforcement personnel, to include USBP SOG, were able to deter the protesters from advancing further. Protesters are now off federal park property. The USBP SOG team and law enforcement partners have formed a line on the edge of the federal park property.
- 07/04/2020 at 0450 hours PDT: USBP SOG team and law enforcement partners have returned to the courthouse and are holding a line just outside of the front doors that were destroyed by violent protesters. Contractors are in-route to repair the doors. 40 plus protesters remain in the federal park area and appear to be calm at the moment. No injuries to the SOG team or any other law enforcement partners reported at this time.
- 07/04/2020 at 0515 hours PDT: The SOG Mission Commander advised that during the protester's violent attack, the protesters used baseball bats to break the front doors of the courthouse. During the encounter, protesters attempted to assault the SOG team and other law enforcement personnel with beer bottles, frozen water bottles, and frozen eggs. The SOG personnel were struck by these objects, however no SOG personnel were seriously injured. No serious injuries to the protesters are known at this time.
- 07/04/2020 at 0525 hours: Contractors are on-scene and are repairing the broken doors. Law Enforcement personnel are continuing to remain in a protection posture.
- 07/04/2020 at 0555 hours: SOG personnel have moved inside the courthouse and the Portland Police Department has assumed outside security. There are only approximately 15 protesters remaining on-scene and appear to be passive at this time.
- 07/04/2020 at 0745 hours: No [redacted] (b)(7)(E) munitions were used against violent protesters by USBP SOG personnel. SOG BORTAC was able to accomplish a proper law enforcement response with [redacted] (b)(7)(E) [redacted] (b)(7)(E) munitions. The courthouse doors have been re-sealed, the remaining protesters have dispersed and all USBP SOG personnel have cleared the scene. No arrests were reported by CBP personnel.

CBP Seattle Team Sit Rep 7/3/20 to 7/4/20:

Small groups of protesters were reported that remained peaceful throughout the shift. No law enforcement action taken by any CBP personnel during the shift.

- 1602 hours (PDT): Agents and officers are on duty at their respective locations. No activity currently reported

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- 1700 hours: Approximately 50 protesters are in front of the Henry Jackson Fed Building protesting immigration related issues. Peaceful at this time.
- 1730 hours: Group of protesters are still in front of Jackson Building. Peaceful at this time. Waving flags and banners and giving speeches about U.S./Filipino relations. Seems that it was part of a national protest to happen at 1730 PDT.
- 1815 hours: Protesters at the Jackson Federal Building have left. All other locations quiet at this time.
- 1916 hours: No activity at all locations.
- 2141 hours: 700 Stewart Courthouse has approximately 30 protesters on the corner between the courthouse and the Seattle PD West precinct.
- 2236 hours: Protesters are peaceful and just sitting on the ground in front of the Seattle PD at 8th and Virginia near 700 Stewart Courthouse. Size is still approximately 30.
- 2355 Hours: Protesters at Seattle PD have left the area. Both other locations quiet.
- 0100 hours: All agents and officers are secure for the night and have concluded support operations.
