




#### (U//FOUO) Nationwide Protests

#### (U) Current Situation

(U//FOUO) The nation has seen an increase in protests, sponsored by multiple domestic organizations, following the death of George Floyd. Based on open source and social media reporting, the majority of these protests, sponsored by the "Black Lives Matter (BLM)" movement have remained peaceful. However, due to nefarious actors using these protests as façades, there have been incidents where law enforcement (LE) officials have needed to respond with escalated force — incidents including the use of pepper spray, riot shields, and rubber bullets. LE have had to use non-lethal, and in some cases lethal, force to control the civil unrest in cities around the nation. LE has suffered over 100 injuries, dozens of LE vehicles destroyed, and there are reports of police stations being burnt down. While many of these protests have occurred around major cities, some have occurred near CBP locations to include CBP headquarters where there has been protests and some looting.

-(U//FOUO) Protests are to resume this weekend with multiple protests scheduled in the D.C. region. As a result, streets throughout the D.C. region (see map below) will be posted as "Emergency No Parking" and there will be restrictions to vehicular traffic at intermittent times for demonstrations beginning on Saturday, 13 June at 6:00 am and extending through Sunday, 14 June to 11:59 pm. If street closures are made, vehicles will be allowed to enter the restricted area if they are on essential business or traveling to-and-from their residence.

(U//FOUO) Road Closures in D.C. Region for 12 14 June



(U//FOUO) The DHS Pacific Northwest Region (PNR) remains engaged with the Seattle Police Department (SPD) regarding the East Precinct in Capitol Hill and any associated threats of violence against critical infrastructure and key resources (CIKR) and law enforcement (LE) in the area. At this time, there has been no violence reported, with SPD. State officials are continuing to monitor the situation. At this time, SPD has not requested mutual aid or additional assistance; it is unclear when/if SPD will re-occupy the East Precinct. FPS has indicated threats of violence from violent opportunists remain a viable option; however, there are currently no direct threats recorded for this time period.

(U//FOUO) Portland Police Bureau (PPB) declared a large crowd gathered in front of the Justice Center an unlawful assembly again on the night of 13 June at approximately 10:50pm PDT due to lasers and projectiles (glass bottles, full beverage containers, rocks, and other projectiles) being used against law enforcement officers. Unidentified individuals aggressively pushed and climbed the fence protecting the justice center cutting out several panels of fencing, several individuals then breached the fence into the secured area. PPB made several arrests while dispersing the crowd. At approximately 12:30am PDT 14 June, unidentified individuals in a group of 100 near Vista Avenue and Jackson Street (a group likely dispersed from the Justice Center) threw mortars and fireworks at law enforcement officers.

- <del>(U//FOUO)</del> PPB discovered and "disarmed" a 3-4 inch device on the night of 12 June 2020 near the Justice Center (NFI).

(U//FOUO) More than 100 people were arrested in London on 13 June after violence broke out as individuals targeted BLM demonstrations. The offenses as of 2100 (local) included violent disorder, assault on officers, possession of an offensive weapon, possession of class A drugs, and drunken disorder, London's Metropolitan Police said in a tweet. Individuals bombarded police with bottles and occasionally scuffled violently with officers as they staged a counter-protest in central London.

-(U//FOUO) Tensions continue to rise in Atlanta, Georgia after Rayshard Brooks was killed on 12 June.


- (U//FOUO) At 2151, protesters started three different fires in the vicinity of the Wendy's building

- where Rayshard Brooks was shot.
- <del>(U//FOUO)</del> At 2210, local news reported "dozens' of protesters were arrested as police were trying to clear a highway in Downtown Atlanta.
- (U//FOUO) At 2219, the interior of Wendy's was on fire and flames were visible from the drivethrough window and dining window.
- (U//FOUO) At 2240, flames at the Wendy's broke through the roof and the restaurant was fully engulfed with flames.
- (U//FOUO) As of 2400, police stated they arrested 36 protesters.
- (U//FOUO) As of 0630, protesters return to the Wendy's as smoke was still billowing from the burnt down building.

On June 26, the President issued an Executive Order Protecting American Monuments, Memorials, and Statues and Combating Recent Criminal Activity. In this order, he directed that DHS "shall provide, as appropriate and consistent with applicable law, personnel to assist with the protection of Federal monuments, memorials, statues, or property." The Department plays a key role in protecting Federal facilities and property primarily through the Federal Protective Service (FPS) in partnership with other DHS law enforcement Components, interagency partners, and state and local partners. Recently our country saw several bad actors and instigators use peaceful protests to harm people and property, both Federal and private. For the past month, these bad actors have persisted resulting in numerous threats, disruption, and damage to Federal facilities and property.

The DHS Acting Secretary, Chad F. Wolf (AS1), in furtherance of the Presidential directive, formalized the DHS Protecting American Communities Task Force (PACT) to provide an ongoing assessment of potential civil unrest and property destruction and to address internal resource allocation and potential surge activity to ensure the continuing protection of people and property. AS1 issued a memorandum to all DHS Law Enforcement components to coordinate with the Office of Operations Coordination FPS to provide PACT Rapid Deployment Teams (RDT) to protect federal facilities and property through the July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday weekend.

CBP will provid (b)(7)(E) personnel to support FPS in Portland, OR, Seattle, WA, and Washington, DC, through the July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday weekend in order to protect federal facilities and property.

#### I. SITUATION

#### A. General Situation:

The upcoming July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday weekend has the potential for increased disruptive activity at specific locations and across the country that could threaten our personnel and the Federal facilities and property they protect. DHS will be forward leaning in preparing to protect Federal facilities and property.

AS1, in his memorandum entitled, "DHS Support to Protect Federal Facilities and Property" directed that RDTs (with appropriate training, equipment, and command and control) be prepositioned in Portland, OR; Seattle, WA; and the District of Columbia, no later than 2 July to be used in a reserve force role. AS1 further directed that regional RDT be established and placed on standby to be used as a strategic reserve that (b)(7)(E)

Standby RDTs are to be established by 2

July. All personnel assigned to one of the RDTs will complete FPS cross-designation consent

July. All personnel assigned to one of the RDTs will complete FPS cross-designation consent and the appropriate training to legally allow them to support the protection of Federal facilities and property. This action is also to be completed by 2 July. FPS will be the Department lead,

supported by other DHS LE components. DHS Operations Coordination will facilitate information sharing, reporting and supporting actions across the components with our Department of Justice (DOJ) and Department of the Interior (DOI) partners.

#### B. Terrain/Weather:

Terrain and weather will be determined by the area of operations agents are deployed to.

#### C. Criminal Element:

No specific criminal element has been identified. Recent activity at the locations of interest are described below for situational awareness.

All information is as of June 29, 2020:

#### Portland, OR

Protesters blocked roads around the Justice Center again Sunday night, following eight arrests on Saturday night after demonstrators pulled barriers into a main intersection there and resisted police efforts to remove them. There were no reports of injury or impact to federal property.

#### Seattle, WA

Protest activity was again relatively subdued, with no reported damage to federal facilities. There were early Monday morning (0130 PT) social media reports of shots fired in the Capitol Hill Occupied Protest (CHOP) zone, but no initial word of any injuries.

FBI reports The Seattle Mayor's office continues to negotiate with the CHOP zone leaders to dismantle the area and disperse; however, the attempted barrier removal on 26 Jun prompted a swell in the number of protesters from a couple dozen to more than 100.

#### Washington, DC

There were no reports of injury or damage to federal facilities on Sunday. Among several other planned protests, a small group outside a business owner's Dupont Circle home remained peaceful.

On 28 Jun, NGB reported (b)(7)(E) Guardsmen activated in response to DC civil disturbances.







Staging/Assignment location for Portland, OR:




Staging/Assignment location for Seattle, WA:





-(u//FOUS)—The D.C. Mayor announced that she will cancel the curfew tonight due to no protesters being arrested Wednesday night. Additionally, Los Angeles and Seattle have also reportedly canceled curfews that have been in place the past several nights.

(U//FOUO) Unconfirmed intelligence from the Army National Guard reportedly anticipates approximately 250,000 individuals to be used in this weekend. As of 1700 there was no further information to corroborate this reporting.

-(U//FOUO) Social media users are circulating a flyer calling for a #WakeEmUp march at 0600 on 6 June. The flyer states that it is a non-violent protest targeting "the most gentrified neighborhoods" in the DMV area.

(U) As of 2200 EST there is nothing significant to report relating to threats against LE or nefarious actors using protests to incite violence.

A Brooklyn man who delivered a threat to New Yorkers during a live interview on 6 June has been
charged with multiple offenses, including making terroristic threats. During a live interview a man who
identified himself as (b)(6) threatened to burn down the Diamond District if New York Governor
Andrew Cuomo and New York City Mayor Bill de Blasio did not meet with protestors. (b)(6) whose real
name is (b)(6) has been charged with one count each of making terroristic threats, aggravated
harassment and false reporting. As of 1500, he is in central booking and has not been released.

The Philadelphia Police Department have reported receiving recorded messages with a male voice calling for officers to be fired or to quit. The recording then states, "We're coming for you." The messages note that the calls will repeat every 15 minutes until justice is brought to individuals who violated protestors' rights. (U) According to open source reporting, at approx. 2345, 2 NYPD officers were shot and another was stabbed during a confrontation in Brooklyn. All 3 officers are in stable condition at a local hospital, and the suspect is in critical condition after being shot multiple times. The altercation started by the suspect who stabbed one of the officers in the neck while he was on a foot patrol.

(U//FOUO) Mayor Eric Garcetti announce that, barring setbacks, curfews in Los Angeles would be discontinued after tonight. The current curfew is emplace from 2100 last night through 0500 this morning.

 (U//FOUO) Mayor Garcetti announce that Los Angeles will cut \$100-\$150 million from the police budget as part of a sweeping effort to make greater investments in the black community.

(U//FOUO) Late Wednesday evening, Governor Mike Parson stated he was sending Missouri National guard troops to Washington D.C. to supplement law enforcement. No reports of how many troops will be sent to D.C. and according to Parson, it will take a day or two before they arrive in the capital.

<del>(U//FOUO)</del> LAPD Chief Michel Moore reported there has been over 3,600 arrests, with around 3,400 of those for failure to disperse or curfew violations, since the unrest began. More than 61 people have been

charged for looting and other crimes for incidents in Los Angeles, and the District Attorney's Office said it expects additional cases to be presented by law enforcement this week.

 (U) According to open source reporting, at least 9,300 people have been arrested in protests around the country.

(U//FOUO) Federal prosecutors in Las Vegas have charged three men alleged to be members of the farright extremist "Boogaloo" movement with multiple state and federal violations of conspiracy to commit an act of terrorism, material support for committing an act of terrorism and multiple explosives violations.

(U//FOUO) Social media continues to be used for threats against President Trump and Law Enforcement around the nation.

(LL//FOLIO) As of 2130, an hour and a half before curfew, there are between 2 – 3 thousand protesters in Washington D.C. Like the majority of the protests around the nation today, they have remained peaceful for the most part.

(LL//FOLIO) Follow up to the earlier reporting that stated the active-duty military personnel who were brought in to help combat violent protesters are beginning to return to their home base, there are new reports stating the Secretary of Defense is backing down form that decision and they will remain on standby.

(U//FOUO) Further research and collaboration revealed that on 2 June 2020 Twitter USPER deleted the account "Antifa US", responsible for the previously noted "Purge America" post, for violating site policy after internal investigative efforts revealed that Identity Evropa—a white supremacist extremist (WSE) organization based in Europe—was the actual account operator. This account published the tweet dated 31 May calling for looting and violence in suburban neighborhoods. Twitter stated that the account violated its policies against speech inciting violence and misrepresentation.

(U//FOUO) As of 1335, Twitter USPER user posts Police in Cincinnati looking for Black BMW with Kentucky license plates that drove into a crowd of protesters at Cincinnati City Hall.

(U//FOUO) Cincinnati Police Depart followed that tweet with another stating they do not believe this
incident to be an intentional act.

(U//FOUO) As of 1130, Twitter USBUS user posts photos of mounds of bricks staged in the cities of New York, Dallas, Fayetteville, Cedar Rapids, Raleigh and Fort Meyers.

(U<del>//FOUO)</del> As of 1200 Washington, D.C. Mayor Muriel Bowser announced that the city would be under a 2300 curfew on 3 June in response to the protests over the death of George Floyd.

<del>-(U//FOUO)</del> As of 1400, media reports indicate Minnesota's attorney general will reportedly announce an elevated murder charge for former Minneapolis officer Derek Chauvin<sup>USPER</sup> and other charges for his fellow arresting officers in the death of George Floyd.



(H//FOLIO) Open source reporting states multiple social media platforms have suspended a number of accounts associated with white nationalist groups after they advocated bringing weapons to ongoing protests in the US. The social media companies also took down a number of pages and accounts which were connected to a fake Antifa account operated by white supremacists.

(LY//FOLIO) Media reports indicate worldwide civil unrest do to the death of George Floyd. US Embassies have been attacked with protesters attacked police with Molotov cocktails, stones and other objects in cities such as Athens, Greece.

#### (U) Current Situation

(U//FOUO) The nation has seen an increase in protests, sponsored by multiple domestic organizations, following the death of George Floyd. Based on open source and social media reporting, the majority of these protests, sponsored by the "Black Lives Matter "SPER" movement have remained peaceful. However, due to nefarious actors using these protests as façades, there have been incidents where law enforcement (LE) officials have needed to respond with escalated force – incidents including the use of pepper spray, riot shields, and rubber bullets. LE have had to use non-lethal, and in some cases lethal, force to control the civil unrest in cities around the nation. LE has suffered over 100 injuries, dozens of LE vehicles destroyed, and there are reports of police stations being burnt down. While many of these protests have occurred around major cities, some have occurred near CBP locations to include CBP headquarters where there has been protests and some looting.

(U//FOUO) Social media reporting indicates an uptick of videos capturing violence between police and civilians. The videos being circulated are resulting in increased inflammatory rhetoric toward law enforcement across social media sites. Additionally, individuals and social activist groups are demanding accountability.

(LL//FOLIO) One social media post is calling for protestors to bring bear spray to protests and confront "pigs" who try to pepper spray them.

(U//FOUO) According to open source reporting, a leaked document revealed details of federal law enforcement and military personnel in Washington, D.C., including 1,300 officers currently deployed to the south side of the White House. The report noted the 1,300 included U.S. Secret Service, National Guard, CBP and U.S. Park Police. Please see attached for the cover page of the leaked document. (U//FOUO) Open source reporting indicates the area surrounding the White House will remain closed until 10 June due to the ongoing protests in the US capital.

(U//FOUC) As an update to the below reported Anthrax incident yesterday, FBI (b)(7)(E) onducted additional testing, and the substance tested negative.

(LI//FOUO) According to open source reporting, "This Ends Now: A Protest to End Police Brutality in America" will assemble at the White House on 5 June at 1500.

(LI//FOLIO) Around 0215, authorities around in the Marietta, Georgia area stated three protestors had tracked officers to their residences and threw Molotov cocktails at police cars. All three suspects have been arrested and both fires were put out quickly, leaving minor damage to the vehicles

(LIL//FOLIO) Around 0200, several individuals were arrested in downtown Sacramento for violating the fourth night of the citywide curfew.

(U//FOUC) Around 0150, a crowd of more than 1,000 individuals gathered near Waterfront Park in Portland, Oregon, were throwing projectiles at police and climbing the fence. The protestors also vandalized the elk statue and started a small fire. Police did not respond with force and stated they did not want to engage protestors.

(U//FOUC) Around 2200, a Buffalo Police Department spokesperson released an update stating that five individuals were arrested and another individual was injured in a protest in Niagara Square.

(U//FOUO) The majority of protests have remained peaceful. Due to weather conditions in the Washington, D.C. area the majority of protests remain around the Capitol building and a small crowd of 200-300 in Lafayette area.

(U)//FOUC) Around 1630, a Queens, New York, man was arrested after driving his SUV into Black Lives Matter protestors on the sidewalk.



(U//FOUO) At 1428, a suspicious package containing a white powdery substance was found in Springfield, Virginia, at a DEA facility that was reportedly confirmed to be Anthrax. As of 1700, the incident was ongoing.

(U//FOUO) Unconfirmed intelligence from the Army National Guard reportedly anticipates approximately 250,000 individuals to be used in this weekend. As of 1700 there was no further information to corroborate this reporting.

<del>(U//FOUO)</del> The D.C. Mayor announced that she will cancel the curfew tonight due to no protesters being arrested Wednesday night. Additionally, Los Angeles and Seattle have also reportedly canceled curfews that have been in place the past several nights.

(LL//FOLIO) Social media users are circulating a flyer calling for a #WakeEmUp march at 0600 on 6 June. The flyer states that it is a non-violent protest targeting "the most gentrified neighborhoods" in the DMV area.

(U) Current Situation

(U//FOUO) The nation has seen an increase in protests, sponsored by multiple damestic organizations, following the death of George Flayd. Based on open source and social media reporting, the majority of these protests, sponsored by the "Black Lives Matter USBUS" movement have remained peaceful. However, due to nefarious actors using these protests as façades, there have been incidents where law enforcement (LE) officials have needed to respond with escalated force – incidents including the use of pepper spray, riot shields, and rubber bullets. LE have had to use non-lethal, and in some cases lethal, force to control the civil unrest in cities around the nation. While many of these protests have occurred around major cities, some have occurred near CBP locations to include CBP headquarters where there have been protests and some looting.

(U//FOUO) Over the past 24 hours, there have seen numerous protests occur across the nation. Peaceful protest began across Washington, D.C. Around 1800 1 June, Acting Commissioner Morgan tweeted a photo of CBP agents and officers who were in the capital area to support local law enforcement, which garnered multiple threats calling for open season on CBP. Despite Washington D.C. enacting a curfew starting at 1900, several groups were present in the city throughout the night with no law enforcement escalation required. The use of "#CBP" and "@CBP" handles continue to trend in a negative manner towards CBP.

(U//FOUO) Most major cities have enforced curfews, leading to a decrease of violence and unrest in various cities. Additionally, violent protests in multiple California cities continue; however, not at the level of previous nights of protest with many cities enforcing their curfews.

(U//FOUO) As of 1400 2 June, the Pentagon raised its force protection level to FPCON Charlie as a result of the protests. Additionally, all military bases within the National Capitol Region (NCR) will also have increased force protection levels. In response the violence associated with protests six states have declared a state of emergency including: VA, GA, MN, TX, MO and AZ.

(U//FOUO) The California National Guard has deployed approximately 2,500 troops to supplement law enforcement in Los Angeles, Sacramento and Alameda County. Additionally, more than 18,000 National Guard members responding to civil unrest across 29 states and Washington, DC, with that number still increasing.

(U//FOUO) Social media users worldwide have posted support for the protests occurring in the United States. One instance is of protestors in front of the U.S. Embassy in Tel Aviv. They held signs stating "Black Lives Matter" and "No Justice, No Peace". A crowd also gathered in Paris to protest for the black lives matter movement.

(U//LES) Multiple social media users posted anti-CBP rhetoric regarding CBP deployments into the DC area suggesting they are going to kill Americans; as well as encouraging individuals to bring guns and shoot back.


(U//FOUO) As of 0230 3 June, protest, looting, and riots continue across the country despite curfews in effect in multiple cities, although the protests were less intense than previous nights, according to open source.

(U//LES) Individuals are using social media to spread misinformation, possibly with the intent to either incite violence or deter law enforcement operations.

-(U//LES) Threats to CBP and other Law Enforcement partners continue to appear in social media, however, the misinformation on social media further complicates the ability to identify credible threats. CBP NIW shared information regarding the threatening posts with CBP entities within the field for situational awareness and passed to CBP's Publicly Available Information Group (PAIG) for further exploitation.

(U) On late 2 June, the Pentagon confirmed about 1,600 active-duty Army soldiers are now in the Washington, D.C. area in what military officials called a "prudent planning measure" in response to the ongoing protest in the nation's capital.

(U) On 2 June, Facebook USBUS announced it shut down pages and accounts associated with the group American Guard—described as far-right group—planning to bring weapons to protests occurring across the country, according to open source reporting.



(U) EU to Use \$2.7 Billion Fund to Buy Promising COVID-19 Vaccines – The European Union is preparing to use an emergency 2.4-billion- euro (\$2.7 billion) fund to make advance purchases of promising vaccines against the new coronavirus, EU officials told Reuters. The move was discussed at a meeting of EU ambassadors on 3 June, after Germany, France, Italy and the Netherlands said they were speeding up negotiations with pharmaceutical companies to secure access to vaccines currently under development. The EU rainy-day fund, known as the Emergency Support Instrument (ESI), would also be used to increase vaccine production capacity in Europe and offer liability insurance to pharmaceutical companies, officials said, confirming a Reuters report in May. (Reuters)

(U) COVID-19 Infections Slowdown in Finland despite Schools Opening – COVID-19 infections have slowed in Finland over the last two weeks despite the reopening of schools in mid-May, the health ministry said as of 4 June. Schools closed for summer holidays at the end of May, but scientists warned there was still risk of the epidemic regaining strength without social distancing. The prior week, the government lifted its recommendation for citizens to avoid travelling within Finland but has yet to decide whether cross-border leisure travel restrictions will continue beyond 14 June. (U) Guatemala Establishes Four-Stage Plan to Relax COVID-19 Lockdown – On 3 June, the Guatemalan Ministry of Health published Agreement 146-2020 (previously published with errors as Agreement 144-2020), laying out the four stages by which Guatemala will end its COVID-19-related lockdown. Movement to each stage governed by various indicators, such as number of new cases, testing capacity, and availability of personal protective equipment. (Prensa Libre)

(U) China Eases Flight Curbs after United States Targets its Carriers – China will ease coronavirus restrictions to allow more foreign carriers to fly to the mainland, shortly after Washington vowed to bar Chinese airlines from flying to the United States due to Beijing's curbs on U.S. airlines. Qualifying foreign carriers, about 95 of them currently barred from operating flights to China, will be allowed once-a-week flights into a city of their choosing starting on June 8, the Civil Aviation Administration of China. Some countries are still banning international flights; it estimated the number of international flights would increase by 50 to 150 per week. (Reuters)

(U) El Salvador Extends Quarantine through 15 June – On 3 June, the Ministry of Health of El Salvador announced that the present nationwide stay-at-home order, which began on 21 March, and was scheduled, to end on 6 June 2020, but now, would remain in effect until 15 June. Salvadorans who contract COVID-19 but have mild symptoms are to remain at home to avoid saturation of hospitals. In addition to the few businesses allowed to operate under the previous order, the new order stipulates that hardware stores and construction companies may now operate in order to recover from damage caused by recent storms. (U) Government of Peru Extends COVID-19 Health Emergency through 07 September 2020— On 3 June

2020, the Government of Peru announced that the original nationwide health emergency that was due to expire on 10 June will now be extended 90 days, through 7 September. The health emergency requires that seaports and airports adopt measures to avoid the spread of COVID-19, and travelers entering Peru must present a "Sworn Declaration of Traveler's Health". Additionally, travelers arriving from countries with a history of epidemiology will be required to self-isolate at home for 14 days. A list of these countries will be published and maintained by the Peruvian Ministry of Health, and includes Italy, Spain, France, and China. (El Comercio)

(U) U.S. Navy Veteran Released from Iran – Michael White, the U.S. Navy veteran Iran imprisoned since 2018, was released on 4 June and heading back to the United States, the Iranian foreign ministry and his family said in a statement. "For the past 683 days my son, Michael, has been held hostage in Iran by the Iranian Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) and I have been living a nightmare," said the mother White. Hopes for White's release were raised the week of 31 May, when the U.S. deported Iranian scientist Sirius Asgari after acquitting him of federal charges of trading secrets related to his research. (U) Decrease in Remittances due to COVID-19 will Cause an Increase in Salvadorans Migrating to the United States — According to a study by the Higher School of Economics and Business, in La Libertad, El Salvador, the decreased income from remittances by Salvadorans in the United States results from COVID-19 related economic downturn. Likely to result in increased migration of Salvadorans to the United States once the emergency passes and the United States' economy reopens. According to the International Monetary Fund, remittances to El Salvador have dropped 20.2 percent from last year, far worse than the 8.5 percent drop during the recession of 2008-2009. The majority of Salvadoran households that receive remittances work in the informal sector, and remittances represent as much as 50 percent of their household income. The increased long-term poverty resulting from reduced remittances will likely drive Salvadorans to attempt to migrate to the United States when the COVID-19 crisis passes. (elsalvador.com)

(U) Mexico Freezes CJNG Bank Accounts – Financial authorities in Mexico have frozen nearly 2,000 bank accounts with ties to the country's second most powerful drug trafficking organization just days after one of its leaders was shot dead during a concert live-streamed on social media. On 2 June, Santiago Nieto Castillo, chief of the Mexican Finance Ministry's Financial Intelligence Unit (UIF), tweeted that the authority had blocked accounts related to 1,770 individuals and 167 legal entities allegedly involved with the Cartel Jalisco Nueva Generacion (CJNG). The move came after armed assailants stormed a live concert the night of 29 May in the Veracruz city of Tierra Blanca, injuring two and killing six, including a chief member of the cartel. (U) Europe Renews Push to Slash Global Tariffs on Medical Goods – The European Union is pressing for a global deal to eliminate tariffs on pharmaceuticals and medical supplies in an effort to guard against the kind of supply-chain shock triggered by COVID-19. The European Commission, the EU's executive arm, outlined options for encouraging worldwide commerce in health-care goods in a policy paper due to be discussed by the 27-nation bloc's trade ministers in a 9 June video conference. The goal would be to end customs duties on drugs including antibiotics, penicillin and vaccines and on equipment such as masks, gloves and gowns. (Bloomberg)

(U) Iran Signs Two-Year Deal to Export Electricity to Iraq – Iran signed a two-year agreement with neighboring Iraq to export electricity as Baghdad struggles to add power capacity following months of political deadlock and an ongoing health crisis. Rebuilding Iraq's power infrastructure, damaged by decades of war, is high on the government's list of priorities. A crippled utility network has been a key factor behind protests across Iraqi provinces during summer months, when temperatures can easily reach 50°C, occasionally requiring government-mandated holidays to cope with the extreme weather. US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo announced a 120-day waiver in May for Baghdad to continue importing electricity from Iran. (The National)

(U) U.S. to Curb Chinese Airlines' Access, Stoking Trade Tension – The U.S. presidential administration is suspending passenger flights to the U.S. by Chinese airlines, saying it was retaliating after Beijing barred American carriers from re-entering China amid escalating tensions between the two nations. The order issued 3 June and takes effect 16 June. The order stops short of an outright ban, allowing Chinese carriers to operate one flight to the U.S. for each flight that China grants to American carriers. (Bloomberg)

(U) Taiwan Dangles \$335 Million to Woo Foreign Chipmakers – Taiwan's cabinet plans to allocate more than NT\$10 billion (\$335 million) to entice foreign chipmakers to set up R&D facilities locally, people familiar with the plan said, escalating global competition for much-sought-after semiconductor technology. The seven-year blueprint, to be unveiled 4 June, aims to subsidize as much as half of all the research and development costs incurred by global chip companies that build centers on the island, said the people who asked not to be identified because the plan isn't public yet. The program would also apply to local chip firms that convince foreign suppliers to establish such operations in Taiwan. (Bloomberg)

(U) CBSA Warns That Organized Crime May Be Corrupting Border Officers – Canada's border agency says there is "growing evidence" that organized crime groups are trying to corrupt its officers, leading to a growing number of cases of drug and firearm smuggling. The warning was included in a set of documents prepared for Public Safety Minister Bill Blair when he took over the job late last year. CBC News obtained the documents through an access to information request. The briefing binder goes on to warn of a growing number of cross-border incidents involving "smuggling, counterfeit goods, human trafficking, money laundering and proceeds of crime, resulting in greater potential for Canadians to be exposed to harmful contraband" such as illegal firearms and drugs. (CBC)

(U) Venezuela Government and Opposition Agree to Seek Funds to Fight Coronavirus. According to the Venezuelan Ministry of Information, on 01 June 2020 the Government of Venezuela signed an agreement with the opposition-led National Assembly to work with the Pan-American Health Organization (PAHO) to fight the COVID-19 pandemic. The parties will seek funds to cover a range of responses from improving testing, acquiring more protective gear and launching public health messaging campaigns, among others. Opposition leader Juan Guaido previously stated the opposition had signed a technical agreement with the PAHO to launch programs focusing on protective equipment for medical personnel, improving case detection and giving treatment to those with confirmed cases of COVID-19. (U) Money Laundering Allegations Against Mexico's Cruz Azul Soccer Club – Although the Mexican soccer league has canceled the rest of its season, one of its most acclaimed clubs has remained in the headlines, as three of its directors are being investigated for corruption. On 29 May, Mexico's Financial Intelligence Unit (Unidad de Inteligencia Financiera – UIF) froze the accounts of Cruz Azul, one of the country's most important cement companies and owner of the soccer team, for alleged links to money laundering and organized crime. Three company directors are being investigated for financial irregularities involving up to 1.2 billion pesos (\$55 million USD). Investigators allege that false invoices were used to funnel proceeds from the company to shell companies. The money was then used to buy real estate in the United States, according to UIF. (InSight Crime)

The tweet garnered multiple threats calling for open season on CBP. NTC-PAIG conducted research into several of these threats and found that most of these subjects do not live in DC area. 



Channel 4 Radio will assemble at the White House for a First Amendment assembly from 1100 to 1400. According to open source information, Black Lives Matter will assemble at the Friendship Heights Metro and proceed to the National Cathedral, to protest injustice and racism. The Episcopal Diocese of Washington will assemble at St. John's Cathedral in Lafayette Square to support racial justice from 1500 to 1830. The Christian Defense Coalition will assemble on the West Capital for a prayer service from 1745 to 2015.

<del>(U//FOUO)</del> Over the last 24 hours there has been a significant amount of activity surrounding the DC Armory location. Multiple individuals are uploading videos and photos that shows the exterior of the DC armory, buses parked outside, soldier's equipment, and military vehicles. There are also comments with these posts tracking real time movement of personnel to and from the armory.

(U) According to open source reporting, at approx. 2345, 2 NYPD officers were shot and another was stabbed during a confrontation in Brooklyn. All 3 officers are in stable condition at a local hospital, and the suspect is in critical condition after being shot multiple times. The altercation started by the suspect who stabbed one of the officers in the neck while he was on a foot patrol.

-(U//FOUO) Federal prosecutors in Las Vegas have charged three men alleged to be members of the farright extremist "Boogaloo" movement with multiple state and federal violations of conspiracy to commit an act of terrorism, material support for committing an act of terrorism and multiple explosives violations.

(U//FOUO) Social media continues to be used for threats against President Trump and Law Enforcement around the nation.

(U//FOUO) As of 2130, an hour and a half before curfew, there are between 2 – 3 thousand protesters in Washington D.C. Like the majority of the protests around the nation today, they have remained peaceful for the most part.

<del>(U//FOUO)</del> Follow up to the earlier reporting that stated the active-duty military personnel who were brought in to help combat violent protesters are beginning to return to their home base, there are new reports stating the Secretary of Defense is backing down form that decision and they will remain on standby.

(U//FOUO) Further research and collaboration revealed that on 2 June 2020 Twitter USPER deleted the account "Antifa US", responsible for the previously noted "Purge America" post, for violating site policy after internal investigative efforts revealed that Identity Evropa—a white supremacist extremist (WSE) organization based in Europe—was the actual account operator. This account published the tweet dated 31 May calling for looting and violence in suburban neighborhoods. Twitter stated that the account violated its policies against speech inciting violence and misrepresentation.

(U//FOUO) As of 1335, Twitter USPER user posts Police in Cincinnati looking for Black BMW with Kentucky license plates that drove into a crowd of protesters at Cincinnati City Hall.

- (U//FOUO) Cincinnati Police Depart followed that tweet with another stating they do not believe this
incident to be an intentional act.

(U//FOUO) As of 1130, Twitter USBUS user posts photos of mounds of bricks staged in the cities of New York, Dallas, Fayetteville, Cedar Rapids, Raleigh and Fort Meyers.

(U//FOUO) As of 1200 Washington, D.C. Mayor Muriel Bowser announced that the city would be under a 2300 curfew on 3 June in response to the protests over the death of George Floyd.

<del>(U//FOUO)</del> As of 1400, media reports indicate Minnesota's attorney general will reportedly announce an elevated murder charge for former Minneapolis officer Derek Chauvin<sup>USPER</sup> and other charges for his fellow arresting officers in the death of George Floyd.

(U//FOUO) As of 1400, Twitter USBUS users report extremist group ANTIFA plan to 'Purge America" by going to neighborhoods and homes to 'confiscate what they claim is theirs'. There has been no further reporting to substantiate the claim.


(U//FOUO) As of 1400 active-duty military personnel who were brought in to help combat violent protesters are beginning to return to their home base, after two days of more peaceful demonstrations in Washington, D.C.

(U//FOUO) Open source reporting states multiple social media platforms have suspended a number of accounts associated with white nationalist groups after they advocated bringing weapons to ongoing protests in the US. The social media companies also took down a number of pages and accounts which were connected to a fake Antifa account operated by white supremacists.

(U//FOUO) Media reports indicate worldwide civil unrest do to the death of George Floyd. US Embassies have been attacked with protesters attacked police with Molotov cocktails, stones and other objects in cities such as Athens, Greece.

<del>(U//FOUO)</del> Across social media users plan protests and demand the need for peaceful protests and social distancing. There is a Solidarity Prayer Vigil scheduled to begin 1530 at St. Johns Church in Washington, DC.

-(U//FOUO) Open source reporting details the sheriff in Polk County, Florida encouraging residents in his area to shoot looters, if they attempt to break into their homes, amid the George Floyd protests. The sheriff's comments come in response to information received on social media that 'some folks were threatening to take their criminal conduct into the neighborhoods'.

- (U) **Overview:** Civil disturbances involving violence and destruction have all but ceased leading up to the funeral of George Floyd on 9 Jun. The National Guard has ~38.5K (-4.3K) personnel deployed in 29 (-4) states to support rapid response contingencies.
- -(U) National Guard support to the District of Columbia has been significantly reduced. Many of the National Guard service members from supporting states have safely returned home from their mission supporting civil authorities in Washington D.C. Approximately 5,000 National Guard soldiers were activated from 11 states in support of civil authorities in the District.
- (U) CA: Beginning demobilizing of National Guard standby forces throughout the state, a north and south Special Operations Quick Reaction Force have been established in Fairfield and Los Alamitos.
- (U) **DC:** Media sources <u>report</u> parts of Lafayette Park are expected to reopen on 10 Jun, one week after fencing went up ahead of expected protests at the White House. Some areas of Lafayette Park will remain closed to allow the park to address damages and safety hazards. It remains unclear if the fencing perimeter built around the White House will come down in full or in part.
- (U) MI: National Guard mission complete--all soldiers have returned home.
- (U) NC: On 9 Jun, protesters marching for racial justice in Winston-Salem <u>blocked</u> a section of Interstate 40 for about one hour. Crowds blocked both directions of I-40 at Stratford Road at about 1945 ET. Back on 7 Jun, protesters also blocked I-40 in Greensboro for hours.
- (U) FEMA National Watch Center and Regional Watch Centers (RWCs) continue to Monitor. FEMA Region II, III and V RWCs have returned to their primary operating facilities. There are no longer any State Emergency Operations Centers activated for civil disturbances.
- (U) For additional information, refer to the <u>DHS Common Operating Picture</u> and the <u>Homeland Security Information Network.</u>
- (U) **Distribution:** DHS HQ Leadership and Senior Staff; DHS Component Leaders and Operations Centers; White House Situation Room; Federal Interagency Operations Centers, and State and Local Mission Partners.


#### <del> (U)</del> Current Situation

(U//FOUO) The nation has seen an increase in protests, sponsored by multiple domestic organizations, following the death of George Floyd Based on open source and social media reporting, the majority of these protests, sponsored by the "Black Lives Matter" movement have remained peaceful. However, due to nefarious actors using these protests as façades, there have been incidents where law enforcement (LE) officials have needed to respond with escalated force – incidents including the use of pepper spray, riot shields, and rubber bullets. LE have had to use non-lethal, and in some cases lethal, force to control the civil unrest in cities around the nation. LE has suffered over 100 injuries, dozens of LE vehicles destroyed, and there are reports of police stations are being burnt down. While many of these protests have occurred around major cities, some have occurred near CBP locations to include CBP headquarters where there has been protests and some looting.

(U//FOUC) Over the past 24 hours, there have seen numerous protests occur across the nation. Peaceful protest began across Washington, D.C. Around 1800 1 June, Acting Commissioner Morgan tweeted a photo of CBP agents and officers who were in the capital area to support local law enforcement, which garnered multiple threats calling for open season on CBP. Despite Washington D.C. enacting a curfew starting at 1900, several groups were present in the city throughout the night with no law enforcement escalation required. The use of "#CBP" and "@CBP" handles continue to trend in a negative manner towards CBP. At approximately 0330 2 June, all CBP officers and agents demobilized after deploying to the National Capital Region (NCR).

(U//FOUO) Most major cities have enforced curfews, leading to a decrease of violence and unrest in various cities. However, wide spread looting in New York led to the arrest of over 200 individuals. Multiple violent incidents resulted in the shooting of four police officers in St. Louis and two police officers in Las Vegas, NV, according to open source reporting. Additionally, violent protests in multiple California cities continue; however, not at the level of previous nights of protest with many cities enforcing their curfews.

- (U//FOUC)-As of 1400 2 June, the Pentagon raised its force protection level to FPCON Charlie as a result of the protests. Additionally, all military bases within the National Capitol Region (NCR) will also have increased force protection levels. In response the violence associated with protests six states have declared a state of emergency including: VA, GA, MN, TX, MO and AZ.
- (U//FOUO) The California National Guard has deployed approximately 2,500 troops to supplement law enforcement in Los Angeles, Sacramento and Alameda County. Additionally, more than 18,000 National Guard members responding to civil unrest across 29 states and Washington, DC, with that number still increasing.
- (U//FOUO) Social media users worldwide have posted support for the protests occurring in the United States. One instance is of protestors in front of the U.S. Embassy in Tel Aviv. They held signs stating "Black Lives Matter" and "No Justice, No Peace". A crowd also gathered in Paris to protest for the black lives matter movement.
- (U//FOUO) Social media users plan protests and demand the need for peaceful protests and social distancing. Protestors in Bethesda, Maryland marched peacefully through downtown stating if someone is there to incite violence they should instead go home.
- (U//FOUC) Washington, D.C. will continue to be under a mandatory curfew through 6 a.m. on Wednesday, 3 June. This will not apply to essential workers or individuals seeking healthcare.
- (U//FOUO) As of 2130 2 June, there were thousands of protesters across the D.C. area. While protests remained peaceful, protestors also attempted to gain entry to St. John's Cathedral—with one individual climbing onto the roof of the cathedral.
- (U//FOUO) Some anarchist extremist are pre-staging improvised weapons such as golf clubs and shovels behind fences, garbage cans, and other objects throughout protest routes in Boston, MA in order to confront police. It is important to note New York experienced similar tactics in the last couple of days—LE discovered pre-positioned plastic bags containing bricks and sharp objects by trashcans during a security walk-through.
- (U//LES) Multiple social media users posted anti-CBP rhetoric regarding CBP deployments into the DC area suggesting they are going to kill Americans; as well as encouraging individuals to bring guns and shoot back.
- (U//FOUO) As of 0230 3 June, protest, looting, and riots continue across the country despite curfews in effect in multiple cities, although the protests were less intense than previous nights, according to open source.
- (U//LES) Individuals are using social media to spread misinformation, possibly with the intent to either incite violence or deter law enforcement operations. An example of this is at approximately, 1855 2 June, there were reports of multiple social media postings regarding pipe bombs at the Korean War Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C., although determined to be untrue, the post had over 20,000 "retweets".
- (U//LES) Threats to CBP and other Law Enforcement partners continue to appear in social media, however, the misinformation on social media further complicates the ability to identify credible threats. CBP NIW shared information regarding the threatening posts with CBP entities within the field for situational awareness and passed to CBP's Publicly Available Information Group (PAIG) for further exploitation.
