



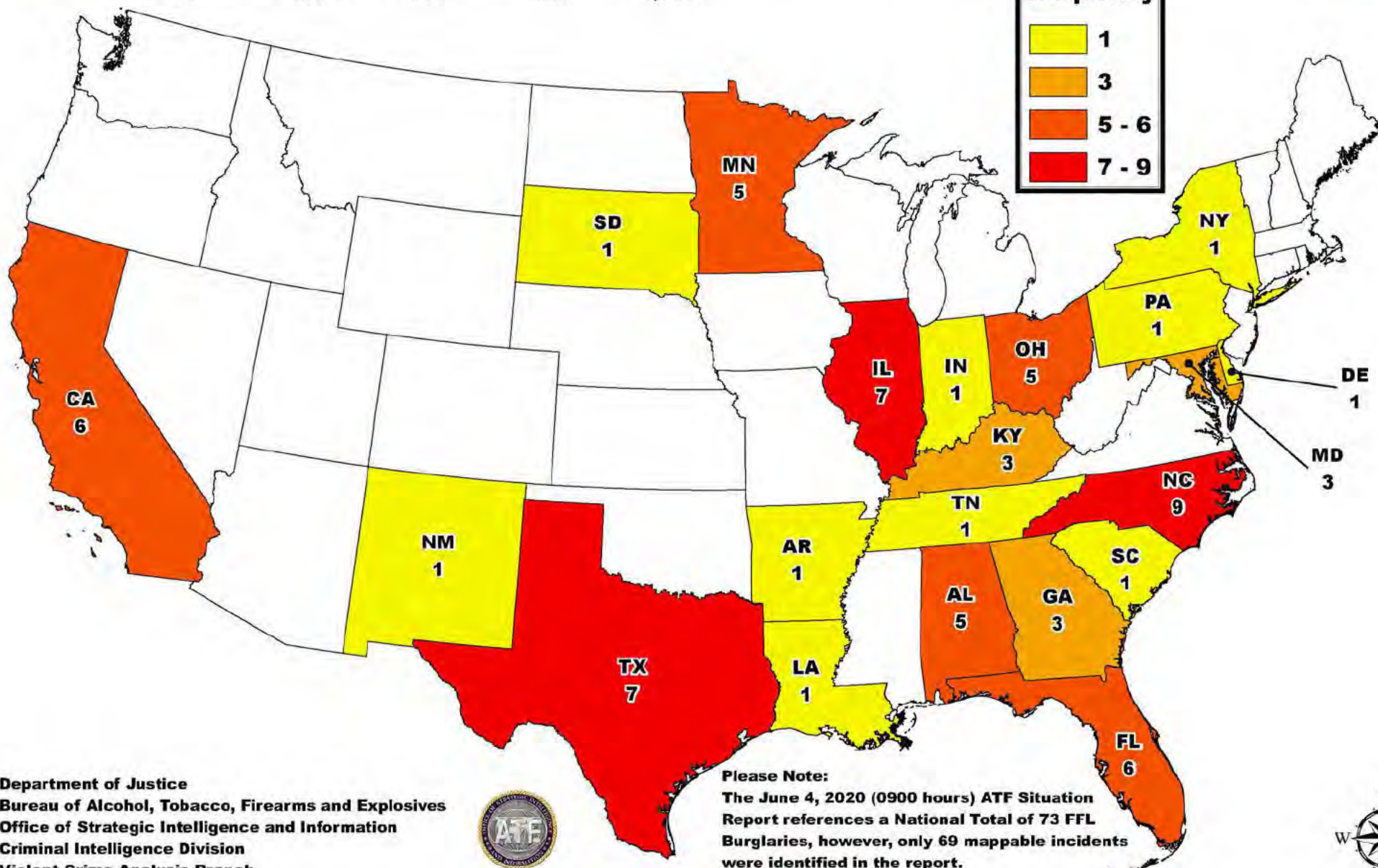
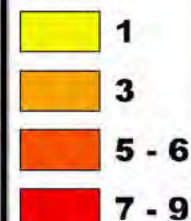

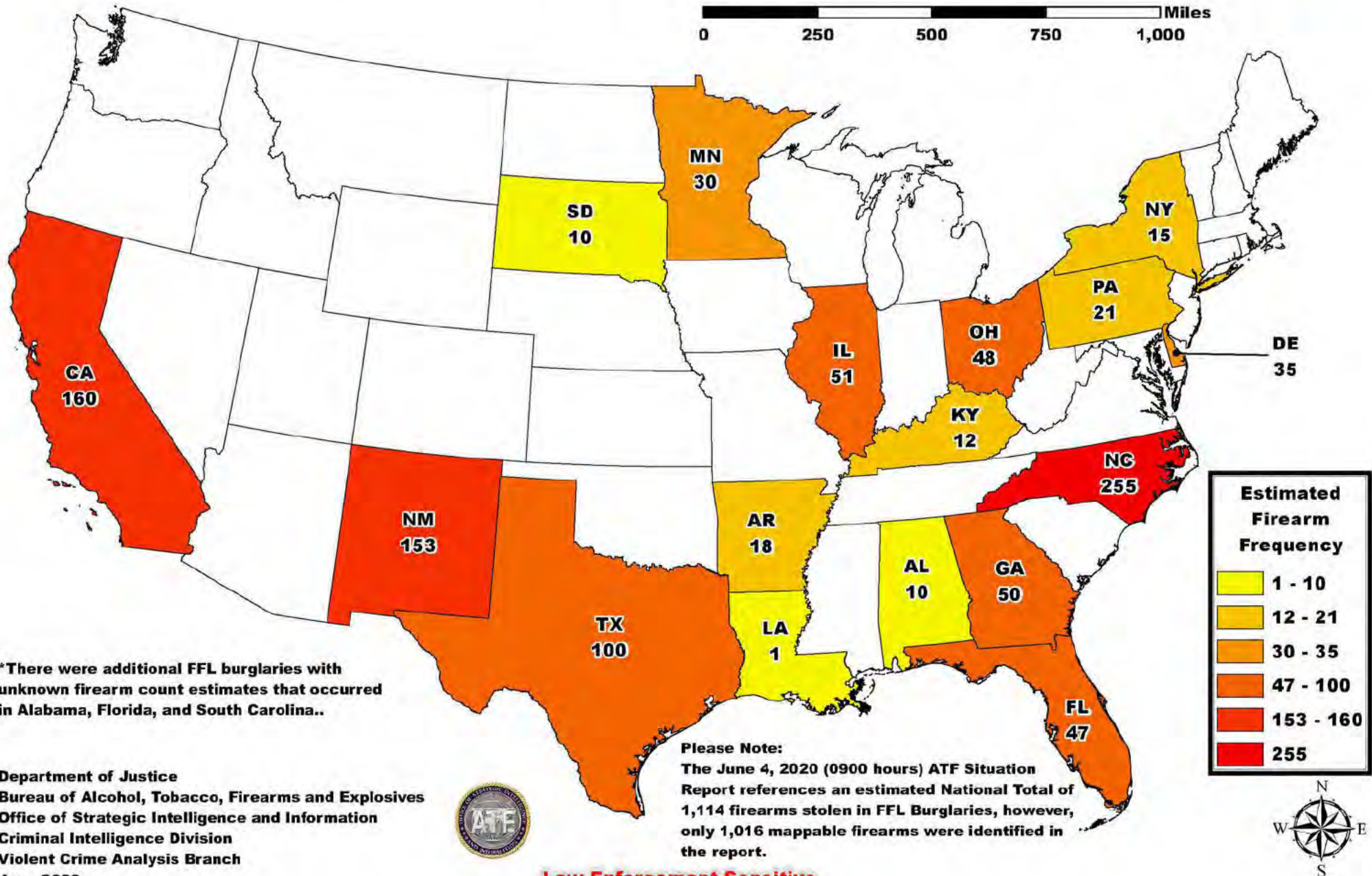

THIS MESSAGE IS AUTHORIZED BY THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR, FIELD OPERATIONS

The information below and the attached spreadsheet are provided for situational awareness of authorities granted to ATF special agents under some state laws. However, a special agent should never act on this authority without understanding the scope, limits and other conditions of the state or local law that vests him or her with the authority as peace officer or other authority to act in the jurisdiction in which he or she is acting. With rare exception, ATF Special Agents should act only under the authority granted to them by federal law. Acting outside the scope of ATF's primary legal authority poses significant legal liability risks.

ATF special agents in some jurisdictions may have a degree of *peace officer* authority conferred by state or local law. ATF Order 3210.7D § 55 establishes limits on the circumstances when, and extent to which, special agents are authorized to act on that authority. The reasons for these limits include that enforcement of non-Federal offenses is the province of state and local law enforcement officials, whereas special agent enforcement authority and appropriated funding relate to the investigation and

enforcement of Federal criminal laws. ATF Order 3210.7D § 55 authorizes ATF special agents to intervene in certain exigent state offenses under the authority vested in them by state law as either statutorily recognized peace officers or as private citizens. Such intervention is entrusted to a special agent's discretion, and only authorized in the following narrow circumstances:

- To protect an individual in the presence of the special agent from a crime of violence as set forth in 18 U.S.C. § 16;
- To provide immediate assistance to an individual who has suffered or is threatened with bodily harm; or
- To prevent the escape of an individual who the special agent reasonably believes to have committed a crime of violence in the presence of the special agent.

The local ATF division counsel can provide guidance on the relevant laws of the jurisdictions within the field division.

Guys, over the past couple days Division management has been in on a couple VTC's with ATF and FBI senior leadership regarding the ongoing civil unrest and threats to Federal facilities/monuments. At this time there is not any specific threats, however with the coming July 4th holiday, the FBI is increasing their threat posture out of an abundance of caution. All the FBI Field Divisions are standing up CP's to run until July 8. ATF will be concentrating on our core mission which means a few things; we are not trained or equipped to conduct crowd/riot control and should not be engaged in those types of activities. We are also not best utilized by standing static security on Federal facilities/monuments. What we are doing is staying engaged with our LE partners at the local, county, state, tribal and federal level and stand ready to respond in an investigative capacity to those incidents that fall within our primary area of jurisdiction (the criminal use of fire, explosives, and firearms). As such I have 2 directives: 1.) touch base with your FBI counterparts in your AOR, make sure they are aware that we are on board with the national plan and are ready to respond to participate in a collaborative investigation involving any area of our core mission related to any civil unrest or threats/damage/destruction of any Federal facilities/monuments in your AOR. Make sure lines of communication are open and inform them that we will communicate over any intel we get regarding threats of this nature and ask that they do the same; and 2.) engage your office and ensure that your people know of this ongoing effort and make sure they are aware of the potential for responding to incidents during the upcoming couple weeks (including over the holiday).

I want to reiterate that there is no specific threat to our AOR and as we worked through it yesterday, the number of "high threat" federal targets in our AOR is minimal, mostly Federal Courthouses and other Federal facilities. Additionally, if you are requested to respond in a manner that you are uncomfortable with and or question our authority to do so, before deploying contact me and (b)(6) [REDACTED] for guidance. I'd much rather temporarily delay a response of give a no to a request than expose our agents and agency to undo liability and/or public scrutiny by being engaged in activity we should not be engaged in.

(U) Violent Opportunists Target Law Enforcement with Fireworks During Civil Unrest

Release Date: 20 JULY 2020

(U//LES) The Tennessee Fusion Center (TFC) is distributing this Officer Safety Bulletin to our statewide law enforcement and public safety partners for situational awareness purposes. This Officer Safety Bulletin highlights violent opportunists' weaponization of fireworks against law enforcement during the current civil unrest. Attacks utilizing fireworks have thus far resulted in minor injuries to law enforcement. However an increase in targeting of LE with fireworks could result in more severe injuries. The TFC encourages law enforcement and public safety officials to remain cognizant of this threat, so that they may better prepare mitigation strategies.

(U//LES) Attacks utilizing fireworks on law enforcement have occurred nationally over recent weeks. Open source reporting of illicit use of fireworks suggests law enforcement and public safety officials should remain vigilant when responding to protests or areas of civil unrest¹. Five individuals have been arrested in firework-related incidents, and investigators are seeking additional information in several ongoing cases. Examples of national level incidents include:

- **(U//LES)** On 26 June 2020, Virginia State Police body cameras captured protestors in Richmond, Virginia, launching fireworks near police; one individual was injured, according to FBI and open source reporting.²
- **(U//FOUO)** On 2 June 2020 in Charlotte, North Carolina, police arrested one individual who had fired fireworks from a crowd. Police later arrested a second individual in possession of fireworks of the same type and brand used by the first arrestee.³
- **(U)** On 01 June 2020, police arrested an individual for throwing fireworks at law enforcement during a protest in Naperville, Illinois. The individual was later federally charged on 26 June 2020.⁴
- **(U//LES)** On 31 May 2020, an unknown individual threw a mortar-type firework among Charlotte-Mecklenburg law enforcement officers. As a result of detonation, an officer's clothing ignited, and they suffered second-degree burns, a chin laceration, and hearing loss for several days.⁵
- **(U)** On 31 May 2020, two individuals in Baltimore, Maryland, were arrested for their role in shooting fireworks at police.⁶
- **(U//LES)** On 31 May 2020, law enforcement arrested an individual in Santa Ana, California, for launching a firework mortar at law enforcement officers.⁷

- (U) Between 30 May and 02 June 2020, open source reporting indicated protestors shot fireworks at law enforcement officers during protests in Palo Alto, California, Washington, D.C., Brockton, Massachusetts, Baltimore, Maryland, and New York, New York.⁸

(U) TENNESSEE IMPLICATIONS

(U//LES) As of 20 July 2020, the TFC possesses no specific and/or credible information that violent groups or individuals are planning to conduct attacks on law enforcement utilizing fireworks during protests or civil unrest. However, as of publication, two incidents, one of which was violent, have occurred in Tennessee. The TFC assesses that should this trend continue nationally, it will likely continue to present an active threat against Tennessee law enforcement. The TFC encourages law enforcement to take appropriate protective measures to mitigate the threat. The Tennessee incidents are as follows:

- (U) On 04 July 2020, a group of protestors set off fireworks outside of a Memphis District Attorney's residence. There were no reported injuries or arrests.⁹
- (U//LES) On 30 May 2020, an unidentified individual threw a firework at a Metro Nashville Police Department (MNPd) SWAT team member while responding to violent protests in Nashville, TN. The officer suffered no injuries, because of the protective equipment they were wearing. MNPd has not identified a suspect.¹⁰

(U//FOUO) The TFC respectfully requests that should your office develop or receive information that violent opportunists are planning to use fireworks as weapons against law enforcement during protests or civil unrest to please contact the TFC at TFC@tn.gov or 1-877-250-2333.

1. Situation

Across the nation, outrage and shock over the death of George Floyd has manifested in numerous protests and demonstrations, both peaceful and violent. Several peaceful protests took place in Tennessee in Memphis, Johnson City, and Knoxville from Wednesday, May 27, 2020 to Friday, May 29, 2020.

On Saturday, May 30, 2020, peaceful protests and rallies took place in the cities of Nashville, Jackson, Chattanooga, Clarksville, and Memphis. While these events were initially peaceful, many protestors later sparked confrontations with law enforcement and preceded to incite violence and cause damage in the Metro Courthouse, Legislative Plaza, and Central Metro Precinct areas of Nashville, including damage and looting of businesses along Broadway. Additional protests took place on Sunday, May 31, 2020 and Monday, June 1, 2020, primarily in the Cities of Greeneville, Jackson, Memphis, McMinnville, Murfreesboro, Nashville, Kingsport, and Chattanooga. Confrontations with law enforcement were sparked in the Cities of Murfreesboro, Chattanooga, and Memphis.

Peaceful protests, prayer vigils, marches and rallies have continued to take place across the State from Tuesday, June 2, 2020 through Saturday, June 13, 2020. The cities of Memphis, Nashville, Chattanooga and Kingsport have had reoccurring events every day.

With the Tennessee Legislature in session, protestors gathered on the lawn of Legislative Plaza with the intention to turn it into an "Autonomous Zone" on Monday, June 15, 2020. Protests are continuing to happen every day this week in Nashville while the Legislature is in session. Protests are also continuing to occur in Memphis and Chattanooga during the week.

On June 19, 2020 in remembrance of Juneteenth, a day of commemoration for the end of slavery in the United States, numerous peaceful gatherings and protests took place in Memphis, Jackson, Nashville, Clarksville, La Vergne, Chattanooga, Knoxville, and Sevier County.

Protests have continued across the state since the Juneteenth Celebrations. The cities of Memphis, Nashville and Chattanooga have reoccurring events most nights and these have been peaceful.

On Thursday, July 9, 2020 in Nashville, protestors burned an American flag on the Mezzanine of Legislative Plaza at the Capital. This was done after the Capital Commission vote to remove the busts of Nathan Bedford Forest and Admirals' Farragut and Gleaves.

The SEOC was staffed in response to protests on May 30, 2020. TEMA, Tennessee Highway Patrol, and the Tennessee National Guard continue to deploy personnel to support local governments during the protests. The SEOC continues to remain activated at a Level 3 – State of Emergency since March 3, 2020 and the Tennessee Emergency Management Plan remains activated. The SEOC will continue to monitor and support local governments over the coming weeks as necessary.

Nashville

- Executive Order 09 declaring a State of Civil Emergency and imposing a curfew on May 30, 2020.
- Executive Order 10 extending curfew on May 31, 2020.
- Executive Order 11 extending curfew on June 1, 2020.

Memphis

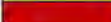
- Civil Emergency Proclamation and Executive Order Extending Curfew No. 21-2020 issued in protection of life and property on June 3, 2020.
- Civil Emergency Proclamation and Executive Order Extending Curfew No. 24-2020 issued in protection of life and property on June 3, 2020.
- Civil Emergency Proclamation and Executive Order Extending Curfew No. 25-2020 issued in protection of life and property on June 5, 2020

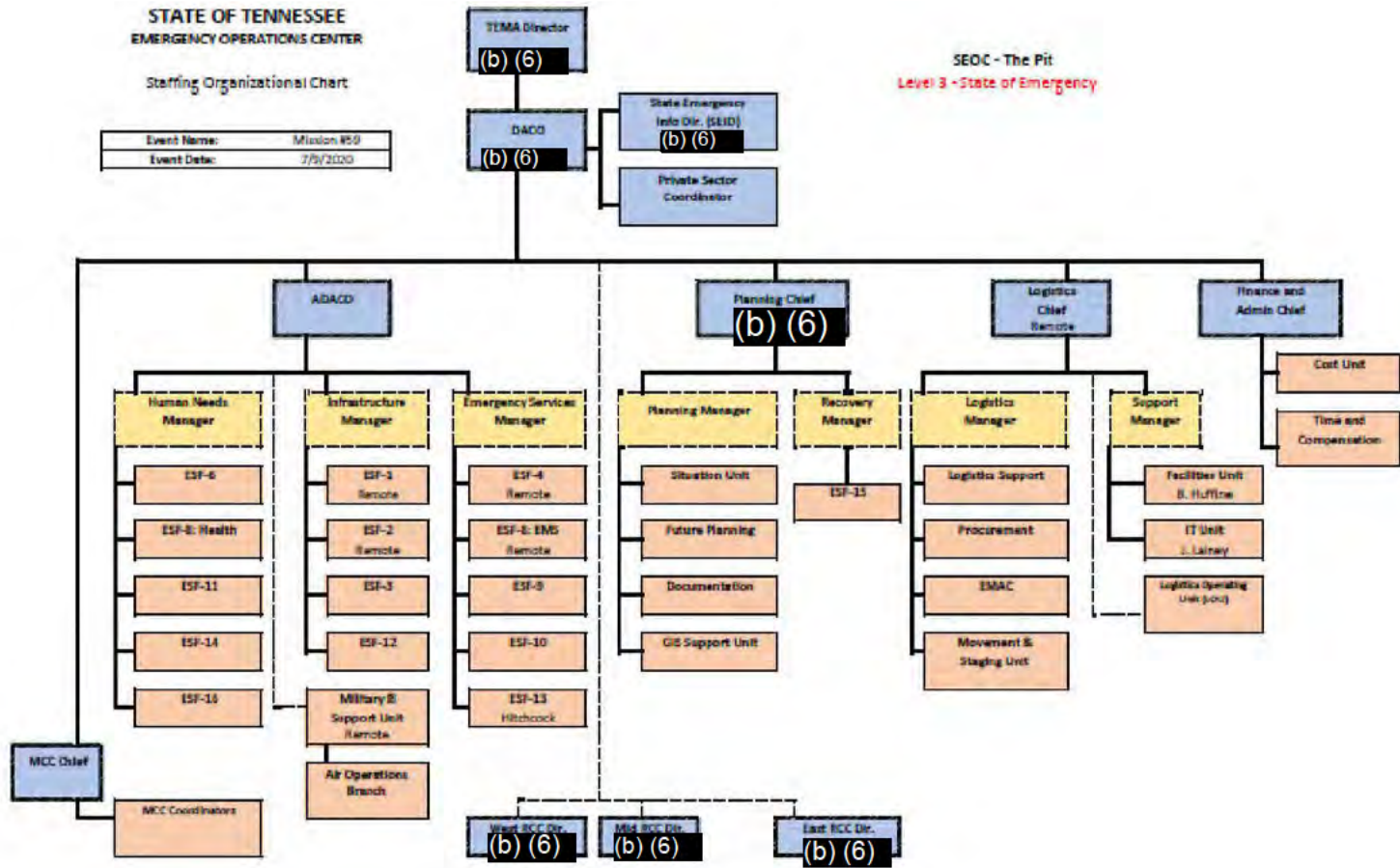

1. Situation

Across the nation, outrage and shock over the death of George Floyd has manifested in numerous protests and demonstrations, both peaceful and violent. Several peaceful protests took place in Tennessee in Memphis, Johnson City, and Knoxville from Wednesday, May 27, 2020 to Friday, May 29, 2020.

On Saturday, May 30, 2020, peaceful protests and rallies took place in the cities of Nashville, Jackson, Chattanooga, Clarksville, and Memphis. While these events were initially peaceful, many protestors later sparked confrontations with law enforcement and preceded to incite violence and cause damage in the Metro Courthouse, Legislative Plaza, and Central Metro Precinct areas of Nashville, including damage and looting of businesses along Broadway. Additional protests took place on Sunday, May 31, 2020 and Monday, June 1, 2020, primarily in the Cities of Greeneville, Jackson, Memphis, McMinnville, Murfreesboro, Nashville, Kingsport, and Chattanooga. Confrontations with law enforcement were sparked in the Cities of Murfreesboro, Chattanooga, and Memphis.

Peaceful protests, prayer vigils, marches and rallies have continued to take place across the State from Tuesday, June 2, 2020 through Saturday, June 13, 2020. The cities of Memphis, Nashville, Chattanooga and Kingsport have had reoccurring events every day.

With the Tennessee Legislature in session, protestors gathered on the lawn of Legislative Plaza with the intention to turn it into an "Autonomous Zone" on Monday, June 15, 2020. Protests are continuing to happen every day this week in Nashville while the Legislature is in session. Protests are also continuing to occur in Memphis and Chattanooga during the week.

On June 19, 2020 in remembrance of Juneteenth, a day of commemoration for the end of slavery in the United States, numerous peaceful gatherings and protests took place in Memphis, Jackson, Nashville, Clarksville, La Vergne, Chattanooga, Knoxville, and Sevier County.

Protests have continued across the state since the Juneteenth Celebrations. The cities of Memphis, Nashville and Chattanooga have reoccurring events most nights and these have been peaceful.

On Thursday, July 9, 2020 in Nashville, protestors burned an American flag on the Mezzanine of Legislative Plaza at the Capital. This was done after the Capital Commission vote to remove the busts of Nathan Bedford Forest and Admirals' Farragut and Gleaves.

The SEOC was staffed in response to protests on May 30, 2020. TEMA, Tennessee Highway Patrol, and the Tennessee National Guard continue to deploy personnel to support local governments during the protests. The SEOC continues to remain activated at a Level 3 – State of Emergency since March 3, 2020 and the Tennessee Emergency Management Plan remains activated. The SEOC will continue to monitor and support local governments over the coming weeks as necessary.

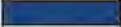
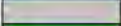

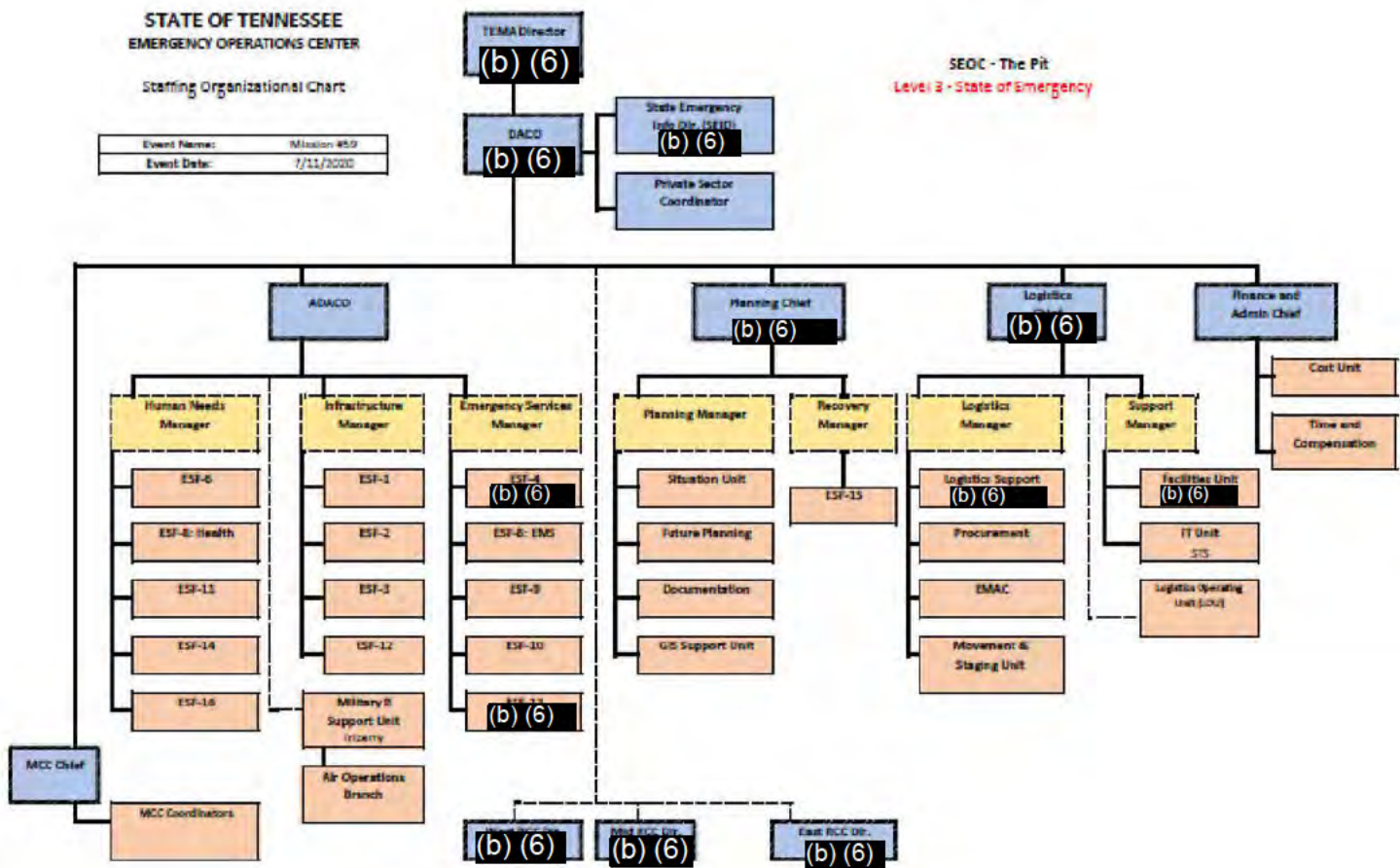

- **Windows 1909 Testing** – HRITB successfully tested all HR systems including the upcoming June upgrades of HR Connect and JTMS in the Windows 1909 virtual environment. No issues were found. The Chief, HRITB will be testing for another few days on a physical laptop that was updated to Windows 1909. Windows 1909 is expected to be pushed out to all ATF desktops the second week of July.
- **MGS Vacancy Templates** – HRITB updated all vacancy templates in MGS to include the new specialized experience statement.
- **JTMS HANA Upgrade** – HRITB is in the testing phase of the DOJ-wide upgrade to the new SAP HANA platform. Testing has been extended until June 10th. The projected outage period for the upgrade begins June 13th and ends July 3rd, however, that window may be shorter depending on test results. Once a final date is determined, all training coordinators, training records managers, and the ATF help desk will be notified and a Broadcast will be issued.

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(U//FOUO) The 25 May death of George Floyd in Minneapolis, Minnesota, has sparked nationwide protests, with some turning confrontational and leading to looting, arson, and riots, and calls for violence against law enforcement officers for perceived police brutality. On 30 May, California Governor Newsom announced a state of emergency in Los Angeles County and approved requests from Los Angeles and Los Angeles County to deploy the National Guard to assist the city and neighboring communities. On 7 June, Los Angeles Mayor Garcetti announced the National Guard will leave the city of Los Angeles after several days of peaceful demonstrations. A small number of National Guard units will be stationed nearby through 10 June to provide emergency support if needed. Planned, and likely unplanned, demonstrations are expected to continue. In light of these nationwide demonstrations, and the ongoing potential for violent confrontations between demonstrators and police, this JRIC Situation Report provides situational awareness on notable violent, criminal incidents, curfew announcements or extensions, and other notable developments in the JRIC six-county AOR.

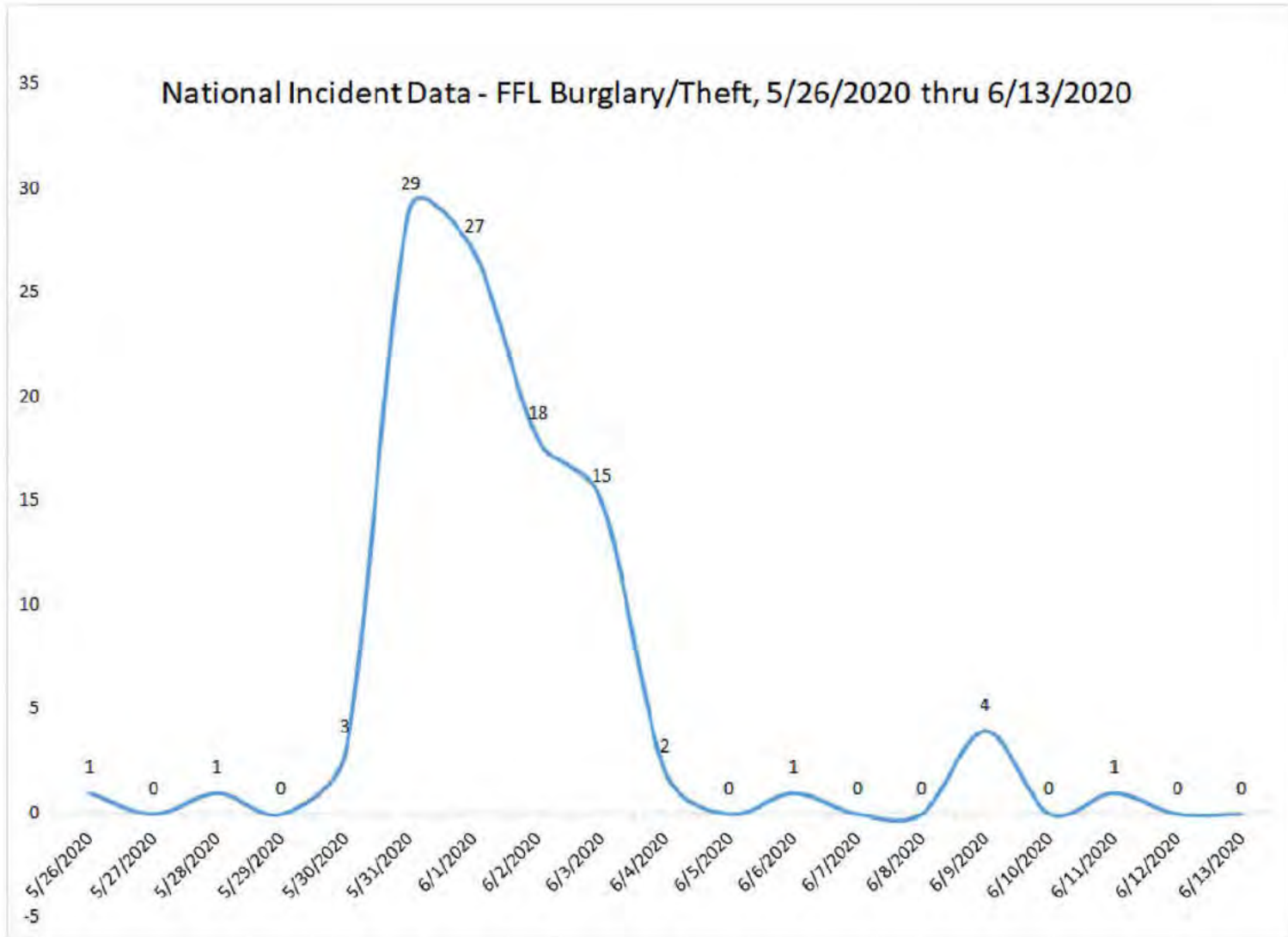

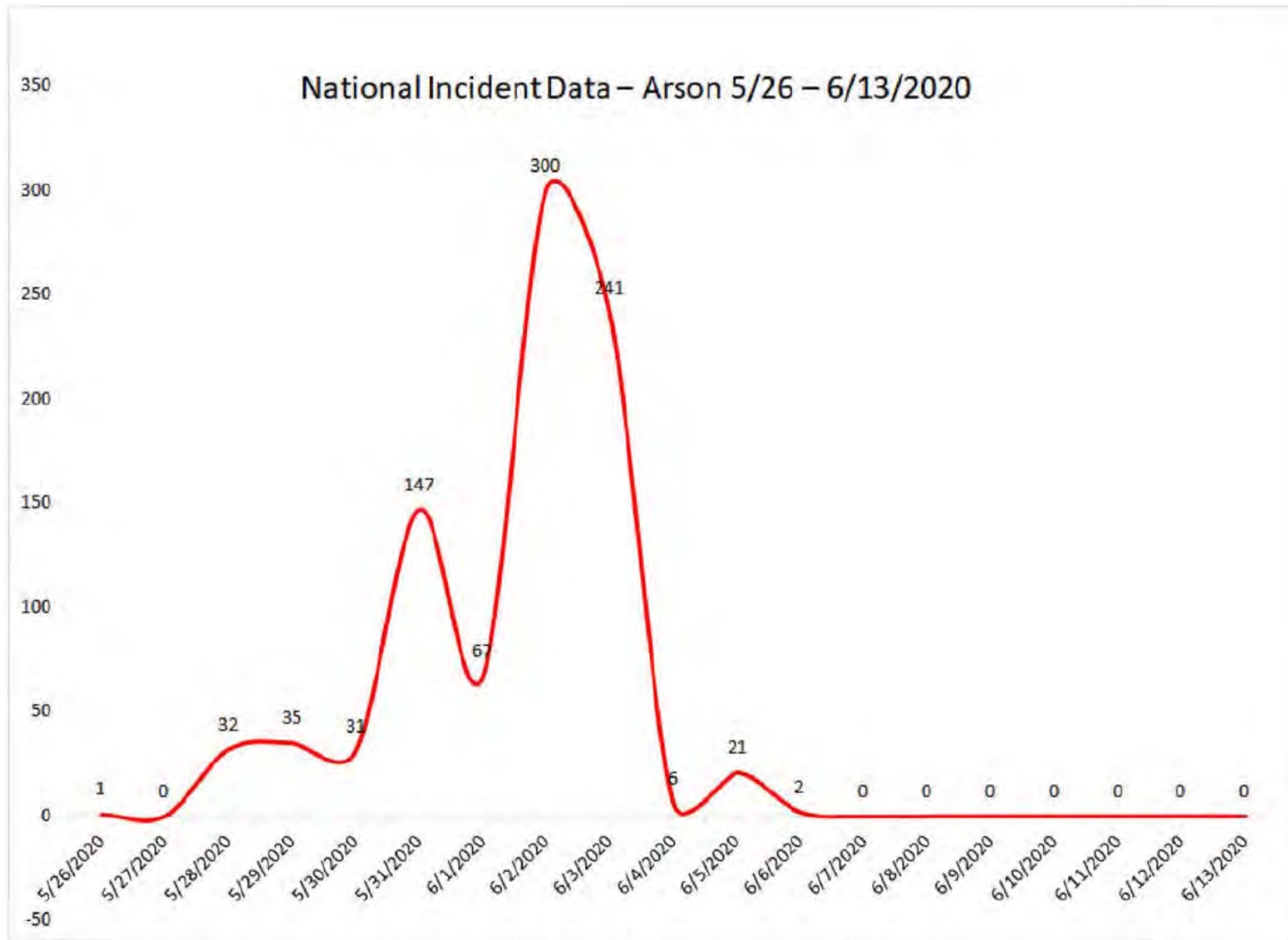
Situation and Trending Report as of 11 hrs. Arrest added to trending graphs.



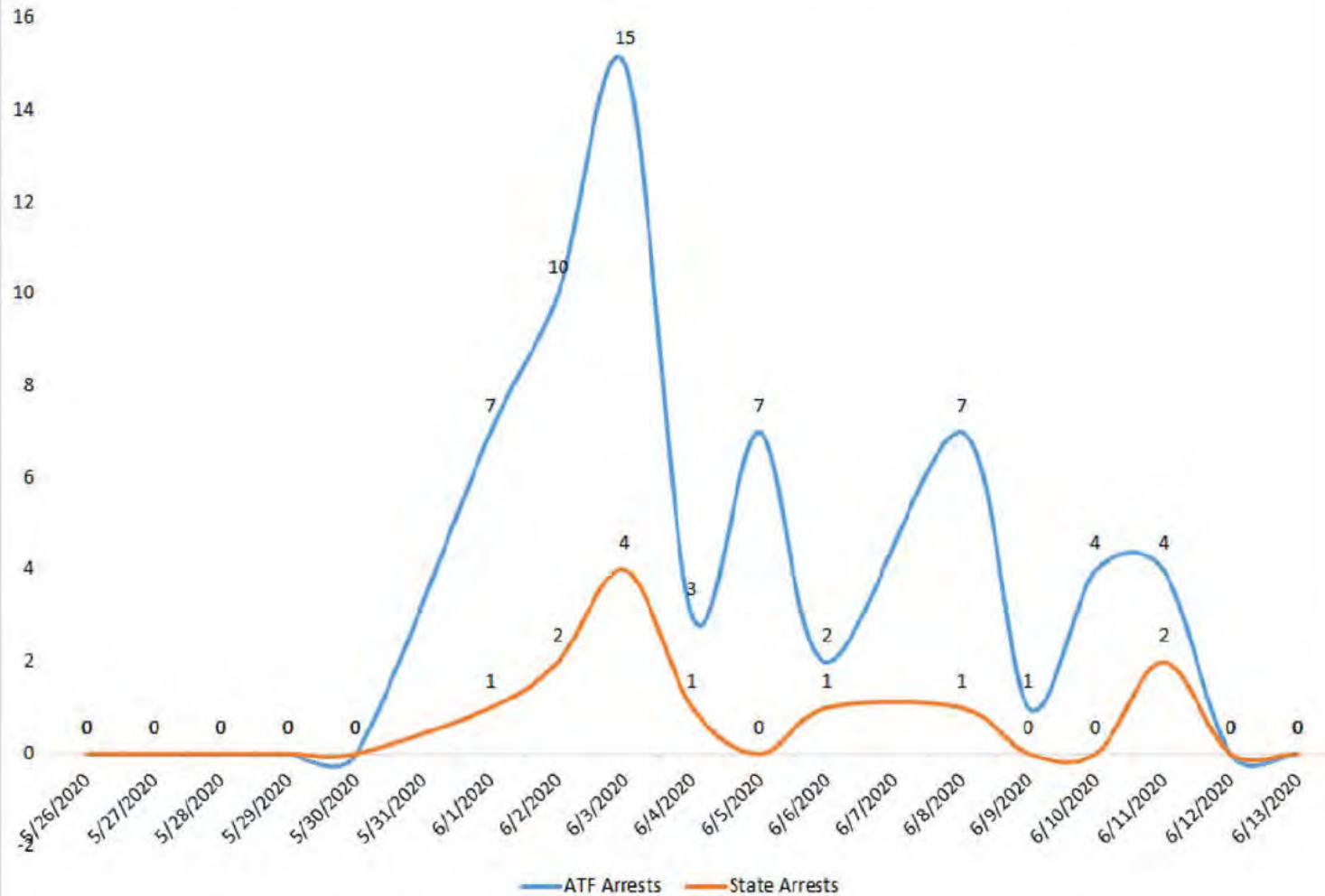
VCC Civil Unrest Data

During this Current Period of Civil Unrest





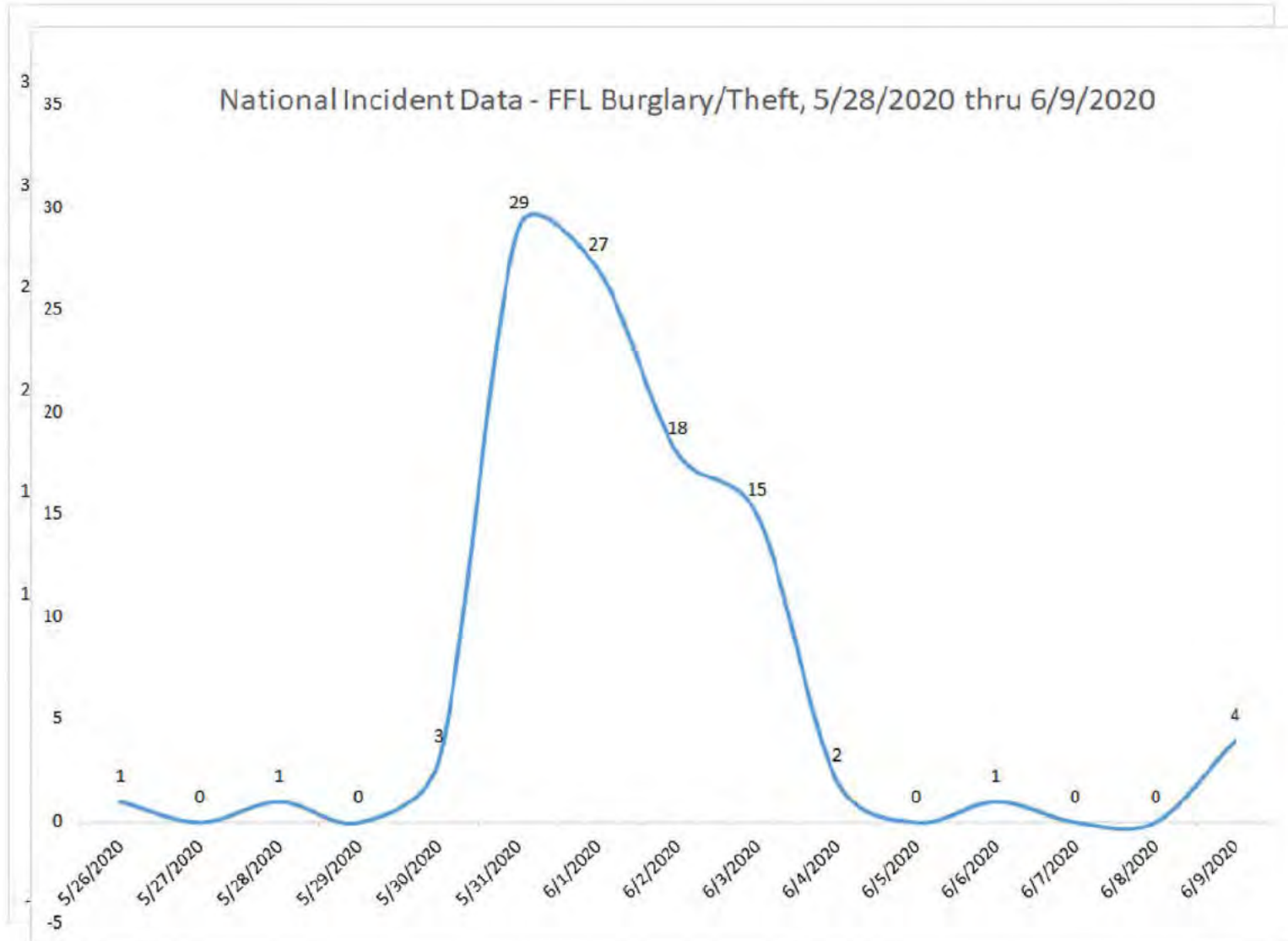
National Incident Data - ATF and State Arrests, 5/26/2020 thru 6/13/2020

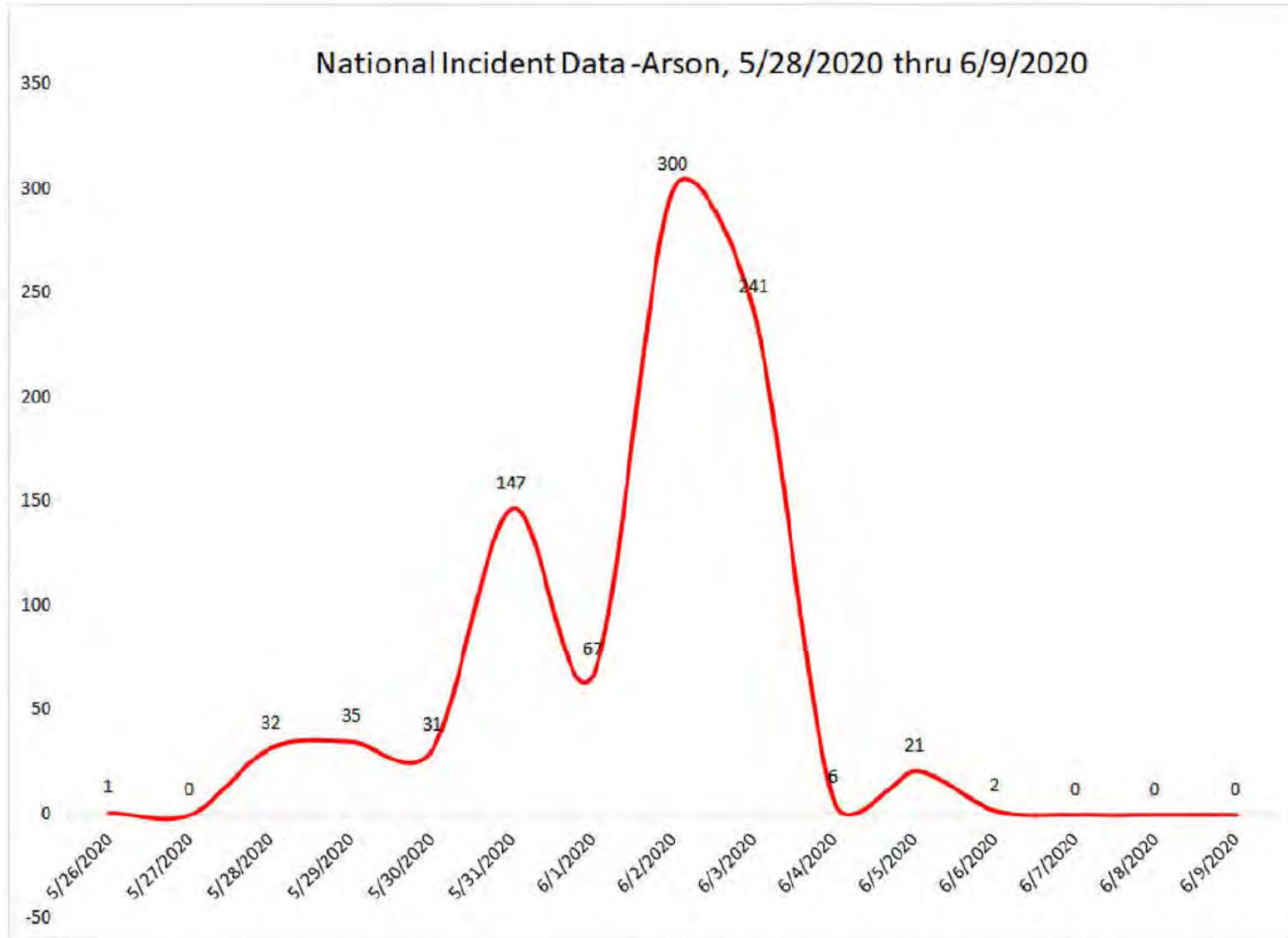

- Special Agents of the Fayetteville Field Office have deployed to execute a search warrant related to the Ace Pawn FFL burglary.

Philadelphia Field Division

- ATF, Philadelphia Field Division, authored a **criminal complaint/arrest warrant** on (b)(6), for **Title 26 violation, 26 USC 5845 (a)(8), possession of an unregistered destructive device** as a result of the previous incident at PNC Plaza (Pittsburgh) - **Molotov Cocktails**. ATF expects a press release from the USAO.
- ATF (Grp II A&E) Task Force interviewed a defendant at Northeast Detectives Office. Agents (b)(6) got a confession from a **multi-convicted felon** admitting to possession of an **M-Device**. Defendant told ATF Agents where he got it, which they were able to corroborate and Detectives obtained a **State search warrant**. SWAT executed the warrant at 2111 Farley St, which led to the recovery of **one M-1000, a firearm, drugs, paraphernalia, and a haul of prescription medication clearly stolen from a pharmacy**.
- Allentown FO agents on scene processing **ATM explosion** at Franklin and Orange streets in **Reading Pa**. Paper from M device recovered. Video has been collected. A white vehicle

with a moon roof was at the scene. There is currency remaining in the machine, but it appears most of the money was taken. There appears to be three suspects.

Tampa Field Division

- On 6/5/20, ATF was notified, by the State Fire Marshal's Office, of a fire at Sonny's BBQ in Jacksonville, FL. ATF responded to **conduct a scene investigation**. A preliminary investigation determined an **accelerant was used to initiate a fire** through a broken window of the business. **Graffiti was also located with derogatory language related to KKK**. Vernon) Substation. **Two individuals seen carrying long guns** (1- AK47, 1-shotgun). 100 person protest in Centerville, VA blocking the highway impeding traffic. Two individuals observed with long guns. Firearms, at both locations, were believed to be used as protection for protesters.
- Reports of individuals posting how to monitor police radio traffic.
- National Guard reporting 489 members supporting operations at the White House, Mall and National Monuments.
- FBI Intel- More social media threats – Reddit user, **numerous threats against LEOs**, Twitter user suggesting to place explosives on the fencing – User posted on social media – Purge on Law Enforcement tomorrow. User out of Woodbridge, FBI is working it.- Protesters are **taking photos of LEOs and trying to DOX them**.
- National Guard 4,514 total NG in DC, 500 more inbound today, 287 currently deployed at White House
- Active Duty Military 1,000 troops staged at Ft. Myer and Andrews AFB.

Dallas Field Division

- ATF Dallas Group VIII is enroute to a location to attempt to locate and interview an individual who is suspected of **purchasing a firearm stolen from the DFW Gun Range FFL** during rioting and looting in Dallas over last weekend. This individual reportedly purchased the firearm from Erick MONTGOMERY who is suspected to be one of four individuals responsible for this **burglary**.
- ATF Dallas received a call regarding an **FFL Burglary** at Mike's Cash n' Pawn at 1119 E Main St #A in Cushing, OK (Payne County). The suspect(s) broke in through the front door and stole ^{(b)(3)} **firearms -** **(b)(3) 112 PL 55 125 STAT 552**

Phoenix Field Division

- Tucson PD officer's home and vehicle were vandalized. No leads as of yet.

Seattle Field Division

- Portland Metro Area: **Molotov Cocktails** –On 06/04/2020 one intact **Molotov device** was located hidden behind piping in a parking garage in downtown Portland by a security guard. Portland Metropolitan Explosives Disposal Unit took possession of the device.
- Spokane: **ATF Assets** – CFI assisting the Spokane Fire Special Investigative Unit and CES assisting Spokane B&A. SAs/TFO's will be monitoring for violations within ATF's jurisdiction. 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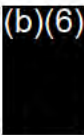

SIGNIFICANT UPDATES:

Charlotte Field Division

- On June 4, 2020, ATF Raleigh S/As, in coordination with RPD, arrested one individual responsible for committing the arson of an RPD patrol vehicle. The person was charged in the Eastern District of North Carolina for violating 18 U.S.C. Section 844(f). During this investigation, agents obtained a confession from the suspect and recovered video evidence. One additional suspect has been identified and is still outstanding.
- On June 4, 2020, ATF Raleigh received information (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) [REDACTED], had made social media threats to conduct a mass shooting at the protest in Raleigh, NC. ATF Raleigh obtained a copy of the video and a report of a previous incident with (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) [REDACTED] possessing a firearm as a convicted felon. EAST REGION

Baltimore Field Division

- Baltimore Field Division (BFD) CIMRT continues to be active. (b)(7)(E) BFD S/As are assigned to Washington DC. Two Investigative Response Teams of (b)(7)(E) S/As have been activated to assist Baltimore City & Frederick as needed. (b)(7)(E) ATF Canine handlers & (b)(7)(E) EEO are assisting Frederick Co PD. (b)(7)(E) Investigative Response Team is assisting Delaware State Police & Wilmington PD.

Charlotte Field Division

- On 06/05/2020, the Union County Sheriff's Office requested ATF assistance regarding several vehicles that were on fire near a strip mall parking lot. SACFI responded and discovered **3 vehicles had been firebombed**. Two of the vehicles were completely burned and the third vehicle was slightly damaged. The vehicles and an adjacent business had BLM spray painted on them. Scene was processed and **four molotov cocktails were recovered**. Currently, there are no suspects.
- On June 4, 2020, ATF Raleigh S/As, in coordination with RPD, **arrested one individual responsible for committing the arson of an RPD patrol vehicle**. The person was charged in the Eastern District of North Carolina for violating **18 U.S.C. Section 844(f)**. During this investigation, agents obtained a confession from the suspect and recovered video evidence. One additional suspect has been identified and is still outstanding.
- On June 4, 2020, ATF Raleigh received information (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) had made social media threats to conduct a mass shooting at the protest in Raleigh, NC. ATF Raleigh obtained a copy of the video and a report of a previous incident with (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) possessing a firearm as a convicted felon. **A criminal complaint was obtained in the Eastern District of NC for 18 U.S.C. 922(g) by ATF**. ATF, FBI and Raleigh Police Department took (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) into custody after conducting surveillance and determining his location.

Miami Field Division

- During the late night of May 31st, 2020, unknown individual(s) **forced entry into Tactical Weapons, an FFL in Pompano Beach, FL**. The suspects utilized a vehicle to

breach the front entrance but were **unsuccessful in acquiring any firearms**. The ATF Miami Field Division was not alerted to the attempted burglary until June 5th, 2020. A review of the video surveillance revealed that 3 males directed another male who was driving a white VW sedan, to reverse into the glass storefront. Once the glass and inner steel structure was defeated, the 4 subjects entered the storefront, moments later the subjects ran out and left the scene in the same vehicle. The vehicle had a paper temporary tag attached **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)**. A countywide BOLO was broadcasted with the vehicle information. Through the video surveillance, the sleeping subject in the suspicious car at the rear of the building was cleared of suspected involvement, FI card completed and subject released. Crime Scene was notified and responded to process the scene.

- On June 3, 2020; Miami Group IV was requested by FBI Miami JTTF and Miami PD to assist in the investigation of the **arson of four City of Miami PD marked vehicles**. These vehicles were set on fire during a protest. Due to the fact the protests and incidents decreased in the City of Miami over the last several days, on June 5th, an ATF CFI and S/A's from Miami IV responded to process the vehicles for evidence. Fire samples will be sent to the ATF lab for analysis.

New York Field Division

- Rochester, NY Police Department TFOs temporarily re-assigned back to the city for plain clothes duty in light of civil unrest.

Newark Field Division

- A total of **12 fires** have been related to the ongoing civil unrest since May 31 in New Jersey.
 - 4 dumpster fires.
 - 2 police vehicle fires.
 - 2 non-police vehicle fires.
 - 2 garbage can fires.
 - 1 rubbish fire.
 - 1 minor thermal damage to a mailbox with some scorch marks
- Before the start of the Asbury Park, NJ protest sweeps were conducted and **bottles containing flammable liquid** and pre-positioned objects (bricks and rocks) were discovered hidden along the protest route.

Philadelphia Field Division

- A NIBIN examination of the firearm recovered from the Firing Line FLL attempted robbery was negative.
- A NIBIN examination of the FCCs recovered from Delia's FFL attempted robbery was negative.
- On 6/5/2020, PFD Group II (A&E) and PPD CSU **processed the following ATM explosion scenes**; CVS - 6344 Stenton Ave, CVS - 1600 Wadsworth, CVS -4400 Castor Ave, CVS - 6562 Haverford Ave (Non explosive event) and 4300 Township Line Road, Upper Darby, PA.

CENTRAL REGION

Chicago Field Division

- Federal Arrest – 18 USC 844(i), 26 USC 5861(c), 5845(a), 5845(f). On Friday, June 5, 2020, members of the Milwaukee I Field Office – Chicago Field Division, and the Milwaukee Police Department **arrested** (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), by criminal complaint **for federal arson and possession and use of a Destructive Device (Molotov Cocktail)** during the civil unrest in Milwaukee, WI on May 31, 2020. SMITH was witnessed by MPD officers throwing a lit Molotov Cocktail into a Boost Mobile Retail Store. Officers quickly arrested (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and extinguished the unbroken, but burning, Molotov Cocktail inside the store and collected components. **Upon his arrest, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was in possession of a Taurus, Model PT709 Slim, 9mm handgun. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was not prohibited at the time of his arrest.** This case is being prosecuted in the Eastern Judicial District of Wisconsin.

Kansas City Field Division

- During a night of civil disturbance across Des Moines, Iowa on June 1, 2020, a passerby discovered and reported a **fire** shortly before 1:15 a.m. at the Git N Go gas station and convenience store, 865 42nd Street in Des Moines. Through investigation and video surveillance this fire was deemed an **arson**. The investigation is being worked by Des Moines Field Office in conjunction with Des Moines PD. At this time all leads have been exhausted and ATF will be issuing a reward for information.

Louisville Field Division

- On 5/30/20, at approximately 0001 hours, the LFD, LMPD, and LMAB responded to the Louisville Metro Government building at 444 S 5th Street, Louisville, KY for a report that **protestors had set fire to the structure**. All agencies had to evacuate scene shortly after the fire was extinguished due to protestors. ATF did not respond at this time, and a very limited scene examination was conducted by the LMAB. Investigation continues by ATF CFI.

New Orleans Field Division

- On 6/5/20 an emotionally disturbed individual drove his vehicle through the front doors of the Target Store in Hammond, LA. He had thrown packages out of his vehicle at two other locations nearby, and had thrown packages in the Target parking lot, as well as inside once he crashed in the doors. **ATF Group I & II agents responded, including an SABT and an ATF EDC K9.** EDC examined the items left by the suspect at the different locations. There were no alerts, and **no explosives discovered**. Local Police, LSP, other agencies, and FBI responded.

St Paul Field Division

- Social media posts received from Rachel Storlie (Bloomington) regarding suspect **setting fire at unknown location**. Possible ID on suspect is (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (DOB: (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)). Additional Twitter post found, indicating this incident may have been located at 31st and Grand. Posts/photo referenced available in VCC.
- St. Paul II Area Office (IOI (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)) received a phone call from (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) on 6/5/2020 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) **witnessed an arson on 5/28/2020 of a semi-truck and building**

near 29th Ave in Minneapolis, MN. He disclosed that he had video footage of the suspects and their vehicles and that he was willing to provide this information to the ATF. St. Paul CGIC, IRS (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) added MN DL info and photo and a Lexis Report of (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) NForce is negative. *Note: **The location of the incident is IVO two KNOWN fires.** It is unknown if this tip is a new event or duplicative reporting.

WEST REGION

Dallas Field Office

- ATF Lubbock: Surveillance video showed 5 males (possible juveniles) **attempting to gain access into Patriot Firearms**, Lubbock TX at 12:50 a.m. HVAC unit removed from rooftop, one individual made entry through air duct into shooting range area but was **unable to gain access into retail area**. Alarm was triggered by individual leaving through range door. Five males seen running from location at 12:50 a.m.
- On May 29, 2020, at approx. 12:30 pm, US Army Corps of Engineer staff located damage to lower spillway of the Lewisville Dam. Lewisville Police, Fire and Lead Ranger were notified. The investigation revealed a possible **homemade explosive device** was detonated causing a 2.5 foot wide x 1 inch deep circle into the concrete with approximately a 100 foot long fuse. Debris was located 50 feet from the blast site. Fire Marshal notified FBI as well.

Denver Field Division

- ATF CFI and TFO responded to a **structure fire at a vacant restaurant** at 321E Colfax Ave (a block away from the Capitol). The fire was located on an exterior patio on the north side of the building. ATF CFI collected two fire debris samples and submitted to Denver PD lab due to overload of fire cases at ATF lab. No cameras in area facing in the right direction to capture anything. No incendiary devices found. No injuries or fatalities reported.

Houston Field Division

- Black Sheep Arms **FFL received a suspicious phone call** from an individual asking about their inventory. The FFL informed the caller that they primarily do cerakoting and do not carry a large inventory of firearms. This call prompted the FFL to notify ATF. IRS (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) identified the caller and shared with RAC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) the subject's information. Also, the caller had an outstanding state probation violation warrant. Austin PD has arrested the individual and the subject was interviewed by Austin FO TFO. The subject denies planning an FFL burglary.
- ATF CES will stage with Austin PD Bomb Squad to assist with any explosives or Molotov incidents.
- ATF will be present at Austin PD Comms/Command Center
- ATF SA will be present at FBI Command Center

Los Angeles Field Division

- Los Angeles – On 6/4/2020 in Chinatown, **one man was killed and another was wounded** as they walked home from a peaceful protest when a **vehicle drove by and fired shots**. Neither a suspect nor vehicle description was available. ATF LA II has been advised and will follow up if the casings were recovered and ensure the casings are entered into NIBIN.

Phoenix Field Division

- ABQ FFL burglary update: Case is still being actively worked and leads have been developed.

San Francisco Field Division

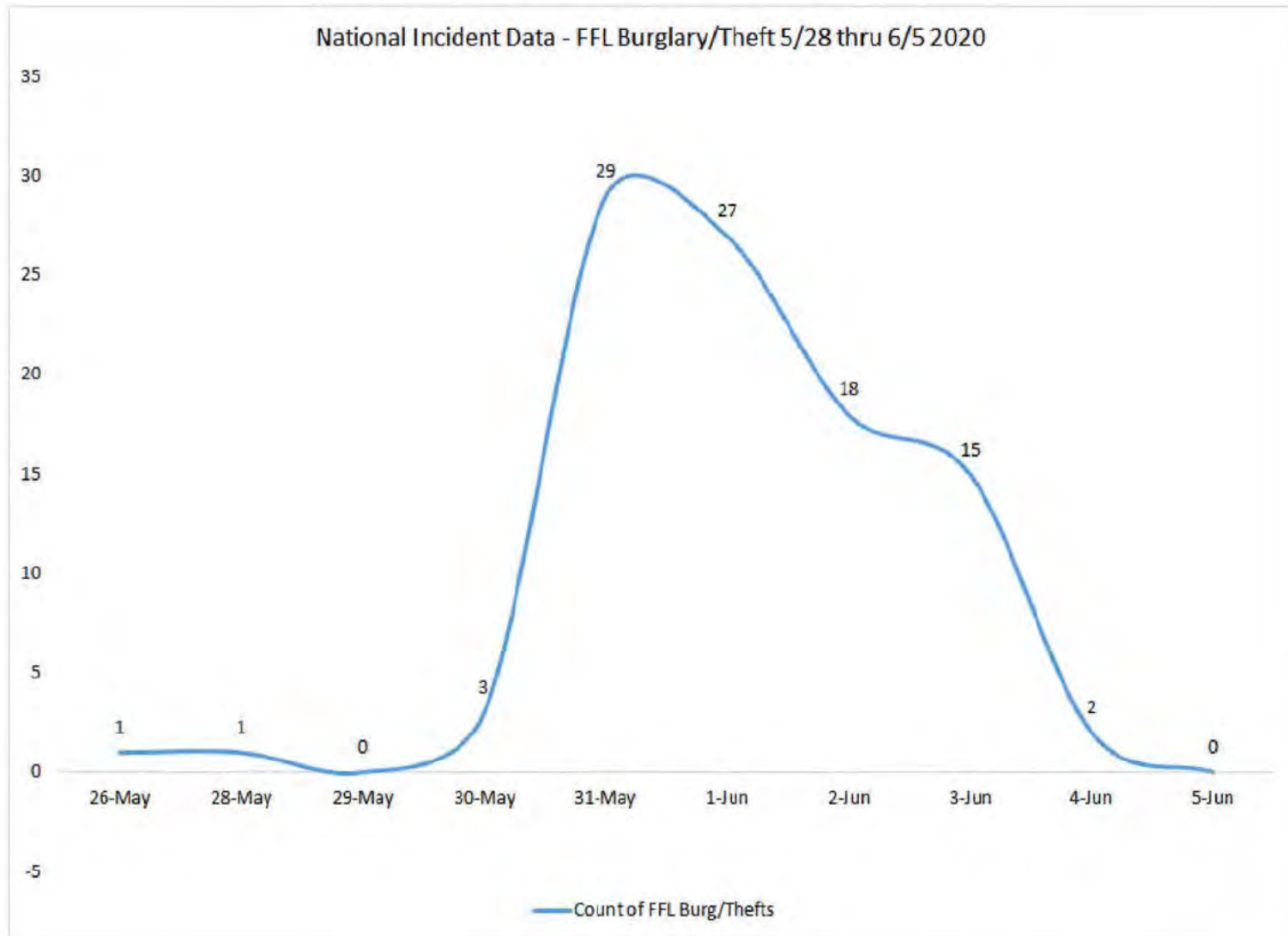
- ATF **arrested three people** and charged them via federal complaint

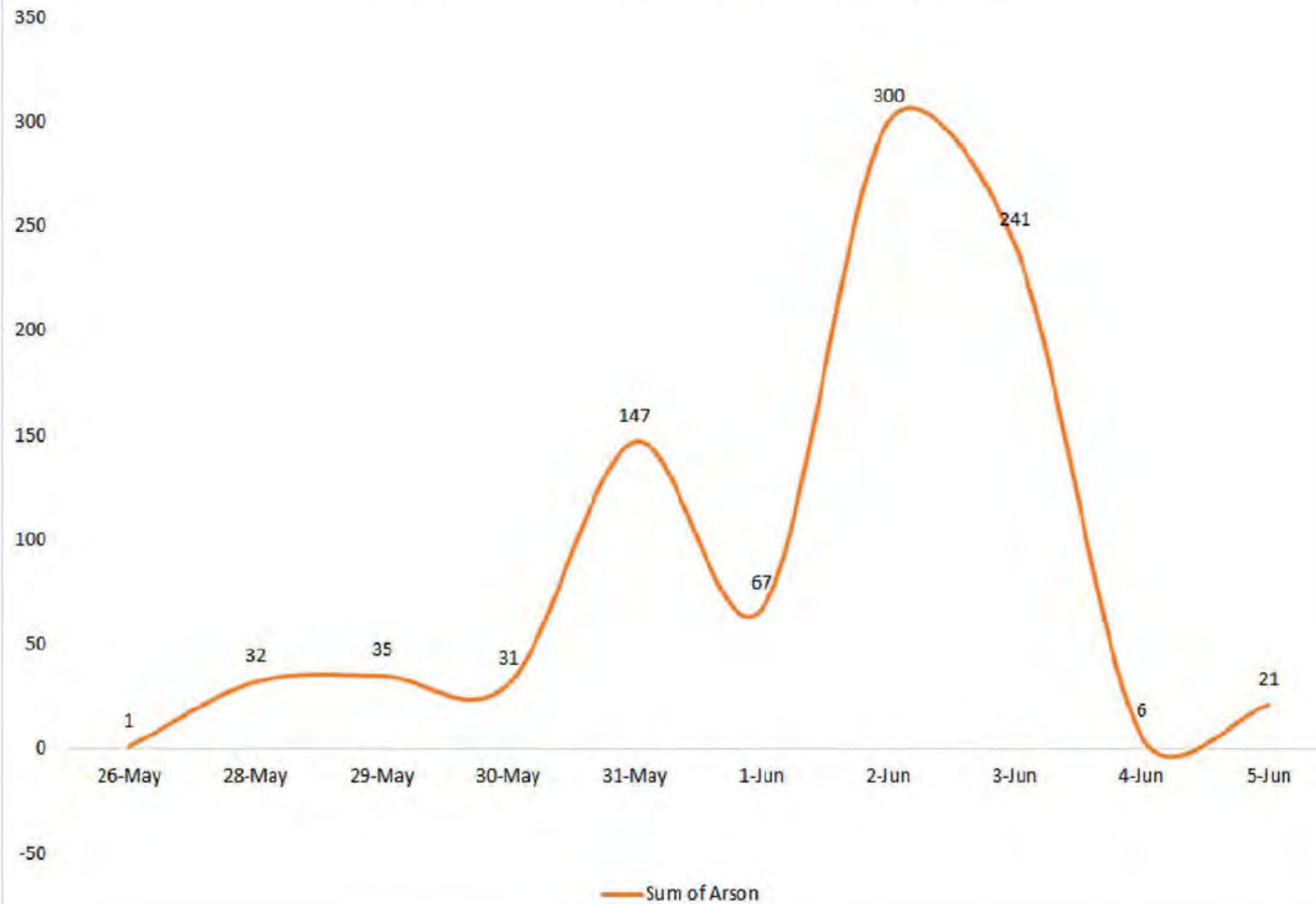
VCC Civil Unrest Data

EAST REGION

Charlotte Field Division

- Raleigh Field Office Special Agents are deploying to effect the **federal arrest** of the individual that used a **Molotov cocktail** to burn a **Raleigh Police Department vehicle** during the civil unrest. In addition to the aforementioned arrest, the Raleigh Field Office will also be effecting the **federal arrest** of an individual who made threats on social media. These charges stem from a firearm possession incident that occurred on 4/19/2020.

- On June 4, 2020, ATF Fayetteville FO was notified that Military Pawn, located at 5000 Bragg Blvd, Fayetteville, NC was burglarized at approximately 3 a.m. on May 31, 2020, related to the current civil unrest. Approximately four (b)(3) firearms have been reported missing at this time. No injuries were reported. Agents and IOIs from the Fayetteville FO are working the investigation with assistance from FPD.
- A SABT has deployed to assist the Charlotte/Mecklenburg Police Department in any explosive related incidents during the protests.

New York Field Division

- On May 30, 2020, at approximately 1906hrs, a **modular office** (trailer with electricity) in **Rochester, New York** was engulfed in flames during riots in the city. It has been determined that this fire was intentionally set. ATF Rochester, NY is working jointly local fire investigators and the USAO on this investigation.

Philadelphia Field Division

- On June 4, 2020, the Task Force processed the following ATF explosion scenes: Unknown: 4400 Market St Philadelphia PA, Unknown 5901 Turner Philadelphia PA, P&P Gas 1300 E. - The Task Force also responded to one arson at Superior Auto Body and Repair -2438 Germantown Ave.
- Philadelphia FD, Group II (Arson & Explosives) is continuing to process arson and ATM explosions scenes.
- On June 2, 2020, ATF in conjunction with the PA Attorney General's Office conducted an investigation into (b)(6), (b)(7)(C). The investigation was initiated after Crump posted pictures of M-type devices for sale on Instagram. An AG UC met with Crump and saw the devices. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) **arrested and 12 M-1000's were recovered**. On June 3, 2020, a search warrant was executed at his house, which resulted in the recovery of 30 M-1000's (approximately six pounds). **Federal charges are possible**.

Washington Field Division

- Thursday, June 4, 2020, @ 0340 hrs Secret Service contacted the JSOC **requesting ATF** to respond to 16th and Constitution Avenue, NW **regarding a vehicle with a large amount of fireworks**.
- There have been zero unrest-related arrests in the "June 3 – June 4" overnight time frame as of 0600 hours. From Saturday night May 30 through 0600 hours on Thursday, June 4, 2020
 - There have been 427 individuals arrested and processed for curfew violations, riot-

- related burglary, and other riot-related events. Of these, twenty-four (24) were juveniles.
 - 19: Saturday night 5/30 into Sunday morning 5/31 (1 juvenile).
 - 90: Sunday night 5/31 into Monday morning 6/1 (curfew in effect at 11pm) (10 juveniles).
 - 289: Monday night 6/1 into Tuesday morning 6/2 (curfew in effect at 7pm) (9 juveniles).
 - 29: Tuesday night 6/2 into Wednesday morning 6/3 (curfew in effect at 7pm) (4 juveniles).
 - Wednesday night 6/3 into Thursday morning 6/4 (curfew in effect at 11pm) (0 juveniles).
- 521 charges have been filed against the 427 individuals. These charges are in the following categories:
 - 330 (63%): Curfew Violations
 - 57 (11%): Felony Rioting (tumultuous and violent conduct with grave danger of or actual serious injury to persons or serious property damage)
 - 54 (10%): Burglary
 - 16 (3%): Other property crimes (damaging, receiving stolen)
 - 13 (2%): Unlawful entry
 - 4 (1%): Assault on a police officer
 - 7 (1%): Resisting arrest
 - 8 (2%): Weapons violations
 - 3 (1%): Simple assaults and threats
 - 33 (6%): Other (disorderly, riot misdemeanor, narcotics, traffic, release violations)

Newark Field Division

- On 05/31/2020, in the evening hours, two **Trenton, NJ Police Department vehicles were set on fire** and numerous businesses were vandalized and looted.

CENTRAL REGION

Chicago Field Division

- On Thursday June 4, 2020, members of the Chicago Field Division charged (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) a felon by criminal complaint with 922(g)(1) felon in possession, after he was arrested during the civil unrest occurring in the City of Chicago on May 31, 2020. Chicago Police Department was responding to a call of **looting and shooting** in progress at a liquor store when they observed (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) exit the store and then attempt to flee. He was subsequently taken into custody and Chicago Police Department recovered a firearm from his person.
- Chicago Field Division continues to partner with the USAO, Chicago Police Department and the Cook County State's Attorney's Office to charge additional subjects captured in possession of firearms while causing violence while looting and rioting during this civil unrest.
- On June 3, 2020, at approximately 1120 hours, ATF Certified Explosive Specialist and Illinois State Bomb Squad responded to WKS Liquidations regarding a Facebook posting of an IED that was placed just inside the front door of the business in order to deter looting. Illinois State Bomb Squad determined the device to be a hoax device.
- On 6/1/2020 at approximately 2:30 a.m., individual(s) **attempted to break into Smileys Sports Shop Inc.** in Bloomington, IL. The suspects broke a window in the back of the

building (bathroom window) which set off the alarm. No cameras are equipped in the back of the building and no suspect vehicle video was captured. **Suspects did not gain entry and no firearms stolen.** FFL boarded up windows with plywood. Bloomington PD along with the FFL responded. On 6/3/2020, SIOI (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) contacted FFL responsible person regarding this incident.

Louisville Field Division

- On 5/30/20, at approximately 0001 hours, the LFD, LMPD, and LMAB responded to the Louisville Metro Government building at 444 S 5th Street, Louisville, KY for a report that protestors had set fire to the structure. All agencies had to give up the scene shortly after the fire was extinguished because of the protestors. ATF did not respond at this time, and a very limited scene examination was conducted by the LMAB.
- On 06/03/20 Wednesday, the LMAB were finally successful at getting video from the state government building's security system. When we reviewed the video last night it depicted a masked male setting the fire with what appeared to be an **ignitable liquid**, and protestors rummaging through the structure searching for possible building plans or other paperwork.
- On 06/03/20 Wednesday evening, Louisville Metro Arson Bureau requested ATF assistance with having the video enhanced by the **ATF DIB**.

Nashville Field Office

- Chattanooga: Arrest of individual on rooftop with multiple firearms. Interview conducted by ATF & FBI.

Saint Paul Field Division

- **As of June 4, 2020, USAO's charged 33 individuals with varying crimes** ranging from use of explosive or fire to damage or destroy a vehicle used in interstate commerce; travelling in interstate commerce or using a facility of interstate commerce to incite a riot; organize, promote, encourage, participate in or carry on a riot; and use of an explosive device; ad conspiracy to destroy by fire and explosive.

WEST REGION

Dallas Field Office

- ATF Dallas Group VII obtained a federal arrest warrant for (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was arrested on June 3, 2020 by partner LE agencies after being identified in Social Media as being a threat to law enforcement and who had possessed a Glock 43X at the time of custody. Shortly after arrest, ATF Dallas Group VII interviewed (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who was confirmed to be in possession of a stolen firearm and had (b)(6), (b)(7)(C). The investigation continues.
- ATF El Paso JTTF LNO was notified of two suspicious suitcases located at a park. More information to follow.
- ATF Fort Worth / Updated Information: Video was obtained from several businesses yesterday in support of the ongoing investigation regarding the **attempted arson at the Tarrant County Subwest Courthouse** on 06/01/2020. ATF Fort Worth identified promising video from a 7-11 located about 1 mile from the scene around the time of the fire shows 2 possible suspect vehicles and 3-4 possible suspects. Video was not clear enough for vehicle ID. SAs and FWFD investigators continue the video canvas today. ATF Fort

Worth will coordinate with the Division PIO for media assistance. The AUSA was briefed yesterday.

- Regarding the arson at the convenience stores on 06/03/2020, ATF Fort Worth completed a video canvass and expecting to receive additional video downloads today. Video to date does not supply enough clear footage to ID any suspects or vehicles. No other leads or suspects at this time.

Denver Field Division

- Denver, CO: On May 30, a rioter engaged Denver Police Department (DPD) undercover officers in conversation about his hatred of police. The subject pulled a pistol and told the undercover officers that he was going to kill the **“pig helicopter pilots”** and **fired multiple shots at the DPD** air unit and ran. The officers followed him to a house. On June 4, DPD served a **state search warrant** at the house and recovered a pistol. The suspect shooter was discovered to be a two-time felon out of California. ATF Denver Group IV is working with DPD and the USAO to **perfect a federal** case on the suspect.

Houston Field Division

- This evening, protests are expected to begin at 6pm in downtown Austin. **ATF CES** will stage with Austin PD Bomb Squad to assist with any **explosives or Molotov incidents**. ATF SA will stage with FBI and HSI at Travis County Jail to assist with **interviews** of persons arrested during protests. ATF will be present at Austin PD Comms/Command Center ATF SA will be present at FBI Command Center.
- 62 National Guard members are onsite at the Capitol (Austin, TX).
- As of June 4, 2020, the following **FFL burglary attempts** have occurred within the Houston AOR:

- On 06/03/2020, at approximately 11:45pm, ATF San Antonio was called to assist SAPD Bomb Squad and SAPD with possible **Molotov cocktails**. **San Antonio PD arrested** a subject who claimed to have **Molotov cocktails** in vehicle. San Antonio PD obtaining a state search warrant to search vehicle. The search warrant was executed **but no device** was recovered from the vehicle. The suspect was in possession of a firearm but is not federally prohibited. The suspect **was arrested for state unlawful carry and drug possession charges**. FBI SABB was on scene as well.
- On 06/03/2020, at approximately 11:30 AM, the Texas Fusion Center is tracking Instagram posts by user, “Ace The Shooter,” concerning **threats to burn down ICE facilities** in the San Antonio area. The posts include the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Office Building located at 1015 Jackson Keller Rd., Unit 100, San Antonio, TX 78213. Two individuals have been identified from the Instagram posts and DHS HSI was investigating.

- On the evening of June 4, 2020, protests are expected to begin at 6pm in downtown Austin. Sixty two (62) National Guard members are onsite at the Capital. An ATF CES will stage with Austin PD Bomb Squad to assist with any explosives or Molotov incidents. An ATF SA will stage with FBI and HSI at Travis County Jail to assist with interviews of persons arrested during protests. ATF will be present at the following locations: Austin PD Comms/Command Center, FBI Command Center.

Los Angeles Field Division

- On June 4, 2020, Agents of the LA II Field Office, along with agents from the Glendale II A&E Group, began **working with the Santa Monica Fire Department** to provide **investigative assistance** at a restaurant, the Sake House, damaged during the civil unrest.
- On 6/3/2020, San Diego County Sheriff Bill Gore requested the assistance of the California National Guard to support police in La Mesa and deputies around the county amid continuing protests. On Wednesday night, National Guard troops were stationed at entry points around the La Mesa Police Department headquarters. (100) members of the California National Guard were being deployed to La Mesa, and (100) more would be deployed elsewhere across the county providing security to critical infrastructures (public buildings, courthouses, power grids, etc.) during the protests to prevent looting & arson.

San Francisco Field Division

- The FPS is investigating an arson and several instances of vandalism. The targeted facility is located at 1301 Clay Street in Oakland, California. The incident allegedly occurred on Friday, May 29, 2020 between 10:00 pm and 10:05 pm. **ATF Field office is located in Federal Building.**

Seattle Field Division

- Tacoma Metro Area, FFL Thefts on 6/03/2020. While driving by Tacoma Police Officers observed windows having broken out of AAA Loans and Gunshop. Officers observed this 3-4 minutes prior to the alarm being sent to TPD dispatch. While unconfirmed it is estimated that 20 to 25 handguns were taken. ATF SA's and IOI's responded to scene. The investigation continues.
- On 03/03/2020, Tacoma Police Department officers contacted Manuel Ellis while he appeared to be in an excited delirium. Officers were able to handcuff and arrest Ellis after he assaulted officers. During the contact, a radio recording revealed that Ellis states: "I can't breathe". While in custody Ellis died despite attempting life-saving measures. The official cause of death was ruled as a homicide due to respiratory arrest due to hypoxia due to physical restraint with dilated methamphetamines and dilated cardiomyopathy as contributing factors. The results of the autopsy were released on 6/02/2020. Due to the

autopsy being recently released and the similarities between Ellis' death and George Loyd's death there is a possibility of increased civil unrest in the Tacoma and surrounding areas. It should be noted there was a peaceful vigil held for Ellis near his arrest site on 6/03/2020.
