Incident Summary:

Numerous civil disturbances are taking place in multiple cities across the U.S., some turning violent. Due to acts of vandalism, arson, and trespassing, many jurisdictions imposed curfews and facility lockdowns, as well as declaring States of Emergency and activating National Guard units. Governors and mayors are working with law enforcement to discourage violence and restore order.

Key Points:

- · No significant impacts to critical infrastructure have been reported at this time
- The area around the White House complex, including all of Lafayette Square, will remain closed to the public until June 10 due to ongoing unrest
- The curfew in Washington, D.C. was lifted on Thursday night, and there are no reports of it resuming this weekend
- Open source reports indicate protests this weekend in D.C. could be the largest thus far
- Looting damage is estimated to cost the 20 largest metropolitan areas of the U.S. upwards of \$400 million

CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPACTS

COMMERCIAL FACILITIES

The Anderson Economic Group, a private consulting group, announced they estimate looting damage in the 20 largest metropolitan areas of the U.S. will cost approximately \$400 million. The analysis covers the period between 29 May and 03 Jun and includes property damage, lost inventory, cleanup and reconstruction costs, and closure-related lost wages. The estimate does not include costs to state or local governments or smaller metropolitan areas.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

(Law Enforcement)

Open source reports the FBI issued a bulletin to police nationwide warning of explosives devices being used to target law enforcement, the most common types of devices being Molotov cocktails and fireworks.

The Washington, D.C. Mayor requested the President remove all additional federal law enforcement and military

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presence from the city.

All 57 members of the Buffalo, NY Police Department's Emergency Response Team (ERT) resigned on Friday after two members were suspended; they will continue serving as members of the Police Department, but not on the ERT.

GOVERNMENT FACILITIES

The area around the White House complex, including all of Lafayette Square, will remain closed to the public until June 10 due to ongoing unrest.

The Richard Bolling Federal Building, Kansas City Missouri, is closed as of 05 Jun due to planned protests that will be in the immediate area. The planned protests is estimated to be between 800 to 5000 protestors and is scheduled to start at 11:00am. Normal operations are planned to resume on 06 Jun.

TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS

(Highway and Motor Carrier)

Multiple roads, bridges, and highways continue to have temporary closures in the active areas of unrest.

ACTIVATIONS AND DECLARATIONS


At least 32 states and Washington D.C. have deployed the National Guard: AL, AR, AZ, CA, CO, DC, FL, GA, IL, IN, KY, MA, MD, MI, MN, MO, NC, ND, NE, NV, NY, OH, OK, PA, SC, SD, TN, TX, UT, VA, WA, WI.

The Utah National Guard deployed teams of Green Berets to Washington, D.C.; Guard officials stated the soldiers were sent to support because they are available, not to conduct their traditional unconventional warfare mission.

Curfews have begun to expire across the country.

- Open source reports approximately 7,200 people were arrested in 43 cities
- · Curfews put in place across the country due to civil unrest
- Multiple instances of civil disturbances continue nationwide
- All federal prisons are under a complete lockdown

CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPACTS

COMMERCIAL FACILITIES

The president invoked the 1807 Insurrection Act to mobilize the military around the country. This action is to take "swift action" to protect Washington, D.C., including dispatching "thousands and thousands of heavily armed soldiers, military personnel, and law enforcement officers to stop the rioting, looting, vandalism, assaults, and the wanton destruction of property."

(Public Assembly)

A protest is scheduled from 02 Jun to 05 Jun in Fenton, MO at the Sabre plant. Sabre produces police, military, and corrections pepper spray.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

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Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency Integrated Operations Division



(Law Enforcement)

The New York Police Department has suspended all solo patrols in response to violent protests.

FOOD AND AGRICULTURE

The Pennsylvania Department of Human Services briefed on 01 Jun, they are having food supply/distribution issues with current protests taking place in several locations.

GOVERNMENT FACILITIES

The Pentagon ordered an active duty battalion of military police soldiers from Fort Bragg, NC to deploy to the Washington, D.C. area as the city prepares for more civil disturbances

The Indiana State Department of Health is working remotely due to potential unrest in downtown Indianapolis.

The Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) has placed all of their facilities on complete lockdown, due to large gatherings and rioting for the first time in 25 years. The bureau runs 122 institutions nationwide and approximately 165,575 inmates were in the federal system as of Monday night.

(Elections)

Many states are adjusting their curfew Tuesday, due to the primary elections being held, some localities (including Washington, D.C.) made curfew exemptions for voters and poll workers.

There is a planned protest in Rapid City, SD, prior to the closing of the polls, which may take place near the County Administration building where the County Auditor sits. Local law enforcement are aware of the protest and will have extra resources to ensure the integrity of the voting process.

TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS

(Highway and Motor Carrier)

The United States Secret Service (USSS) reports the following roadways will be closed to vehicular traffic:

- Constitution Avenue NW, between 15th and 17th Street
- 17th Street NW, between Constitution Avenue and H Street
- 15th Street NW, between Constitution Avenue and H Street
- H Street NW, between 15th Street and 17th Street

Multiple roads, bridges, and highways have closed in the active areas of unrest.

ACTIVATIONS AND DECLARATIONS


At least 31 states and Washington D.C. have deployed the National Guard: AL, AR, AZ, CA, CO, DC, FL, GA, IL, IN, KY, MA, MD, MI, MN, MO, NC, ND, NE, NV, NY, OH, OK, PA, SC, SD, TN, TX, UT, VA, WA, WI.

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At least 28 states across the country had imposed curfews within one or more cities, including AZ, CA, CO, DC, DE, FL, GA, IL, IN, IA, KY, MI, MN, MO, NE, NV, NY, NJ, OH, OR, PA, SC, TN, TX, VA, UT, WA, and WI.

Arizona will be under a statewide curfew until 08 Jun. The curfew will be in effect from 2300 ET to 0800 ET (2000 – 0500 local), nightly. At least 200 people have been arrested in Phoenix.



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Critical Infrastructure Involved: Commercial Facilities (Public Assembly, Retail), Government Facilities, Healthcare and Public Health, Information Technology, Transportation Systems (Aviation, Highway and Motor Carrier, Mass Transit and Passenger Rail)

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
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
