The attached IIB prepared by DHS I&A is the only recent product I've seen specific to the violence in Portland. There are a few reports available that look at different groups that have threatened our personnel, facilities and highlights their modus operandi, such as the attached HSI Intel Bulletin on ANTIFA.

The assessments produced by HSI are almost solely focused on our investigative categories and investigative targets, looking at narcotics smuggling, human smuggling, theft of military tech, etc... We're reaching out to FBI to see if they can share any network development they've put together related to the domestic violence and on-going civil unrest in the region that may be helpful.

DHS and DOJ are working on a joint protective operation between June 26th and July 8th in response to attacks on public buildings, monuments, and artwork. This is likely to result in some kind of planned operation around the dates of Jul 3-5 and flexible deterrent and patrol/response operations for the rest of the period. While there is no specific credible intelligence regarding threats to federal facilities on 4th of July in R10 there has been a lot of “chatter” on social media and there is concern at the highest levels of government that there may be problems at multiple locations across the nation. FBI is standing up some intelligence support that will be in place from now until July 8th and will also have tactical assets on standby.

If a threat to federal facilities emerges its likely all the components would be tasked to support. Its not entirely clear who is “in charge” of this operation but FPS is being asked to coordinate at the Regional level. All of this is subject to change, correction, superseding guidance etc., but here’s what we ***think*** it may look like:

- From now until July 8th some sort of standby order exists with teams prepped to support federal facilities. This includes potentially out of Region as there have been other hotspots
- A planned protective operation, potentially 2 or more days, for July 3-4. In R10 we would anticipate this looking similar to the operations we were doing a few weeks ago
 - Focus would likely be the large downtown buildings in Seattle and Portland, with some protection also at Spokane FOB and possibly Tacoma USCH
- Possibly some sort of 10-14 LEO “QRF” is stood up in Seattle or Portland with airlift on standby. I’m guessing an existing DHS components tactical team would get this mission, ICE SRT or BORTAC
- My understanding is all the components are funding this out of existing budgets (sorry!)

We are working with DHS and DOJ HQ to scrub and prioritize lists of facilities but we think ours will be similar to recent weeks as we don’t have controversial art or monuments at other locations. If an intel SITREP is developed we will solicit you for who you want on distro. Will let know anything else relevant as soon as we can.

A nightly siege condition has materialized at the Justice Center/PPB Central Precinct that is adjacent to Hatfield USCH and Edith Green Building. PPB has attempted to take a very conservative/defensive posture but the more violent crowd later at night will begin tearing down the fence (breached the fence at Hatfield last night, was repaired by USMS) and throwing volleys of bottles, fireworks, etc. When PPB is forced to disperse them their secondary site of Pioneer Courthouse Square is adjacent to Pioneer USCH which is the target of frequent probing attacks.

Also, the US Attorney District of Oregon just met with Portland Police. For the last few days there has been a barrier system of bollards and fence surrounding the downtown core including the Hatfield USCH and Edith Green Wendell Wyatt Building. The City of Portland is taking that down ASAP as they are experiencing crowd sizes too big to secure a barrier system that large. They expressed that violence against LE is increasing in Portland. BLUF is they are telling us they don't think they'll be able to protect federal facilities.

In talking with the US Attorney and Marshal in Spokane they indicated that things are fairly stable there. Chief (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) could Spokane Sector USBP support the facilities in Portland? If so, how soon?

Medical Examiner report issued yesterday ruled death a homicide with cause of death as hypoxia due to physical restraint with underlying factor extreme methamphetamine intoxication. That report has been obtained by the Tacoma News Tribune and has been published.

DHS Support to Protect Federal Facilities and Property

Purpose: The purpose of this memorandum is to provide guidance for direct support to the Federal Protective Service and our interagency partners to protect all federal facilities and property.

Introduction: The Department plays a key role in protecting Federal facilities and property primarily through the Federal Protective Service (FPS) and in partnership with other DHS law enforcement Components, interagency partners, and state and local partners. Recently, we have seen numerous instigators, criminals and other bad actors use peaceful protests to harm people and property, both Federal and private. For the past month, these bad actors have continued their unlawful activity which has resulted in numerous threats, disruption, and damage to Federal facilities and property.

Background: On June 26, the President issued the following Executive Order: Protecting American Monuments, Memorials, and Statues and Combating Recent Criminal Activity. In this order, the President directed that DHS "shall provide, as appropriate and consistent with applicable law, personnel to assist with the protection of Federal monuments, memorials, statues, or property."

In furtherance of this directive, I have formalized the DHS Protecting American Communities Task Force (PACT) to provide an ongoing assessment of potential civil unrest and property destruction and to address internal resource allocation and potential surge activity to ensure the continuing protection of people and property.

Additionally, with the consent of other Departments and Agencies, I have determined that it is in the public interest and fiscally sound for FPS to partner with other federal law enforcement to execute the direction of the President. To that end, DHS began coordination with the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Department of the Interior (DOI) to establish information/intelligence sharing and resource coordination as outlined in the order.

Action: The upcoming July 4th holiday weekend has the potential for increased disruptive activity at specific locations across the country that could threaten our personnel and the Federal facilities and property they protect. DHS will be forward leaning in preparing to protect Federal facilities and property.

Components with law enforcement personnel will coordinate with the Office of Operations Coordination and the FPS to:

1. Pre-position PACT Rapid Deployment Teams (RDT) or their equivalent (with appropriate training, equipment, and command and control) at each of the following locations: Portland, OR; Seattle, WA; and the District of Columbia, no later than 2 July to be used in a reserve force role.
2. Provide regional RDT's on standby to be used as a strategic reserve that can deploy within 6 hours of notification by the Department and to any location in the United States. The RDTs should be available by 2 July.
3. Complete cross-designation consent and the appropriate training with FPS to legally allow Components to support the protection of Federal facilities and property. This action must be complete prior to 2 July.

DHS' Office of Operations Coordination will continue to facilitate Department-level information sharing, reporting, and all other supporting actions across the Components and with our DOJ/DOI partners. FPS will continue to serve as the Department's lead for the protection of Federal facilities and property and shall be supported by Operational Components and all other DHS organizations.

Components should use existing guiding principles and risk assessments in support of this mission, ensuring the safety and security of our personnel.

Hello All,

I was contacted today by (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) the Deputy Chief of OPLA DCLD (District Court Law Division) at OPLA HQ. We are responding to four lawsuits filed relating to the Portland protests. Additionally, contempt charges were just filed today, which we will need to respond to. We will need information quickly, as discovery has been expedited.

Here are the questions DCLD has so far:

1. Have we had ERO DOs or HSI SAs on the ground during the protests? If so, do we have a list of names?
2. Was any training provided to ERO/HSI for the protection of property/crowd control?
3. We may need to get individual training records for any of the officers involved in the "incidents" for contempt. How can we acquire those records?
4. Do we have a copy of the cross-designation memo between ICE and FPS?
5. Regarding the contempt charges, once we have a copy of the complaint, we will need to look at the names and see if any of our officers/agents were involved.

I have spoken on the phone with (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) with FPS). (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) sent me a copy of the designation memo, which is attached. It was issued on June 4, 2020, and expired 45 days from that date, which was July 19, 2020 (by my count). I have asked (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) if the designation memo was extended. He does not know, but is looking into it. If there is an extension memo, he will send it to me.

My understanding from speaking with (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) is that ERO-SRT has been on the ground, along with U.S. Marshals Special Operations, FPS, and Border Patrol. ICE HQ has a schedule of SRT deployments, and there is a rotation of officers, coming from across the country.

My understanding from (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) who oversees the Seattle AOR SRT, is that the ERO Seattle AOR is currently on the ground. Los Angeles, SFR, and San Diego ERO have been or will be involved.

FOR UNITED STATES IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS
ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL**

With the consent of the Deputy Director and Senior Official Performing the Duties of the Director of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), and pursuant to my delegated authorities from the Under Secretary of Management, as memorialized in DHS Delegation No. 02500 § II(D) (Dec. 18, 2019) and Title 40, United States Code, Section 1315(b)(1), I designate you as a law enforcement officer for duty in connection with your support of the Federal Protective Service (FPS) in the protection of federal property and persons on the impacted federal property that are under FPS's protection responsibility.

This designation is limited to law enforcement functions on the federal property assigned to you by FPS. This designation expires 60 days from the date of my signature.

While engaged in the performance of official duties, you have the authority to use the following police powers:

"You are authorized to conduct investigations; require and receive information relating to offenses; serve and execute search and arrest warrants; serve subpoenas and summons; administer oaths; make arrests without warrant; take actions to preserve the peace while protecting federal government facilities and personnel; bear firearms; and perform other activities for the promotion of Homeland Security in accordance with Title 40 United States Code Section 1315 as created by the Homeland Security Act of 2002."

Prior to utilizing this authority, you are required to receive legal briefings provided by FPS legal advisors on 40 U.S.C. § 1315 authorities and jurisdiction, to include relevant criminal statutory and regulatory provisions enforceable on the federal property.

Hello All,

I was contacted today by (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) the Deputy Chief of OPLA DCLD (District Court Law Division) at OPLA HQ. We are responding to four lawsuits filed relating to the Portland protests. Additionally, contempt charges were just filed today, which we will need to respond to. We will need information quickly, as discovery has been expedited.

Here are the questions DCLD has so far:

1. Have we had ERO DOs or HSI SAs on the ground during the protests? If so, do we have a list of names?
2. Was any training provided to ERO/HSI for the protection of property/crowd control?
3. We may need to get individual training records for any of the officers involved in the "incidents" for contempt. How can we acquire those records?
4. Do we have a copy of the cross-designation memo between ICE and FPS?
5. Regarding the contempt charges, once we have a copy of the complaint, we will need to look at the names and see if any of our officers/agents were involved.

I have spoken on the phone with (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) with FPS). (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) sent me a copy of the designation memo, which is attached. It was issued on June 4, 2020, and expired 45 days from that date, which was July 19, 2020 (by my count). I have asked (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) the designation memo was extended. He does not know, but is looking into it. If there is an extension memo, he will send it to me.

My understanding from speaking with (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) is that ERO-SRT has been on the ground, along with U.S. Marshals Special Operations, FPS, and Border Patrol. ICE HQ has a schedule of SRT deployments, and there is a rotation of officers, coming from across the country.

My understanding from (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) who oversees the Seattle AOR SRT, is that the ERO Seattle AOR is currently on the ground. Los Angeles, SFR, and San Diego ERO have been or will be involved.

Sending this to ACC (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) who is the HSI-embed attorney.
