All –

As most of you know, FPS is officially requesting assistance in protection against destruction and breaches of federal facilities. This includes three or four main locations in Seattle and two in Tacoma. While they are fully aware of our training and equipment limitations, we can still provide a great deal of assistance behind the scenes – such as support in mass arrest processing, transport, back-up breach prevention and a few other gaps that need filling. We may provide tac medic support as well. We have not had civil disturbance training and therefore will not be on the skirmish lines. But we will provide assistance as necessary in critical circumstances.

We are tentatively looking at starting a nightly rotation this Thursday and supporting efforts at least through the weekend. It will look something like this:

- (b)(7)(F) ents per nights - (b)(7)(F) vo-agent teams (b)(7)(F) teams in Seattle (b)(7)(E) team in Tacoma). This could scale up, or scale down depending on escalation of the protests and riots.
- Tentative 10-hours shifts each night (approximately (b)(7)(E))
- Bring full gear, handheld radios and PPE (like any enforcement activity)
- Stick to our use of force policy

I wish I had all the details, but this is evolving so I ask for your patience. We are trying to reduce legal/liability issues as much as possible. While HSI does not have the legal authority to make arrests of this nature, we are supporting FPS and operating under their umbrella. Additionally, we are exploring cross-commissioning HSI and ERO as an option.

Request: Each division will provide (b)(7)(F) agents per night. The Lakewood office will cover the (b)(7)(F) agent commitment for Tacoma. Unless we get volunteers for each night, we may need up to (b)(7)(F) agents. Please first identify any volunteers and see how many nights they can do. Depending on the responses from your respective groups, we may need to select agents to fulfill our personnel commitment. Please get agent names back to me by **3pm tomorrow**.

For connectivity, agents should ensure situational awareness information is exchanged with JTTF SA (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) who is assigned to the FBI Seattle Command Post. SA (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) may be contacted at (206) 423 (b)(6); (b)(7)(C).

This is a significant ask, but we are dealing with unprecedented civil unrest. For the next few days, this will be the operational priority for HSI Seattle. Please ask your agents remain flexible and responsive.

(b)(6); (b)(7)(C) was injured on the night of July 6 / morning of July 7 by being lasered multiple times in the eyes by protestors. He was located on the 7th floor of the Federal Courthouse in Portland taking photos and observing the protest activities.

He filed a CA-1 and (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) has seen it and completed his portion.

(b)(6) saw a doctor related to the injuries a few days after the incidents. (b)(6) stated his eyes were very irritated, scratchy and watery. The doctor examined him and said they were definitely irritated, but there was no long term damage. The doctor advised (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) to use eye drops to assist with the healing of his eyes.

Based on our phone conversation, here are the bullet points:

The first arrest was before 8pm. The FPS investigators took care of the subject and I was not involved.

The first wave of arrests was right before midnight when they arrested 2 females. I was asked to be a second on an interview. I went with FPS to the holding cells on the fourth floor. The FPS investigator pressed the call button but no one responded. He asked me to go back to the jury room and he would call when they get access. He received assistance from another FPS investigator. When he returned the jury room he asked me to run the background info on the arrestees. I pulled up the HSI mobile app and entered the information. The app returned negative results. I thought the app was not working right so the FPS investigator called it in and got the results. I was under the impression at the time that they were using Sector. I found out later that they were not using Sector as there was no MOU with them from FPS.

The second wave was around 2 am when they arrested 4 people at 2 separate locations. I was able to assist with the background info for 2 of the arrestees through Sector.

Based on our phone conversation, here are the bullet points:

The first arrest was before 8pm. The FPS investigators took care of the subject and I was not involved.

The first wave of arrests was right before midnight when they arrested 2 females. I was asked to be a second on an interview. I went with FPS to the holding cells on the fourth floor. The FPS investigator pressed the call button but no one responded. He asked me to go back to the jury room and he would call when they get access. He received assistance from another FPS investigator. When he returned the jury room he asked me to run the background info on the arrestees. I pulled up the HSI mobile app and entered the information. The app returned negative results. I thought the app was not working right so the FPS investigator called it in and got the results. I was under the impression at the time that they were using Sector. I found out later that they were not using Sector as there was no MOU with them from FPS.

The second wave was around 2 am when they arrested 4 people at 2 separate locations. I was able to assist with the background info for 2 of the arrestees through Sector.

As a follow up to your text, I just wanted to reiterate the extent of HSI's involvement in Portland protests.

July 3-10, 2020

Beginning on July 3 and running until July 10, HSI San Francisco SRT deployed to Portland to assist FPS. The initial plan was for the Team to hold fast at our ICE building there in the event protests focused on ICE. This would allow FPS assigned to the ICE building to refocus their attention and resources on other targets (like the federal building). Shortly after commencing operations, it was clear the ICE building was not the focus of protests, and FPS requested the Team's support downtown. Through July 10, the Team provided mostly overwatch/observational support in which they identified protesters using lasers and other tools to aggravate law enforcement efforts. Additionally, the Team was assigned as an arrest team/Quick Reaction Force, along with other tactical elements, as needed. All associated activities were reported to Dom Ops during the deployed period.

Since July 11, 2020

On July 11, ERO SRT relieved HSI SF SRT. Since that time, HSI Portland has staffed the FPS Command Center with (b)(7)(E) (rotating duty agent) nightly who has provided investigative value-add to their FPS' efforts. Specifically, the HSI Portland agent on duty at the Command Center performs the following, as needed:

- Intel support by reviewing open source social media;
- Database checks in (b)(7)(E)

- Running arrested individuals' information to obtain biographical data (name, date of birth, FBI #, DL #, address, height, weight, hair color, eye color, etc.);
- Assist with interviewing subjects;
- Offered forensic support for mobile phones;
- Monitor pole cameras as requested;
- Assist FPS agents in drafting interview reports/search warrant affidavits;
- Assist with plain-clothes surveillance of the crowd, only when safe to do so, to help identify agitators and those deploying lasers against law enforcement.
- Note: the HSI agents perform no hands-on activity with the protesters, except in cases where individuals are arrested and mirandized/processed/interviewed by HSI and others.

Additionally, ASAC (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) is meeting with the US Attorney and other federal partners later today to discuss actions to date and possible future assistance. We anticipate HSI may be asked to take a more active role in investigating those identified as committing federal offenses during the protests (i.e., stalking, assaulting federal employees, etc.), but we can update you further on that after the meeting.

Reporting

Our plan moving forward is to provide Dom Ops a morning-after update on the prior night's HSI duty. Of course, if something out of the ordinary occurs, we will commence immediate reporting. Please advise if this is sufficient for your purposes. And again, if there is any input/recommendation/guidance from HQ on whether we should increase/decrease our involvement, please let us know.

All –

As most of you know, FPS is officially requesting assistance in protection against destruction and breaches of federal facilities. This includes three or four main locations in Seattle and two in Tacoma. While they are fully aware of our training and equipment limitations, we can still provide a great deal of assistance behind the scenes – such as support in mass arrest processing, transport, back-up breach prevention and a few other gaps that need filling. We may provide tac medic support as well. We have not had civil disturbance training and therefore will not be on the skirmish lines. But we will provide assistance as necessary in critical circumstances.

We are tentatively looking at starting a nightly rotation this Thursday and supporting efforts at least through the weekend. It will look something like this:

- (b)(7)(E) agents per nights - 4 (b)(7)(E) teams (b)(7)(E) teams in Seattle, (b)(7)(E) team in Tacoma). This could scale up, or scale down depending on escalation of the protests and riots.
- Tentative 10-hours shifts each night at (b)(7)(E)
- Bring full gear, handheld radios and PPE (like any enforcement activity)
- Stick to our use of force policy

I wish I had all the details, but this is evolving so I ask for your patience. We are trying to reduce legal/liability issues as much as possible. While HSI does not have the legal authority to make arrests of this nature, we are supporting FPS and operating under their umbrella. Additionally, we are exploring cross-commissioning HSI and ERO as an option.

Request: Each division will provide (b)(7)(E) agents per night. The Lakewood office will cover the (b)(7)(E) commitment for Tacoma. Unless we get volunteers for each night, we may need up to (b)(7)(E) agents. Please first identify any volunteers and see how many nights they can do. Depending on the responses from your respective groups, we may need to select agents to fulfill our personnel commitment. Please get agent names back to me by **3pm tomorrow**.

For connectivity, agents should ensure situational awareness information is exchanged with JTTF SA (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) who is assigned to the FBI Seattle Command Post. SA (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) may be contacted at (b)(6); (b)(7)(C)

This is a significant ask, but we are dealing with unprecedented civil unrest. For the next few days, this will be the operational priority for HSI Seattle. Please ask your agents remain flexible and responsive.

Attached are some rough drafts that can be a starting point to assist FPS

FORENSIC SUPPORT – I have offered forensic support for mobile devices seized once SWs are obtained. Please coordinate getting mobile devices to our Forensic Agents once the SW is signed so they can dump the phones and look for actionable evidence. I don't suspect the 1st SW for mobile devices will be signed until Monday July 13.

Anything else you can think of to add value– You are all exceptional agents and all have talents/experience that can be beneficial to FPS and the operation as a whole. Please just find out what is needed, add input where you can and then just be a good team member. Remember this is an FPS operation so ultimately they are making the call on how best to proceed with things.

Reporting to HQs- HSI is no longer responsible for reporting situational reports to HQs now the ERO SRT has assumed responsibility for the tactical team involvement in this operation.

Hello all,

I would like to pass this information along incase you all have any creative ideas on how us local guys could build any type of case on FTP crew. It seems that our local DAs are not interested in them, also I think you all should be aware of what they are doing as well since they have filmed you guys in the past.

The FTP (Film the police) crew has been getting very active filming us both on and off duty. They are filming us in our personal vehicles as we leave work and are putting out our personal information on line along with family information. They are showing up to officers homes calling them out and live streaming it as they do it. They show up on any calls they can and film inside our police cars when we are not in them and film us during the call as well. They are showing up at our rest stops the churches have for us and contact offices.

Last night they followed one of our officers who they are fixated on as they left the precinct in a patrol car. They followed her around a good area of east Portland until I and another officer did a traffic stop on them for violations. After this encounter they said they knew where there next protest would be. I believe they are meaning to come to our homes next.

What they are doing is causing stress and worry on our officers. Not only for the officer but there family as well. These guys have even triangulated and flanked police on calls while filming. A few years ago Officers at east arrested a guy who was involved with FTP.

He had body armor, M4 rifles, shotguns and handguns. He could of easily set up an ambush on police as we left the gates of the precinct.

There is also concern not just for them, but the extremist following they have that would want to do any law enforcement harm buy getting our information from the FTP crew.

As I previously stated, HSI Portland has been providing support to FPS in an At-Hoc manner, mainly assisting FPS agents with a variety of investigative support functions (database queries), assisting interviews (as a 2nd to FPS) and by providing (b)(7)(E) when it was deemed safe to do so. On July 20, 2020, as a response to the ongoing civil unrest, the Deputy Criminal Chief for the District of Oregon requested the presence of the following agencies in an attempt to draft an investigative plan moving forward related to the ongoing civil unrest in Portland. Present for the meeting was the Criminal Chief for the USAO, the Deputy Chief and representatives from the US Marshals Service, IRS, HSI, FPS and BORTAC.

Background – Currently the US Attorney's office has 17 federal defendants facing a variety of charges related to criminal activity tied to the civil unrest. Of the 17, 1 is facing Arson charges, 1 Felony Assault and 8 are related to laser strikes to officers face/eyes. Many of those arrested appear to be from other states, California, Arizona, New York and Texas to name a few. Seized along with the arrests was pocket trash, personal use narcotics and in some cases mobile devices. It is the opinion by many of the intel and tactical components present in Portland assisting with this operation, that the group of violent opportunists (VOs) are highly organized and as such may be part of a larger criminal conspiracy. Additionally, the VOs have ratcheted up their tactics against the federal law enforcement present by increasing their online threats/doxing of Law Enforcement, use of Drones to record law enforcement tactics, use of radio jamming devices to render law enforcement radios ineffective, use of wrist rockets to shoot ball bearings at tactical units and the use of crude incendiary devices to injure law enforcement or damage federal property.
