

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

According to media reports, protestors marched near the Southwest Police Precinct on 29 and 30 June, demanding the resignation of the Chief of Police or the firing of the officer driving the SUV. The protestors have vowed to continue protesting, including at the PGA Tour Rocket Mortgage Classic scheduled to commence on 2 July.
- (U) On 29 June, protests and counter-protests at the Provo (Utah) Police Department
 escalated into violence when the driver of an SUV was shot by protestors while driving past
 the protest; the driver was not affiliated with the protests or counter-protests and reportedly
 drove through a crowd to escape after being shot twice. On 30 June, the Provo Police

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





(U//FOUO) Since May 2020, there has been sustained violent criminal activity during lawful protests in the Portland, Oregon, metropolitan area. Federal Law Enforcement from DHS and DOJ are working with federal, state, and Portland local law enforcement partners to investigate and identify federal criminal violations that may have been ideologically motivated and federal criminal violations involving explosive devices, including those used to damage federal property and assault federal officers.

(U) Significant Updates

(U/ILES) Beginning at 1200 PDT on 22 August 2020, approximately 300 members of the alt-right groups Proud Boys, Oregon Patriot Movement, and COPS Northwest held rallies outside the Multnomah County Justice Center (MCJC) in downtown Portland. Counter-protestors attempted to disrupt the events with bullhorns, throwing water bottles, and forming a shield wall. Activities were predominately in front of MCJC but later spread to adjacent Terry Schrunk Plaza. The two groups frequently engaged in physical altercations and deployed bear mace. Federal Law Enforcement declared an unlawful assembly at the plaza, and a line of FPS officers proceeded across the plaza to clear the area of violent actors. At approximately 1645 PDT, violent actors had dispersed with only approximately 30 individuals remaining.







- (U//FOUO) On 27 June, it was reported that there were limited incidents of vandalism in the National Capital Region (NCR) to include vandalism and graffiti to the following locations in Washington, D.C.: USSS building, the Francis Scott Key statue and a plaque at the Francis Griffiths Newlands Memorial Fountain. It is unknown when the damage occurred.

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- (U) On 27 June, Austin police detained one individual for driving a vehicle through a crowd of
 protestors in front of police beadquarters in Austin. There were no reported injuries.
- (U//LES) Since 8 June, several hundred individuals remain in the Capitol Hill
 Occupied/Organized Protest (CHOP) zone in downtown Seattle despite attempts by city officials
 to dismantle barriers and clear the area. The Seattle Mayor's office continues to negotiate with the
 CHOP leaders to dismantle the area and disperse; however, the attempted barrier removal on 26
 June prompted a swell in the number of protestors from a couple dozen to more than 100. SE
 maintains continuing contact with Seattle Police Department for any situational updates.
- (U) On 26 June, vandals were seen smashing a window at the entrance to the Seattle Police Department's (SPD) West Precinct in Seattle. SPD Officers chased the crowd away.



II. (U) CURRENT AND UPCOMING FLASHPOINTS AND RESPONSE

(U) Possible catalysts in AOR to help understand possible flashpoints for upcoming violence, including anniversaries of past events, ongoing legal cases of past incidents where milestones in process could result in community reaction, recent events during criminal activity associated with protests (injuries, etc.) that could spark local responses.



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(U) Law Enforcement Activity and Judicial Decisions

(U//FOUO) Pending judicial decisions, as well as law enforcement arrests of individuals engaged in violent protests, will likely remain a flashpoint for violent and criminal activity.

- (U/FOUO) All four terminated police officers in the George Floyd incident are scheduled for their second court appearance on 29 June at the Hennepin County Courthouse in downtown Minneapolis. Two of the former officers were released on bond, while two remain in custody.
- (U//FOUO) The Washoe County District Attorney is anticipated to release a video on 29 or 30 June of a Sparks Police Department officer-involved shooting that could be controversial. Casino partners plan to increase security in anticipation of violence.
- (U/POUO) On 29 June, there were reported concerns at the federal courthouse in Madison, Wisconsin surrounding the upcoming sentencing of an individual—currently on federal supervised release.

• (U) As of 27 June, hundreds of protesters remain camped out near NY City Hall are advocating for a \$1 billion dollar cut to the NYPD's budget. NY has no information indicating any threat to federal property stemming from this demonstration at this time.

FBI San Francisco | Civil Unrest June 2020




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
Threats

- Threats of violence against FBI facilities, employees, and equipment to include protests at or near FBI facilities for situational awareness
 - Past/ongoing (w/in last 12-24 hours)
 - As of 31 May 2020 protests occurred at SF Civic Center/UN Plaza, approximately one block from FBI SF headquarters, which were anticipated to continue throughout the evening until curfew at 2000 PST.
 - As of 1 June 2020, a demonstration was planned for approximately 1500 near the FBI San Francisco San Jose RA on Hamilton Avenue in Campbell, according to a contact at Campbell PD and further confirmed by Santa Clara County Sheriff's Office. The demonstration did not take place. FBI San Francisco is operating out of the San Jose RA due to closures of the San Francisco Headquarters Building and the Oakland RA.







 - The San Francisco Bay Area has a history of civil unrest associated with police use of force. In 2009, Oscar Grant was shot and killed by a BART police officer in Oakland and in 2015, Mario Woods was killed by police in San Francisco, both sparked protests against police brutality in the AOR. Both instances have been cited by protestors in the AOR.
- Domain/environmental variables
 - None
- Infrastructure that could potentially be impacted by acts of violence
 - As of 1 June 2020, freeways, major roads, and police stations remain most likely to be impacted by acts of violence resulting from civil unrest in the AOR. So far three major freeways in the Bay Area, 880, 680, and 101 have been blocked by protestors so far.
 - As of 1 June 2020, Private Sector Partner Chevron, reported the Governor announced the National Guard will be deployed to Chevron terminals for purposes of "protecting critical infrastructure." There are currently no specific threats to those facilities in our AOR, and FBISF is working to

confirm if in fact the National Guard will be deployed as open source checks do not confirm this reporting.

As of 31 May 2020, vandalism and looting moved into smaller communities in the East Bay, targeting department stores and a high-end shopping area in Walnut Creek. Ongoing threats continue to call for the targeting of more affluent areas of the AOR. As of 1 June 2020, peaceful protests in the area continued, except for protestors blocking a freeway onramp.

- On 31 May 2020, at approximately 2218 hours, 30-40 individuals working together broke into a Federal Firearms Licensee (FFL) in Hayward, CA, and stole 23 firearms (4 long guns and 19 pistols). ATF is the lead on this investigation.
- Late 31 May 2020 through early morning 1 June 2020, groups of individuals attempted to break into an FFL in Castro Valley, CA, and an FFL in San Lorenzo, CA. The subjects were unable to gain access to the businesses and no firearms were stolen.
- Late 31 May 2020 through early morning 1 June 2020, two individuals attempted to break into an FFL in Fremont, CA. The subjects were unable to gain access to the structure, and one subject was arrested.
