

the office of President, or acting as President, during the term within which this Article becomes operative from holding the office of President or acting as President during the remainder of such term.

Sec. 2. This Article shall be inoperative unless it shall have been ratified as an amendment to the Constitution by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven years from the date of its submission to the states by the Congress: Therefore

Be it Resolved by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

Section 1. That the said proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America be, and the same is hereby, ratified by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana.

Sec. 2. That certified copies of this preamble and joint resolution be forwarded by the Governor of this state to the Secretary of State at Washington, D. C., to the presiding officer of the United States Senate, and to the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States.

The resolution was read in full.

The Speaker stated that the question is, Shall the resolution pass?

The Speaker ordered the roll of the House to be called.
