Senator O'Brien:

Senate Concurrent Resolution A was introduced by the Legislative Research Committee, which presumably lent the prestige of its endorsement to this controversial resolution. If so, it does the committee no credit, and it will be no credit to the Senate if this resolution is adopted. In fact, it will be a shameful thing because it will be a step towards limiting freedom of choice of our people at the polls, a freedom now guaranteed by an article in our Constitution, which this resolution seeks to change.

This resolution was adopted by the first session of the 80th Congress when Republicans joined by a sufficient number of Roosevelt-hating Southern Democrats passed the resolution and sent it on to the states for ratification. Since it entails a change in the constitution, it must be ratified by three-fourths of the states within seven years
