

Oklahoma Refuses Term-Limit Action

CHICAGO — (AP) — Eight states have approved the proposed constitutional amendment to limit the U. S. presidency to two terms, and one has refused to consider it.

That's how the score stood today after the Oklahoma senate yesterday declined to ratify the amendment by voting to postpone consideration indefinitely.

The proposal has been endorsed since March 31 by lawmakers of Delaware, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Maine, Michigan, New Hampshire and Oregon.

To become a part of the constitution, the amendment must be ratified by 36 states. Congress stipulated that the adoption process must be completed in seven years.
