

Two-Term Limit on Presidents Wins by 6 Votes in House

Ratification of a proposed constitutional amendment imposing a limit of two terms for the President was forced through the Massachusetts House yesterday by a solid Republican bloc, assisted by two Democrats.

If the Senate goes along, Massachusetts will become the 23d state to ratify the amendment. Adoption by 36 states is necessary to make the change.

The House roll call vote was 112 to 106. Representatives Edmond J. Donlan of West Roxbury and William T. Dillon Jr. of Holyoke, both Democrats, voted with Republicans.
