

Senate Kills Anti-Third Term Measure

The state senate Monday killed for this session of the legislature the proposal to ratify an amendment to the constitution of the United States to limit the term of the president.

Short work was made of the anti-third-term resolution, authorized by the Republican delegation, at the first opportunity.

When it was ready for the second time, Homer Paul, Pauls Valley, made a motion to postpone indefinitely the measure. Perry Howell, Blackwell, Republican, had asked that it go direct to the calendar and a test vote came on a motion to that effect. It failed by 11 "yes" votes and 20 "no" votes, and then the measure was indefinitely postponed.
