Re: Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear FOIA Officer:

Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington (“CREW”) submits this request for records pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”), 5 U.S.C. § 552, and Department of Transportation (“DOT”) regulations.

Specifically, from July 1, 2025 to the date this request is processed, CREW requests records sufficient to identify the total amount of government funds expended by the DOT related to “The Great American Road Trip” reality show production, “The Great American Roadtrip, Inc” nonprofit organization, or Secretary Sean Duffy’s family road trip across multiple states to celebrate the 250th anniversary of the United States of America.

The above request excludes agency records consisting solely of news articles, press clippings, and other publicly-available material, so long as the records include no accompanying discussion by agency officials.

Please search for responsive records regardless of format, medium, or physical characteristics. We seek records of any kind, including paper records, electronic records, audiotapes, videotapes, photographs, data, and graphical material. Our request includes without limitation all correspondence, letters, emails, text messages, facsimiles, telephone messages, voice mail messages, and transcripts, notes, or minutes of any meetings, telephone conversations, or discussions. Our request also includes any attachments to emails and other records, and anyone who was cc’ed or bcc’ed on any emails.

If it is your position any portion of the requested records is exempt from disclosure, CREW requests that you provide it with an index of those documents as required under *Vaughn v. Rosen*, 484 F.2d 820 (D.C. Cir. 1973). If some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(b). If it is your position that a document contains non-exempt segments, but that those non-exempt segments are so dispersed throughout the document as to make segregation impossible, please state what portion of the document is non-exempt, and how the material is dispersed throughout the document. See *Mead Data Central v. U.S. Dep’t of the Air Force*, 566 F.2d 242, 261 (D.C. Cir. 1977).

Please be advised that CREW intends to pursue all legal remedies to enforce its rights under FOIA. Accordingly, because litigation is reasonably foreseeable, the agency should institute an agencywide preservation hold on all documents potentially responsive to this request.

Fee Waiver Request

In accordance with 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A) and agency regulations, CREW requests a waiver of fees associated with processing this request for records. The subject of this request concerns the operations of the federal government, and the disclosures likely will contribute to a better understanding of relevant government procedures by CREW and the general public in a significant way. *See id.* § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii). Moreover, the request primarily and fundamentally is for non-commercial purposes. *See, e.g., McClellan Ecological v. Carlucci*, 835 F.2d 1282, 1285 (9th Cir. 1987).

The records CREW seeks will contribute to CREW's and the public's understanding of whether Secretary Duffy abused his position and sought undue benefits at taxpayers' expense. Given that taxpayer funds may have been used to pay for the trip, there is a strong public interest in the disclosure of the requested records. These disclosures may also shed light on whether Secretary Duffy's official time is being used for public purposes, whether he accepted or solicited gifts from companies with business before the DOT, whether this constituted an appropriate use of government travel, and whether private products were being promoted by the Secretary.

On May 8, 2026, Secretary of Transportation Sean Duffy stated in an interview that he and his family participated in a reality show production called "The Great American Road Trip" during which they toured the country to celebrate America's 250th anniversary while Secretary Duffy squeezed in time to do "some work" in his taxpayer funded job.¹ Although a DOT spokesperson claimed that "production costs were paid for by The Great American Road Trip, Inc. – not taxpayers" and that the secretary and his family "d[id] not receive any financial compensation" for their participation, the venture was sponsored by numerous private companies regulated by the department or impacted by DOT business.²

While Secretary Duffy did not explain whether the trip and the reality series were conducted in his official capacity or his personal capacity, there are several indicators that it

was the former and not the latter.³ Additionally, although DOT has claimed that taxpayer funds were not used to pay for the trip, Secretary Duffy may have used government resources to promote the project.⁴ And accepting travel from companies with business before DOT potentially implicates even more significant corruption and misconduct concerns.⁵

CREW is a non-profit corporation, organized under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. CREW is committed to protecting the public's right to be aware of the activities of government officials, to ensuring the integrity of those officials, and to highlighting and working to reduce the influence of money on politics. CREW uses a combination of research, litigation, and advocacy to advance its mission. CREW intends to analyze the information responsive to this request and to share its analysis with the public through reports, press releases, or other means. In addition, CREW will disseminate any documents it acquires from this request to the public through its website, www.citizensforethics.org. The release of information obtained through this request is not in CREW's financial interest.

CREW further requests that it not be charged search or review fees for this request pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(ii)(II) because CREW qualifies as a member of the news media. See *Nat'l Sec. Archive v. U.S. Dep't of Defense*, 880 F.2d 1381, 1386 (D.C. Cir. 1989) (holding non-profit a "representative of the news media" and broadly interpreting the term to include "any person or organization which regularly publishes or disseminates information to the public").

CREW routinely disseminates information obtained through FOIA to the public in several ways. For example, CREW's website receives over 150,000 page views every month. The website includes blogposts that report on and analyze newsworthy developments regarding government ethics, corruption, and money in politics, as well as numerous reports CREW has published to educate the public about these issues. These reports frequently rely on government records obtained through FOIA. CREW also posts the documents it obtains through FOIA on its website.

Under these circumstances, CREW satisfies fully the criteria for a fee waiver.
