



I write to you during the Michigan State University "It's on Us" Week of Action, where our campus community of students, faculty and staff collectively commit to ending sexual assault. Although it is nearing our fourth year of hosting the week-long awareness campaign, student leaders have realized we can do more to support those who were sexually assaulted and left with little, and in many cases, no support.

As of recent, the Associated Students of Michigan State University (MSU's undergraduate student government) has adopted, and committed to fundraise toward a new initiative, ultimately helping survivors of sexual assault on our campus. Today, I'm asking you to please consider pledging your financial support to this fund.

A few short years ago an MSU undergraduate student, Meg Hughey, was assaulted by an MSU graduate student, Ben Dettmar. Dettmar was a teaching assistant in one of her classes, and they formed a relationship. His relationship with her quickly became emotionally abusive, and Dettmar began stalking her and compromised her consent to sex through coercion on at least two separate occasions.

The university found him responsible for sexually harassing Meg, and placed Dettmar on academic probation. Meg's incident prompted the University to re-open a prior case against Dettmar as well, and they found him responsible of other Title IX violations. Meg's case had Dettmar placed on academic probation; the findings of the Title IX office in the case that had chronologically first prompted them to recommend expulsion. The decision was overturned on the grounds that Dettmar had no prior

record of offenses, despite the fact that it was Dettmar being found responsible of an offense that prompted the second investigation to begin with. The university then turned his expulsion into a suspension that will expire in December of this year.

Coming from Meg herself, she has said, "there were so many costs! never could've imagine associated with sexual assault until! I had it happen to me. Aside from obvious things like paying for gas/bus/etc. to get to and from meetings with the police and MSU, to my lawyer in Ann Arbor, and to the courthouse, there were so many other costs! wouldn't have thought of. Probably the biggest one was having to move out of my apartment because my perpetrator knew where I lived and the police didn't think! was safe. Besides just having the costs of moving out early, I also had to get a moving truck, and have people help me move. I got lucky because! was able to move in with my boyfriend and his roommates, so I didn't have to find an entirely new place on my own, but others aren't so lucky."

This semester, ASMSU established an endowment named in honor of, and called the "Hughey Fund," to financially assist survivors of sexual assault at Michigan State University. Students that seek assistance from the Sexual Assault Counseling Center on campus after being sexually assaulted may receive financial assistance to aid the financial burdens that may follow, like those that were named in Meg's experience above. The funds must be started by a counselor to be eligible for consideration, and any allocation per student may be up to \$1,500. To demonstrate our sincereity with the cause, ASMSU has voted to put an initial allocation of \$5,000 toward the fund, and will match up to \$20,000 that is raised before the end of the current fall semester.

While I know this is a controversial time for Title IX policy and procedures as it relates to sexual assault on our college campuses, I hope that you heavily consider donating to the Hughey Endowment Fund and affirm your support for sexual assault survivors. Our efforts in ending sexual assault not only requires commitment in our ability to step up and prevent it from happening to anyone in our community again, but also being an advocate for those who were stripped of their power to say "no" in non-consensual sex. No one should have to be strapped with numerous costs associated to getting themselves back to a safe, stable and reassuring place in our society after being raped.
