Dear Mr. Bookbinder:

Thank you for the December 5, 2017 communication from Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington ("CREW") regarding whether 60 Plus Association, Inc. ("60 Plus") had complied with the conciliation agreement it had entered into with the Federal Election Commission ("Commission") in Matter Under Review ("MUR") 6816. As indicated previously, that communication did not constitute a complaint within the meaning of 52 U.S.C. § 30109 and 11 C.F.R. § 111.4, but the Commission considered the information CREW provided and whether further action was necessary, as provided for in Paragraph VI of the conciliation agreement.

The Commission subsequently recalled the unpaid MUR 6816 debt from the Department of the Treasury and engaged in collection efforts of its own. 60 Plus has now satisfied its entire debt by making 15 monthly payments, with interest at the statutory rate. *See* 28 U.S.C. § 1961. Thank you for bringing information regarding 60 Plus's noncompliance with this conciliation agreement to the Commission's attention.
